OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-40) VS. CLEVELAND GUARDIANS (28-27)

SUNDAY, JUNE 12, 2022 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 11:35 AM ET

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped a 10-game losing streak yesterday...have lost 13 of the last 15 and 20 of the last 26 games...are 19 games below .500 at 21-40 (.344)...that is the second lowest winning percentage in the majors (CIN; .339)...prior to the win, it the first time the A's have been 20 games under .500 since Sept. 8, 2017 when they were 60-80...have not been 21 games under since they were 59-80 on Sept. 6, 2017...have been swept in each of the last three series and six times this year...are 2-11-1 over the last 14 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 38 of the last 39 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 36 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by 16 games...17 games back is their largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games back.

TEN-GAME LOSING STREAK NO MORE: The A's won yesterday, snapping a 10-game losing streak which was their longest of the season...marked the first time they have lost 10 consecutive games since a 10-game skid May 30-June 9, 2011...this marks the first time the A's have two losing streaks of nine or more games in one season since 1978 when they had losing streaks of 11 games and nine games...were outscored 60-20 during the current losing streak...were batting .180 (57-for-317) with four home runs...the pitching staff had a 5.61 ERA (54 er in 86.2 ip).

PLAYER NOTES: Wednesday, Jared Koenig became the 45th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is second most in the AL to the Twins (46)...Koenig became the 20th rookie, which ties the 2017 A's for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008...he is the 13th rookie pitcher, which breaks the Oakland record of 12 (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...he is the ninth rookie to make his Major League debut...currently have eight rookies on the roster, including five pitchers...Koenig is the ninth pitcher to start a game for the A's, which matches their season total from each of the previous two years...Christian Bethancourt also pitched Wednesday night and the A's have now used 26 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this nine-game road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-2) and Boston (three games)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have a 14-17 (.452) record on the road...are 7-23 (.233) at home, which is the worst home record in the majors...went 1-9 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston (0-3), which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...have now lost 20 of the last 23 home games...have a 4.00 ERA (118 er in 265.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.72 at home...are batting .226 (229-for-1013) with 125 runs and 29 home runs in 31 games on the road compared to .200 with 78 runs and 12 home runs in 30 games at home.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.211) and on-base percentage (.276), have the second lowest OPS (.607) and slugging percentage (.330), second fewest home runs (41), and third fewest runs scored (203)...have homered six times in their last two games after hitting just two home runs in their previous nine games (both previously by **Christian Bethancourt**)...homered four times yesterday to snap a streak of 55 games with two or fewer homers...have two or fewer homers in 58 of 60 games this year...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for second most in the majors (Royals, 8) and matches the A's season total from last year...have been held to one run or fewer 20 times, which is the most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.48 ERA (144 er in 236.2 ip) over the last 27 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.36 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 5.11)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.252) and and OPS (.733), and fourth highest on-base percentage (.320) and slugging percentage (.413)...have surrendered 12 home runs in the last five games...have allowed 65 for the season, which is tied for fifth most in the AL...have issued the fourth most walks (189) and have the fifth fewest strikeouts (461).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-7 with a 4.92 ERA (37 er in 67.2 ip) over the last 12 games and 2-14 with a 4.88 ERA (80 er in 147.2 ip) over the last 28 contests...starters are 13-28 with a 4.27 ERA for the season...the wins are the fourth fewest in the American League and the losses are the most in the AL and also third most in the majors behind Washington (33) and Cincinnati (31)...have the third most home runs allowed in the AL (44), the fourth highest ERA, and the fourth most innings pitched (318.1).

BLACKBURN: RHP Paul Blackburn became the first Oakland starter to go 8.0 ip this season in last night's contest (8.0 ip, 4 h, 0 r, bb, 3 so)...is the first A's starter to throw at least 8.0 scoreless innings since Cole Irvin on June 27, 2021 against San Francisco and just the seventh since 2019...is the last A's starter to record a win (May 25 at Seattle)...among AL leaders, Blackburn ranks tied for first in games started (12), 6th in ERA (2.31), and 11th in WHIP (1.01), and 12th in opponent batting average (.214).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-6 with no saves, four blown saves and a 8.51 ERA (46 er in 48.2 ip) over the last 15 games...now has a 4.50 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...has the sixth lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.237) and the tenth lowest on-base percentage (.316)...has allowed 30-of-118 (25.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the 118 inherited runners are third most...allowed four home runs Wednesday night, which were the most by the bullpen since June 13, 2018 when they also allowed four against Houston...have surrendered seven home runs in the last six games after yielding just 14 over the first 55...has converted 13-of-23 (56.5%) save opportunities.

