OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-36) VS. ATLANTA BRAVES (28-27)

TUESDAY, JUNE 7, 2022 — TRUIST PARK — 7:20 ET

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their losing streak to six games on Sunday, which is the A's second longest losing streak this year (9, April 29-May 8)...have lost nine of the last 11 games and 16 of the last 21...are a season-low 16 games under .500 at 20-36 (.357)...that is the second lowest winning percentage in the American League ahead of the Royals (17-36, .321) and it marks the first time the A's have been 16 games under .500 since Sept. 18, 2017 when they were 67-83...have not been 76 games under since they were 66-83 on Sept. 17, 2017...have the third worst record in Oakland history after 55 games (16-40 in 1994, 18-38 in 1979)...have been swept in each of the last two series and five times this year...are 2-10-1 over the previous 13 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 33 of the last 34 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 31 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by 15 games, which is one-half game short of the season high of 16 (June 5)...have not been more than 16 games out of first since finishing the 2017 season 26 games.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's selected Matt Davidson from Triple-A Las Vegas today and he will become the 44th player to appear in a game for the A's this year...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...the current total of 43 players is tied for fourth most in the American League...have used 19 rookies, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...only the 2008 (21) and 2017 (20) clubs used more rookies...12 of the rookies have been pitchers, which ties the Oakland record (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have seven rookies on the roster, including four pitchers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a nine-game road trip to Atlanta (two games), Cleveland (four games) and Boston (three games) tonight...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (2-1) and have a 13-13 (.500) record on the road...are 7-23 (.233) at home, which is the worst home record in the majors...went 1-9 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston (0-3), which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...have now lost 20 of the last 23 home games...have a 3.58 ERA (89 er in 223.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.72 at home...are batting .220 (190-for-683) with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 26 games on the road compared to .200 with 78 runs and 12 home runs in 30 games at home.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-3 in interleague plays (1-2 vs. Philadelphia; 1-1 vs. San Francisco)...in addition to this two-game series at Atlanta, the A's will also travel to Washington (Aug. 30-Sept. 1) and host San Francisco (Aug. 6-7), Miami (Aug. 22-24), Atlanta (Sept. 6-7) and New York (Sept. 23-25)...went 11-9 against the National League last year, which marked the 15th time in 25 seasons of interleague play the A's finished with a winning record.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .166 (31-for-187) with one home runs and 10 runs scored over the last six games after hitting .261 with 11 home runs and 50 runs scored over the previous 12 contests...are hitting .210 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.276) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.324) and OPS (.600)...rank second in fewest runs (183) and fewest home runs (34) and tied for fourth in fewest extra base hits (132)...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 52 games and 55 of 56 this year...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for the most in the majors and matches the A's season total from last year...have been held to one run or fewer 20 times, which is the most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.47 ERA (113 er in 186.0 ip) over the last 21 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.20 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.247), on-base percentage (.318) and slugging percentage (.398) and fifth highest OPS (.716)...have issued the fourth most walks (178) and have the fifth fewest strikeouts (430).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-6 with a 5.23 ERA (24 er in 41.1 ip) over the last eight games and 1-13 with a 5.05 ERA (67 er in 119.1 ip) over the last 23 contests...the only win by a starter dating back to May 12 is by Paul Blackburn on May 25 at Seattle...starters are 12-27 with a 4.28 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors...have the fourth highest ERA in the AL and the fourth most innings pitched (290.0).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen went 1-3 with no saves, three blown saves and an 7.64 ERA (30 er in 35.1 ip) in 10 games on the last homestand...has a 6.47 ERA (46 er in 64.0 ip) over the last 17 games and a 4.09 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...has allowed 25-of-108 (23.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 108 inherited runners are second most...has the second lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.203) and fifth lowest on-base percentage (.303)...has surrendered just 15 home runs, which is tied for fourth fewest...has converted 13-of-21 (61.9%) save opportunities.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 12-for-12 in stolen base attempts over the last 12 games and 37-for-43 (86.0%) for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 19-for-29 (65.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest success rate in the AL...the 10 caught stealings are fifth most and the 19 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 36 errors, which is tied for second most in the American League...however, have just 15 unearned runs, which is second fewest (Yankees, 8)...rank second in double plays (53).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-9 (.308) in one-run games...the winning percentage is second lowest in the American League and the losses are tied for third most...are 13-16 (.448) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 29 games and 16 losses are tied for second most in the AL...have six come-from-behind wins, which is tied for second fewest...have two walk-off wins, which is tied for fourth most.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 16-4 (.800) when scoring first and 4-32 (.111) when the opponent scores first...are tied for the third best record in the American League when scoring first and have the worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first...have lost seven of their last eight games in which the opponent starts a left-hander...are 7-11 (.389) for the season compared to 13-25 (.342) when the opponents starts a right-hander...are 4-13 in the first game of a series, 8-9 in the final game...are averaging 3 hours and 4 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the AL and the majors.

