OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-42) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (33-29)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 15, 2022 — FENWAY PARK — 7:10 ET

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost 12 of the last 13 games and are 6-22 (.214) over the last 28 contests...are 21-42 (.333) overall, which is the second worst record in the majors ahead of the Royals (20-41, .328)...are 21 games under .500 for the first time since Sept. 6, 2017 when they were 59-80...have not been 22 games under .500 since Sept. 5, 2017 (58-80)...have the third worst record in Oakland history after 63 games (19-44 in 1979, 20-43 in 1994)...are 2-12-1 over the previous 15 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 41 of the last 42 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 39 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 17½ games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out...snapped their 10-game losing streak on Saturday...it was the A's longest losing streak since May 30-June 9, 2011 when they also lost 10 straight...also had a nine-game losing streak this year (April 29-May 8) and this is the first time the A's have two losing streaks of nine or more game in one season since 1978.

PLAYER NOTES: Yesterday, Jonah Bride became the 46th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is tied for third most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...he became the A's 21st rookie, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...he was the 10th rookie to make his Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers.

OFFENSE: The A's were held to one run last night and have scored one run or fewer 21 times this year, which is the most in the majors...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for sixth most in the majors and matches the A's season total from last year...are batting .195 (82-for-420) with 34 runs scored over the last 13 games (2.6 runs per game)...are hitting .211 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.276), the second lowest slugging percentage (.333) and OPS (.609) and the third fewest runs scored (207)...have homered in a season-high five consecutive games (11 home runs total) after going homerless in a season-high five consecutive games...have 45 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors ahead of the Tigers (31).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.24 ERA (40 er in 57.2 ip) over the first seven games of the road trip and now have a 5.65 ERA (153 er in 243.2 ip) over the last 28 games...have a 4.42 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 5.17)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.253), slugging percentage (.414) and OPS (.736) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.321)...have issued the fifth most walks (194) and have the third fewest strikeouts (471).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-9 with a 5.33 ERA (47 er in 79.1 ip) over the last 15 games and 2-16 with a 5.10 ERA (92 er in 162.1 ip) over the last 31 contests...the only win by starters over that stretch, which dates back to May 12, came on May 25 (Blackburn) and June 11 (Montas)...starters are 13-30 with a 4.42 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors (Nationals 36, Reds, 31)...rank fourth in the AL in fewest wins, highest ERA and most innings pitched (328.0).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in two of the last three games (1 er in 9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA) but is 1-6 with no saves, five blown saves and a 7.69 ERA (47 er in 55.0 ip) over the last 17 contests dating back to May 26...now has a 4.41 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to the Royals (4.84)...is 23-for-33 (56.5%) in save opportunities and has the third lowest save percentage in the AL...has the fourth lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.218)...however, has the second most first batter walks (24)...has allowed 30-of-120 (25.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...the 120 inherited runners are third most...has yielded 21 home runs, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 41-of-49 (83.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League...rank third in steals (41)...A's opponents are 20-for-33 (60.6%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the AL and the majors...are tied for second in the AL in caught stealing (13) and rank third in fewest stolen

base (20)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of the last six games and eight of the last nine...now have 42 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...however, have just 19 unearned runs, which is third fewest...rank second in double plays (59)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists (6).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-6 on this nine-game road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (0-1)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have a 14-19 (.424) record on the road compared to 7-23 (.233) at home...have the worst home record in the majors...return home following the game tomorrow for a six-game homestand against Kansas City (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 1-9 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston (0-3), which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...have now lost 20 of the last 23 home games...have a 4.13 ERA (129 er in 281.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.72 at home...are batting .220 (241-for-1096) with 129 runs and 33 home runs in 33 games on the road compared to .200 with 78 runs and 12 home runs in 30 games at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-11 (.267) in one-run games...are tied with the Mariners and Rangers for the American League lead in one-run losses and have the second worst record to the Rangers (3-11/.214)...are 13-18 (.419) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 18 losses are third most in the AL and the 31 games are tied for third most...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-4)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 17-9 (.654) when scoring first and 4-33 (.108) when the opponent scores first...have the second worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-17/.105)...have seven come-from-behind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)...are 1-10 (.091) in June after going 10-21 (.323) in May...have the worst record in June in the majors behind the Angels (2-11/.154)...the A's May record was fifth lowest in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's have lost the season series for the second time in the last three season series and fourth time in the last seven season series as they are 0-4 with two games remaining...have never gone winless in a season series against the Red Sox...lost the first game in Boston last night after being swept in Oakland June 3-5...it was the first time the A's were swept by the Red Sox in Oakland in a series of three or more games since Sept. 6-8, 2004...the only other times the A's went winless against Boston in the season series in Oakland were in 2002 and 2004 (both 0-3)...split the season series last year, 3-3...lost two of three in Oakland and won two of three in Boston...are 16-26 against the Red Sox dating back to 2015...are 250-307 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 151-128 in Oakland, 98-178 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 892-1088 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Christian Bethancourt is batting .387 (12-for-31) with all four of his home runs and seven RBI in eight games in June...his most home runs in a season is six in 2016...**Seth Brown** has three home runs on the road trip and now has eight home runs for the season, all of which have come on the road...**Dany Jiménez** has 10 saves, which is tied for eighth in the American League and is the most among AL rookies...is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1925** the A's trail 15-3 entering the bottom of the seventh inning before scoring once in the seventh and 13 times in the eighth inning to defeat Cleveland 17-15...the 12 run deficit overcome to win is a Major League record...in **1983** Davey Lopes drives in seven runs and is a single short of the cycle in the A's 10-1 win at Toronto...in **2002** the A's go errorless for the 12th consecutive game, breaking the Oakland record of 11.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (0-3, 5.73 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...has allowed 15 runs in 19.2 innings over his last four starts (6.86 ERA) after allowing nine runs in 18.0 innings over his first four starts (4.50 ERA)...has started the season 0-3, which is the longest losing streak of his career...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...this is his third season in the majors, all with the A's.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held right-handed hitters to a .203 (15-for-74) batting average and .695 OPS...left-handers are batting .296 (21-for-71) with a .924 OPS...his career marks are .200 with a .622 OPS against righties, .276 with a .892 OPS against lefties...has issued eight of his 13 walks this year and 39 of 56 in his career to lefties.

