OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-38) VS. CLEVELAND GUARDIANS (26-26)

THURSDAY, JUNE 9, 2022 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 7:10 ET

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost eight straight, 11 of the last 12 and 18 of the last 23 games to fall a season-low 18 games under .500 at 20-38 (.345)...that is the second lowest winning percentage in the majors ahead of the Royals (18-37, .327) and it marks the first time the A's have been 18 games under .500 since Sept. 16, 2017 when they were 65-83...have not been 19 games under since they were 61-80 on Sept. 9, 2017...have the third worst record in Oakland history after 58 games (17-41 in 1994, 18-40 in 1979)...have been swept in each of the last three series and six times this year...are 2-11-1 over the last 14 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 35 of the last 36 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 33 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 16½ games for the second consecutive day, which is their largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games back.

EIGHT-GAME LOSING STREAK: The A's have lost each of their last eight games, which is one short of their longest losing streak of the season (9, April 29-May 8)...this marks the first time the A's have two losing streaks of eight or more games in one season since 2005 when they had two eight-game losing streaks...have not had two nine-game losing streaks in one season since 1978 when they had losing streaks of 11 games and nine games...have been outscored 49-14 during the current losing streak...are batting .175 (44-for-251) with one home run...the pitching staff has a 5.53 ERA (43 er in 70.0 ip).

PLAYER NOTES: Yesterday, Jared Koenig became the 45th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is second most in the AL to the Twins (46)...Koenig became the 20th rookie, which ties the 2017 A's for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008...he is the 13th rookie pitcher, which breaks the Oakland record of 12 (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...he is the ninth rookie to make his Major League debut...currently have eight rookies on the roster, including five pitchers...Koenig is the ninth pitcher to start a game for the A's, which matches their season total from each of the previous two years...Christian Bethancourt also pitched last night and the A's have now used 26 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this nine-game road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (four games) and Boston (three games)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have a 13-15 (.464) record on the road...are 7-23 (.233) at home, which is the worst home record in the majors...went 1-9 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston (0-3), which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...have now lost 20 of the last 23 home games...have a 3.83 ERA (102 er in 239.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.72 at home...are batting .219 (203-for-927) with 109 runs and 22 home runs in 28 games on the road compared to .200 with 78 runs and 12 home runs in 30 games at home.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.210), on-base percentage (.274), slugging percentage (.320) and OPS (.595) and have the second fewest runs scored (187) and home runs (34)...have gone homerless in a season-high five consecutive games, which matches the A's longest such streak over the last six years (May 27-31, 2021)...have not gone homerless in six straight games since Aug. 29-Sept. 4, 2016...have homered just once in the last nine games...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 53 games and 56 of 57 this year...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for second most in the majors (Royals, 8) and matches the A's season total from last year...have been held to one run or fewer 20 times, which is the most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.61 ERA (126 er in 202.0 ip) over the last 23 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.30 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 5.17)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.249) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.320), slugging percentage (.410) and OPS (.729)...allowed a season-high four home runs last night and have surrendered nine home runs in the last three games...have allowed 62 for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...have issued the fourth most walks (182) and have the fifth fewest strikeouts (448).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-7 with a 5.55 ERA (30 er in 48.2 ip) over the last 10 games and 1-14 with a 5.11 ERA (73 er in 128.2 ip) over the last 25 contests...the only win by a starter dating back to May 12 is by Paul Blackburn on May 25 at Seattle...starters are 12-28 with a 4.33 ERA

for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors...have the third highest ERA in the AL and the fourth most innings pitched (299.1).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-4 with no saves, three blown saves and a 7.93 ERA (37 er in 42.0 ip) over the last 12 games...now has a 4.26 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...has the third lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.207) and the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.302)...has allowed 28-of-112 (25.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the 112 inherited runners are second most...allowed four home runs last night, which were the most by the bullpen since June 13, 2018 when they also allowed four against Houston...have surrendered six home runs in the last three games after yielding just 14 over the first 55...has converted 13-of-21 (61.9%) save opportunities.

ON THE BASES: The A's had their streak of 12 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing snapped last night...are now 37-for-44 (84.1%) for the season, which is the second best stolen base percentage in the American League...rank third in steals...A's opponents are 19-for-31 (61.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the AL to the Orioles (60.7%)...the 12 caught stealings are tied for the most and the 19 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 37 errors, which is third most in the American League...however, have just 18 unearned runs, which is tied for third fewest...rank second in double plays (54).

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored first in both games in Atlanta but lost...have a three-game losing streak when scoring first but are 16-6 (.727) for the season, compared to 4-32 (.111) when the opponent scores first...have the worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first...six come-from-behind wins, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Twins, 5)...are 0-6 in June after going 10-21 (.323) in May...are one of two teams in the majors without a win in June (Angels, 0-8)...the A's May record was fifth lowest in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors (Cleveland is 2nd quickest, 2:59).

A's vs. GUARDIANS: The A's trail in the season series 0-3 after being swept in Oakland, April 29-May 1...it was the first time the A's were swept by Cleveland since July 29-31, 2016 and the first time in Oakland since April 10-12, 2000...won the season series last year 4-2 and have won each of the previous four season series...are 17-11 against Cleveland over the last five seasons and have not lost a season series since going 2-4 in 2016...went 1-2 in Oakland last year and 3-0 in Cleveland...have an eight-game winning streak at Progressive Field, which is the longest road winning streak in Athletics history against Cleveland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 287-247 against Cleveland...that breaks down to 151-111 in Oakland and 136-136 in Cleveland...including 51-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 922-1040 against Cleveland.

