OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-49) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (26-43)

SATURDAY, JUNE 25, 2022 — KAUFFMAN STADIUM — 3:10 CT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four straight, six of the last seven and 19 of the last 22 games...are 8-29 (.216) over the last 37 games and 23-49 (.319) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds (24-46, .343)...are 26 games under .500 for the first time since Sept. 30, 2016 (67-93)...have the second worst record in Oakland history after 72 games to the 1979 club (22-49, lost games 73 through 79)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100-loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 22 games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out.

SERIES NOTES: The A's have lost the first game of each of the last 10 series, which is their longest such streak since Aug. 16-Sept. 8, 1997 when they had a nine-game streak...the Oakland record is 13 (three times, last: April 11-May 20, 1994)...are 4-19 in the first game of a series and 10-12 in the final game...were swept by Seattle in a three-game series to close out the last homestand, which was the seventh time they were swept this year...have now lost eight consecutive series, which is the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 2-15-1 over the last 18 series.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 3-17 (.150) in June, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors (Angels, 7-16, 3.04)...the only time in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .241 in any month (min. 6 games) was in June of 1979 when they were 5-24 (.172)...went 10-21 (.323) in May, which was the 13th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses...rank last in the majors in batting (.196), on-base percentage (.248), slugging (.315), OPS (.563) and runs (46) in June...the lowest single-month batting average in Athletics history in a month with more than 15 games is .207 in August of 1906 and the lowest on-base percentage is .258 in September of 1908...are averaging 2.30 runs per game in June...have averaged fewer than three runs in a game in a month three times in Oakland history (2.50 in Aug. 1978, 2.73 in Aug. 2008, 2.96 in June 1977)...have a 5.16 ERA (99 er in 172.2 ip) this June, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to Kansas City (0-1), New York-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games) tonight...it is their second of two 10-game road trips this year (April 9-17) and is part of a stretch from June 7-July 3 where they are scheduled play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 15-21 (.417) on the road compared to 8-28 (.222) at home...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...won three of four from Baltimore in the first home series of the season but have lost each of the 10 home series since then...it is the first time the A's have lost 10 or more consecutive home series since June 20, 1916 to May 8, 1917 when they lost 17 straight (final 14 of 1916, first three of 1917)...won the first two home games against Baltimore but have not put together back-to-back home wins since then...are batting .218 (261-for-1197) with 135 runs scored (3.75 per game) and 34 home runs in 36 games on the road compared to .198 with 86 runs (2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games.

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to one run or fewer in seven of the last 10 games and have scored 15 runs total over that span...have been shut-out nine times, which is tied for fourth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 27 of 72 (37.5%) games and have 221 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Tigers, 203)...are batting .193 (137-for-709) with 48 runs scored over the last 22 games (2.18 runs per game)...rank last in the majors in batting (.208), on-base percentage (.271), slugging percentage (.325) and OPS (.596)...have finished last in the majors in all four categories once in Athletics history (1943)...have the second fewest home runs (49) and extra base hits (167) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.30 ERA (190 er in 322.2 ip) over the last 37 games and have a 4.39 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 4.93)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.254), slugging percentage (.416) and OPS (.743), and the second highest on-base percentage (.326)...have the third fewest strikeouts (542) and are tied for third in most walks (238).

STARTING PITCHING: Frankie Montas tossed 8.0 scoreless innings Thursday, which marks the second time an A's starter has tossed 8.0 innings without allowing a run this year (Blackburn, June 10 at Cleveland)...both times the starter has ended up with a no decision...starters are 4-22 with a 4.86 ERA

(114 er in 211.0 ip) over the last 40 games dating back to May 12...are 15-36 with a 4.37 ERA for the season...have the fourth fewest wins and fourth highest ERA in the American League and are tied for the fourth most innings pitched (376.2).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-7 with one save, six blown saves and a 6.62 ERA (62 er in 84.1 ip) over the last 26 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.42 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 4.68)...is 14-for-25 (56.0%) in save opportunities...has the third lowest save percentage and third fewest saves.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 43-of-52 (82.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the tied for the third best percentage in the Majors...are tied for ninth in steals...A's opponents are 23-for-37 (62.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the American League and the majors...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed (23) and most caught stealing (14)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in the last six games after making at least one error in nine consecutive games...have 47 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League (Chicago-AL; 48)...rank second in the AL in double plays (63) and tied for fourth in fewest outfield assists (7).