ON THE BASES: The A's are now 39-for-47 (83.0%) for the season, which is tied second best stolen base percentage in the American League behind the White Sox (29-for-31, 93.5%)...rank third in steals...A's opponents are 20-for-33 (60.6%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the AL...the 13 caught stealings are tied for the most and the 20 stolen bases allowed are third fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most.

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored first in each of the last five games but lost four of five...before winning last night, had a five-game losing streak when scoring first but are 17-8 (.680) for the season, compared to 4-32 (.111) when the opponent scores first...have the worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first...are 1-8 in June after going 10-21 (.323) in May...before winning yesterday, were the only team in the majors without a win in June...the A's May record was fifth worst in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors (Cleveland is 2nd quickest, 2:59).

A's vs. GUARDIANS: The A's trail in the season series 1-5 after being swept in Oakland, April 29-May 1...it was the first time the A's were swept by Cleveland since July 29-31, 2016 and the first time in Oakland since April 10-12, 2000...won the season series last year 4-2...are 18-13 against Cleveland over the last five seasons...have dropped the season series for the first time since going 2-4 in 2016...went 1-2 in Oakland last year and 3-0 in Cleveland...snapped an eight-game winning streak at Progressive Field on Thursday, which was the longest road winning streak in Athletics history against Cleveland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 288-249 against Cleveland...that breaks down to 151-111 in Oakland and 137-138 in Cleveland...including 5w-69 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 923-1042 against Cleveland.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is a .385 (65-for-169) career hitter at Progressive Field, which is the best batting average by any player in this ballpark with a minimum of 100 plate appearances...**Christian Bethancourt** has hit three of Oakland's last eight home runs...his three home runs are the most he has hit in a season since hitting six homers in 2016 as a member of the Padres...his maximum exit velocity is 113.4 MPH, which he recorded on a single Thursday night for the third hardest hit ball by an A's player this season.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1938** Bob Johnson has three home runs and a single and drives in all the A's runs in an 8-3 win over St. Louis in the first game of a doubleheader...in **1975** Billy Williams hits his 400th career home run in a 9-7 A's loss at Milwaukee...in **1990** Rickey Henderson steals third base against Texas, his 900th career steal...in that game, Dennis Eckersley walks his first batter of the season, snapping a string of 52.0 innings and 186 hitters without a walk...in **2009** Jack Hannahan commits his first error of the season, snapping a 72-game errorless streak dating back to August 10, 2008, which is an Oakland record for a third baseman.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-2, 3.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list May 22 and is 0-1 with a 3.09 ERA (8 er in 23.1 ip) in four starts since his return...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr).

DON'T WALK: Has walked 12 batters in 51.0 innings, an average of 2.12 per nine innings...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his nine starts this year and 40 of his 44 career starts...has walked just 68 batters in 274.2 career innings (2.23 per nine innings).

OR STRIKEOUT: Has struck out just 34 batters in 51.0 innings, an average of 6.00 per nine innings...that is third lowest among American League pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...last year, he fanned just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...struck out six batters in his last start after fanning four or fewer in each of his first eight starts.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Had a no decision in his only start against an American League Central team on April 30 against Cleveland and allowed just one run in 6.0 innings...is now 3-0 with a 2.32 ERA (11 er in 42.2 ip) in eight career appearances against the Central, including seven starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.61 ERA (5 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (12 er in 23.0 ip) and all seven of his home runs in four starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season today, his seventh in a day game...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...has allowed seven runs in the first inning for a 6.00 ERA (6 er in 9.0 ip)...has a 1.50 ERA (6 er in 36.0 ip) over innings two through five and a 7.50 ERA (5 er in 6.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...has a .307 (23-for-75) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .236 (29-for-123) after that...the opponents number three hitter in the order is 3-for-25 (.120) against him.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Faced his former team in his first start on April 9 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss...yielded a career-high tying three home runs and allowed a season-high four runs...then went 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a season-high 6.1 innings for the win in his second start on April 14 at Tampa Bay, a 6-3 A's win...retired 14 consecutive batters at one point...allowed one run or fewer in three consecutive starts from April 19-30...walked a season-high two batters in four consecutive starts from April 19-May 22...struck out exactly four batters in five consecutive starts from April 19-May 27...that matched the longest streak of consecutive starts with exactly four strikeouts in Athletics history (Brandon McCarthy, April 11-May 2, 2012)...combined with Jackson, Snead and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas April 24 in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two...the blanked Cleveland over the first three innings on April 30 to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12 innings...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 15-day injured list May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr)...was reinstated on May 22 and started and lost that day at Los Angeles (AL)...allowed a season-high eight hits...left his start on May 27 against Texas with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save...walked a season-high tying two batters in 5.2 innings in a 5-4 loss to Houston on June 1