THROUGH THE ORDER: Has a .167 (11-for-66) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .316 (25-for-79) with seven of his nine home runs allowed after that...his career numbers and are .183 the first time through the order, .273 with 24 of his 30 home runs after that

...AND INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.13 ERA (2 er in 16.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 9.14 ERA (22 er in 21.2 ip) from the third inning on...now has a 1.71 career ERA (11 er in 58.0 ip) in innings one and two and a 6.14 ERA (70 er in 102.2) from the third inning on

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed eight home runs in his last five starts and nine in 37.2 innings for the season (2.15 per nine innings)...eight of the nine home runs have been solo shots...has yielded a .182 (6-for-33) batting average with runners in scoring position...the opponents seven hitter in the order is 8-for-15 (.533) against him...the A's have won four of his five no decisions and are 4-4 (.500) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Did not pitch during the spring and began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint...was sent to Low-A Stockton on April 15 to begin a rehab assignment and picked up the win in a 14-10 Ports win that day against Modesto (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so, 2 hr)...was moved up to Triple-A Las Vegas and had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma (4.0 ip, 3 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...was 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) in three starts overall when he reinstated from the IL on May 1...took the loss in each of his first two starts...logged 2.0 innings and walked a career-high tying four batters in his first start, a 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...it was the shortest start of his career...then lost a 1-0 decision at Minnesota on May 7, allowing a Polanco home run in the sixth for the only run of the game...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings and struck out a season-high seven batters while logging a season-high 99 pitches...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...left his start on May 12 at Detroit with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save in a game the A's would come back to win 5-3...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high seven hits in 5.0 innings on May 24 at Seattle but had a no decision in the As 7-5 win.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-4 loss at Cleveland last Thursday...Oakland scored twice in the second and he blanked the Guardians on two hits over the first three innings before allowing back-to-back home runs to Ramirez and Naylor to start the fourth...the A's scored twice in the fifth and he was relieved by Puk to start the sixth with the A's leading 4-2...the bullpen allowed four runs over the final three innings for the blown save...it was the second time this year the pen blew the save in one of his starts.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .201 (46-for-229) with a .602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a .189 opponents batting average and .569 OPS the first time through the order, .285 with a .907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that...yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order...allowed a .083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit .107 when putting his curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0-for-2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, 3-2 with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road...had a 4-3 record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night...was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts...logged a 7-3 record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

RHP Paul Blackburn (5-2, 2.31 ERA):	Is 0-2 with a 3.86 ERA over his last three starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA over his first nine starts...ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (2.31), eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.333) and OPS (.602), tied for ninth in games started (12) and 10th in batting average (.214) and on-base percentage (.268)...is 4-0 with a 0.91 ERA, .187 opponents batting average and .491 OPS in seven starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 4.39 ERA, .250 opponents average and .749 OPS in five starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for the lead in road wins...has not allowed a home run in 39.2 innings on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's loss at Cleveland last Friday (8.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Boston, a start earlier this month in Oakland on June 4 in an 8-0 loss (4.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

- Is tied for sixth in the American League in holds (10)...is tied for seventh among AL relievers in strikeouts (34).