A'S IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 10-21 (.323) record, which was second worst in the American League and fifth worst in Oakland history in May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...A's pitchers set an Oakland record for strikeouts in May (234)...slugged .316 with a .598 OPS, both of which were the lowest May marks in Oakland history...it was the first time they finished with an OPS under .600 in any month of 10 or more games since April of 1979 (.581) and it was the A's lowest May OPS since 1917 (.544)...the last time an American League team posted an OPS under .600 in May was in 1972 (TEX, .562; CLE, .577)...had a .281 on-base percentage, which was second lowest in Oakland history in May, and a .214 batting average, which was third lowest...ranked last in the majors in batting, slugging and OPS in May, tied for the fewest home runs (15), had the third lowest on-base percentage and the third fewest runs scored (94)...had the third most steals (22).

A'S vs. BRAVES: The A's and Braves meet for the first time since 2017 when Oakland was swept in a three-game series in the Coliseum, June 30-July 2...this will be the A's first visit to Truist Park...last met in Atlanta Aug. 15-17, 2014, and were swept in a three-game series...now have a seven-game losing streak against the Braves, which is the A's longest ever against a National League team...last defeated Atlanta on May 17, 2008 (5-4)...the starting center fielder that day for the Braves was Mark Kotsay...are 4-11 (.267) all-time against the Braves, which is the A's worst record against any team (5-10, .333 vs. Cubs)...are 1-5 in Oakland and 3-6 in Atlanta.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez is 10-for-11 (90.9%) in save chances...is tied for third in the American League in save percentage and tied for fourth in saves...leads AL rookies in saves...**Ramón Laureano** extended his hitting streak to an A's season-high tying 10 games on Sunday (14-for-41, .341).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1994** Rickey Henderson steals second base against Milwaukee for the 1100th steal of his career...in **2001** the A's set an Oakland record when they are hit by a pitch five times in a 6-4 loss to Anaheim...Frank Menechino is hit by a pitch twice...in **2008** Carlos Gonzalez doubles twice against Los Angeles, giving him seven career hits, all doubles...he is the first player in major league history to produce extra base hits for each of his first seven hits since Johnny Mize in 1936.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-2, 2.96 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list May 22 and is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (6 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts since his return...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr).

DON'T WALK: Has walked 11 batters in 45.2 innings, an average of 2.17 per nine innings...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his eight starts this year and 39 of his 43 career starts...has walked just 67 batters in 269.1 career innings (2.24 per nine innings).

OR STRIKEOUT: Has struck out just 28 batters in 45.2 innings, an average of 5.52 per nine innings...that is fifth lowest among American League pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...last year, he fanned just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...has struck out four batters or fewer in each of his eight starts, including exactly four six times.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Took the loss in his only interleague start this year, a 4-2 loss at Philadelphia in his first start on April 9 (5.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 3 hr)...went 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in two starts against the National League last year and is now 3-1 with a 2.20 ERA (7 er in 28.2 ip) in six career interleague appearances, including four starts...is 11-18 with a 4.72 ERA (126 er in 240.2 ip) in 53 career intraleague games, including 39 starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.61 ERA (5 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (10 er in 17.2 ip) and all five of his home runs in three starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Has yielded one home run in 34.0 innings over his last six starts after surrendering four home runs in 11.2 innings over his first two starts...has allowed six runs in the first inning for a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip)...has a 1.41 ERA (5 er in 32.0 ip) over innings two through five and a 7.94 ERA (5 er in 5.2 ip) from the sixth inning on...has a .303 (20-for-66) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .227 (25-for-110) after that...has made six of his eight starts this year in day games...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...the opponents number three hitter in the order is 3-for-22 (.136).