Elvis Andrus is a .395 (62-for-157) career hitter at Progressive Field, which is the best batting average by any player in this ballpark with a minimum of 100 plate appearances...**Dany Jiménez** is 10-for-11 (90.9%) in save chances...ranks fifth in the American League in save percentage and tied for seventh in saves...leads AL rookies in saves...**Ramón Laureano** extended his hitting streak to 12 games yesterday (18-for-49, .367), which is an on-going A's season high and four short of his career high of 16.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1973** Ken Holtzman tosses a two-hit shutout to improve to 11-3 in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a four-hitter as the A's shutout Kansas City, 5-0...in **1991** Jim "Catfish" Hunter becomes the first player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor the Hall of Famer by retiring number 27.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (0-3, 6.06 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...has allowed 13 runs in 14.2 innings over his last three starts (7.98 ERA) after allowing nine runs in 18.0 innings over his first four starts (4.50 ERA)...has started the season 0-3, which is the longest losing streak of his career...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...this is his third season in the majors, all with the A's.

THROUGH THE ORDER: Has a .158 (9-for-57) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .319 (22-for-69) with five of his seven home runs allowed after that...had a .189 batting average the first time through the order last year, .261 with 15 of his 19 home runs after that

...AND INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 9.64 ERA (20 er in 18.2 ip) from the third inning on...last year, he had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed six home runs in his last four starts and seven in 32.2 innings for the season (1.93 per nine innings)...six of the seven home runs have been solo shots...has yielded a .200 (6-for-30) batting average with runners in scoring position...the opponents seven hitter in the order is 8-for-13 (.615) against him...the A's have won each of his four no decisions and are 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Did not pitch during the spring and began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint...was sent to Low-A Stockton on April 15 to begin a rehab assignment and picked up the win in a 14-10 Ports win that day against Modesto (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so, 2 hr)...was moved up to Triple-A Las Vegas and had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma (4.0 ip, 3 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...was 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) in three starts overall when he reinstated from the IL on May 1...took the loss in each of his first two starts...logged 2.0 innings and walked a career-high tying four batters in his first start, a 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...it was the shortest start of his career...then lost a 1-0 decision at Minnesota on May 7, allowing a Polanco home run in the sixth for the only run of the game...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings and struck out a season-high seven batters while logging a season-high 99 pitches...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...left his start on May 12 at Detroit with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save in a game the A's would come back to win 5-3...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high seven hits in 5.0 innings on May 24 at Seattle but had a no decision in the As 7-5 win.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Boston last Friday in Oakland...blanked the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over the first three innings...then allowed two runs in the fourth on a Bogaerts home run and a Cordero RBI double...was relieved by Markel with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth inning with the A's trailing 2-0 and Markel allowed both base runners to score.

KAPRIELIAN vs. CLEVELAND: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 7-3 loss earlier this year on May 1 in Oakland...tossed 2.0 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI double to Maile in the second and then walked the bases loaded to start the third inning...was relieved by Lemoine, who allowed all three runners to score.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .201 (46-for-229) with a .602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a .189 opponents batting average and .569 OPS the first time through the order, .285 with a .907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that...yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order...allowed a .083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit .107 when putting his curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0-for-2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, 3-2 with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road...had a 4-3 record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night...was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts...logged a 7-3 record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Paul Blackburn (5-2, 2.62 ERA): Is 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA and .273 opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA and .211 opponents batting average over his first nine starts...has a career-high five wins, which is tied for eighth in the American League...also ranks ninth in ERA (3.62)...also has career highs in games (11), games started (11) and strikeouts (44)...his 58.1 innings pitched are 0.1 innings shy of his 58.2 from his rookie campaign of 2017...is 4-0 with a 1.14 ERA and .198 opponents batting average in six starts on the road...is tied for the AL lead in road wins and ranks second in ERA...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-0 loss to Boston last Saturday in Oakland (4.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 1-1 with a 4.41 ERA (16.1 ip, 15 h, 9 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in three career starts against Cleveland...last faced them on July 6, 2018 at Progressive Field and was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-4 loss (4.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so).

- Has allowed three runs in 2.2 innings over his first four outings in June (10.13 ERA) after compiling a 1.29 ERA and .146 opponents batting average in 13 games in May.
- Is tied for the Major League lead in games pitched (27)...ranks ninth among American League relievers in innings pitched (26.1).
- Opponents are 5-for-31 (.161) with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched on exactly one day of rest in 15 of his 27 appearances and has a 5.40 ERA (8 er in 13.1 ip) in those games...has a 2.08 ERA (3 er in 13.0 ip) in his other 12 appearances.
- Has made one career appearance against Cleveland and it came earlier this year on April 29 in Oakland when he was charged with the blown save and loss (1.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 so, 1 hr).

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

61 RHP ZACH JACKSON (1-1, 3.38)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 9/1 **First Hitters:** 5-19, 5 bb

- Has allowed three runs in his last five appearances (4.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 6.23 ERA) after yielding no earned runs over his previous eight contests (8.2 ip).
- Is tied for sixth in the American League in games pitched (25) and tied for eighth in holds (9)...ranks fifth among AL relievers in strikeouts (34).
- Has a .200 opponents batting average but has issued 17 walks for a .343 on-base percentage...the walks are tied for second most among Major League relievers (Coleman, KC 19).
- Has faced the Guardians once in his career and it came earlier this year on April 30 (1.2 ip, 1 bb, 3 so).

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

- Has allowed eight runs over his last four games (3.1 ip, 5 h, 8 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 3 so, 21.60 ERA) and has a win, two losses and a blown save over that span...yielded just one earned run over his first 18 games (0.49 ERA) and converted each of his 10 save opportunities while posting a 1-1 record.