LAST START: He had his third straight no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Atlanta on Tuesday...struck out a season-high six batters in 5.1 innings...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed leadoff home runs to Acuna in the first and third innings...was relieved by Acevedo with one out in the sixth inning, a runner on second and the scored tied 2-2...Acevedo retired the final two batters but Trivino allowed a run in the seventh for the loss.

IRVIN vs. CLEVELAND: Is 0-0 with a 2.84 ERA (6.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances, including one start...the start came in the A's 3-1 loss in Oakland earlier this year on April 30...blanked the Guardians on four hits over the first three innings before allowing a RBI single to Gimenez in the fourth...the A's tied the game on a Neuse home run in the fifth and he was relieved by Jackson to start the seventh with the scored tied 1-1...Jiménez allowed two unearned runs in the ninth for the loss...also appeared in relief on Sept. 22, 2019 at Cleveland while pitching for Philadelphia (0.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)...entered the game in the seventh inning with the bases loaded and no outs and allowed a three-run double to Puig before striking out Freeman.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts...his 15 losses were the most in the American League, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors...his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16)...his opponents batting average broke down to .270 (143-for-530) with a .739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (52-for-180) with a .767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties...17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS...opponents hit .440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Jared Koenig (0-1, 9.00 ERA): Made his Major League debu his last time out...was 4-2 with a 2.21 ERA in nine games, eight starts, with Las Vegas, including 4-0 with a 1.64 ERA and .187 opponents batting average over his final six starts. He leads the Pacific Coast League in opponents on-base percentage (.261), ranks second in ERA, tied for second in strikeouts (61), third in opponents batting average (.203), slugging percentage (.318) and OPS (.579) and tied for third in wins. The 28-year-old left-hander will be making his Major League debut after two seasons in the A's farm system and three years in independent ball. Koenig was 22-10 with a 3.41 ERA in 49 games, 47 starts, with teams in the Pecos, American Association, Pacific Association and Frontier Leagues before signing with the A's as a free agent on Jan. 14, 2020. He is 11-7 with a 2.94 ERA in 33 games, including 29 starts, in two seasons in the minors with Oakland.

- Has allowed three runs in 3.2 innings over his first five outings in June (7.363 ERA) after compiling a 1.29 ERA and .146 opponents batting average in 13 games in May.
- Is tied for the Major League lead in games pitched (28)...ranks tied for ninth among American League relievers in innings pitched (27.1).
- Opponents are 5-for-31 (.161) with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched on exactly one day of rest in 15 of his 27 appearances and has a 5.40 ERA (8 er in 13.1 ip) in those games...has a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) in his other 13 appearances.
- Before yesterday, had career appearance against Cleveland and it came earlier this year on April 29 in Oakland when he was charged with the blown save and loss (1.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 so, 1 hr).

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

61 RHP ZACH JACKSON (1-1, 3.70)

Last Outing: 6/9 at Cleveland (H, 0.1 ip, h, r, er, bb)

Saves/Opportunities: 1-2

Inherited Runners/Scored: 9/1 **First Hitters:** 5-19, 6 bb

- Has allowed four runs in his last six appearances (4.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 7.71 ERA) after yielding no earned runs over his previous eight contests (8.2 ip).
- Is tied for eighth in the American League in games pitched (26) and tied for fifth in holds (10)...ranks tied for sixth among AL relievers in strikeouts (34).
- Has a .207 opponents batting average but has issued 18 walks for a .353 on-base percentage...the walk are second most among Major League relievers (Coleman, KC 19).
- Before Thursday night, had faced the Guardians once in his career and it came earlier this year on April 30 (1.2 ip, 1 bb, 3 so).

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

56 RHP DANY JIMENEZ (2-4, 4.70)

- Has allowed 11 runs over his last six games (4.2 ip, 7 h, 11 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 3 so, 21.21 ERA) and has a win, three losses and two blown saves over that span...yielded just one earned run over his first 18 games (0.49 ERA) and converted each of his 10 save opportunities while posting a 1-1 record.