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Faced his former team in his first start on April 9 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss...yielded a career-high tying three home runs and had season highs in runs (4) and strikeouts (4)...then went 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a season-high 6.1 innings for the win in his second start on April 14 at Tampa Bay, a 6-3 A's win...retired 14 consecutive batters at one point...allowed one run or fewer in three consecutive starts from April 19-30...walked a season-high two batters in four consecutive starts from April 19-May 22...struck out a season-high four batters in five consecutive starts from April 19-May 27...that matched the longest streak of consecutive starts with exactly four strikeouts in Athletics history (Brandon McCarthy, April 11-May 2, 2012)...combined with Jackson, Snead and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas April 24 in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two...the blanked Cleveland over the first three innings on April 30 to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12 innings...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 15-day injured list May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr)...was reinstated on May 22 and started and lost that day at Los Angeles (AL)...allowed a season-high eight hits...left his start on May 27 against Texas with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland...walked a season-high tying two batters in 5.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Diaz in the third inning but that was the only run he would surrender...was relieved by Acevedo with one out in the sixth and the A's trailing 1-0 as Verlander no-hit Oakland over the first six innings...the A's scored three times in the seventh to get him off the hook

IRVIN vs. ATLANTA: Has no decisions and an 11.32 ERA (10.1 ip, 19 h, 13 r, 13 er, 6 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in five career appearances, all in relief with Philadelphia in 2019 and 2020...has a 15.19 ERA (9 er in 5.1 ip) in two games in Atlanta and a 7.20 ERA (4 er in 5.0 ip) in three games in Philadelphia...last faced the Braves on Aug. 21, 2020 at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...allowed a three-run home run to Ozuna in the fifth.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts...his 15 losses were the most in the American League, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors...his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16)...his opponents batting average broke down to .270 (143-for-530) with a .739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (52-for-180) with a .767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties...17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS...opponents hit .440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Jared Koenig (Major League Debut): Will be selected from Triple-A Las Vegas tomorrow and will be making his Major League debut...will become the 55th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the third this year...was 4-2 with a 2.21 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Triple-A Las Vegas...struck out 61 batters in 53.0 innings...is tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in strikeouts, ranks second in ERA and tied for third in wins...pitched in independent leagues from 2017-19...had stops in Monterey (Pecos), Salina (American Association), Birmingham-Bloomfield (United Shore) and San Rafael (Pacific Association) in 2017, San Rafael in 2018 and Lake Erie (Frontier) in 2019...combined for a 22-10 record and a 3.40 ERA in 53 games, including 47 starts, in three seasons of independent ball...was signed by the A's as a free agent on Jan. 14, 2020 and is 11-7 with a 2.94 ERA in 33 games, including 39 starts, in two seasons in the minors.

- Has a 2.40 ERA (4 er in 15.0 ip), .154 (8-for-52) opponents batting average and has stranded seven of eight inherited runners in 15 games since May 1...posted a 5.59 ERA, .316 opponents average and allowed 4-of-6 inherited runners to score in 10 games in April.
- Is tied for third in the American League in games pitched (25).
- Opponents are 4-for-26 (.154) with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched on exactly one day of rest in 15 of his 25 appearances and has a 5.40 ERA (8 er in 13.1 ip) in those games...has a 1.59 ERA (2 er in 11.1 ip) in his other 10 appearances.
- Has never faced the Braves in his career.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

61 RHP ZACH JACKSON (1-1, 3.52)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 9/1 **First Hitters:** 5-18, 5 bb

- Has allowed three runs in his last four appearances (3.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 5 so, 8.10 ERA) after yielding no earned runs over his previous eight contests (8.2 ip).
- Is tied for sixth in the American League in holds (9) and tied for seventh in games pitched (24)...is tied for fifth among AL relievers in strikeouts (31).
- Has a .208 opponents batting average but has issued 17 walks for a .354 on-base percentage...the walks are tied for the most among Major League relievers (Coleman, KC).
- Has not allowed a run in two interleague appearances (2.0 ip, 2 bb, 3 so).
- Has never faced Atlanta in his career.

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

56 RHP DANY JIMENEZ (2-3, 3.74)

Last Outing: 6/5 vs. Boston (ND, 1.0 ip)

Saves/Opportunities: 10-11

Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/1 **First Hitters:** 2-17, 5 bb

- Has allowed eight runs over his last four games (3.1 ip, 5 h, 8 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 3 so, 21.60 ERA) and has a win, two losses and a blown save over that span...yielded just one earned run over his first 18 games (0.49 ERA) and converted each of his 10 save opportunities while posting a 1-1 record.
- Is 10-for-11 (90.9%) in save chances...is tied for third in the American League in save percentage and tied for fourth in saves...leads AL rookies in saves and is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012).
- Ranks sixth among AL relievers in slugging percentage against first batters faced (.118) and eighth in batting average (.118)...however, has walked five first batters, which is tied for the most.