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 46 players, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year...21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers...have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two years...have used three different position players as pitchers for the first time in Oakland history (Bethancourt, Neuse, Pinder).

THIS AND THAT: Thursday, the A's lost for the fourth time this year when leading after eighth inning, which is tied with the Phillies for the most in the majors...are 19-10 (.655) when scoring first and 4-39 (.093) when the opponent scores first...have the second lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-22/.083)...have seven come-from-behind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-5)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.

A'S vs. ROYALS: The A's trail in the season series 1-3 after losing yesterday and losing two of three games in Oakland last weekend...won the season series last year as they went 5-2 against the Royals for the third consecutive season series...won three of four in Oakland and two of three in Kansas City...are now 25-13 (.658) against the Royals dating back to 2016, which includes 12-8 in Oakland and 13-5 in Kansas City...all-time, the A's are 333-272 (.550) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.583)...are 181-122 in Oakland and 152-150 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and tied for ninth in go-ahead RBI (12)...his nine game-winning RBI are tied for most in the AL and tied for second most in the Majors...**Sean Murphy** is tied for second among AL catchers in RBI (26) and ranks third in home runs (8)...he leads AL catchers in games started (53), total chances (445) and putouts (422), is tied for the lead in assists (22) and ranks first in fielding percentage (.998).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1950 Eddie Joost homers in both games of a doubleheader at Chicago and combines to drive in seven runs...in 1996 Mark McGwire hits his 300th career home run in the second inning of the A's 10-8 loss to Detroit...he would later add #301 for his 33rd career multi-homer game...in 2019 Joaquin Soria pitches a scoreless inning of relief in the A's 7-3 win at St. Louis...it is his 674th career appearance, which breaks the MLB record for games pitched by a Mexican-born pitcher.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jared Koenig (1-2, 6.59 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas June 8 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...tossed 5.2 scoreless innings for his first Major League win in his last start after allowing 10 runs in 8.0 innings over his first two starts, both losses...became the first A's pitcher to lose each of first two career games since Daniel Gossett in 2017.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are 9-for-24 (.375) with the bases empty, 7-for-29 (.241) with runners on...has a .143 (3-for-21) opponents average with runners in scoring position...has a 3.00 ERA (3 er in 9.0 ip) over innings 1-3 and a 13.50 ERA (7 er in 4.2 ip) from the fourth inning on.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a start and loss in a 13-2 decision at Atlanta on June 8...became the 55th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the third this year (Oller, April 12; Martinez, May 10)...struck out Contreras in the second inning for his first strikeout...blanked the Braves on two hits over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed an Albies sacrifice fly in the fourth...then yielded a two-run triple to Harris in the fifth and was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed Harris to score.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Boston on June 14...allowed single runs in each of the first three innings, including a Bogaerts RBI single in the first, a Refsnyder sacrifice fly in the second and a Martinez leadoff home run in the third...then surrendered a three-run home run to Devers in the fourth...was relieved by Oller to start the fifth with the A's trailing 6-0.

LAST START: He combined with Doming Acevedo, Zach Jackson and Sam Moll on a three-hit shutout for his first Major League win, a 4-0 victory over Kansas City last Sunday in Oakland...became the first American League or National League pitcher since 1901 with the following line: 5.2 ip, 2 h, 0 r, 0 er, 4 bb, 0 so...stranded five base runners over his first five innings and was relieved by Acevedo with the bases loaded and two outs in the sixth

WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 4-2 with a 2.21 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Triple-A Las Vegas...struck out 61 batters in 53.0 innings, an average of 10.36 per nine innings...walked just 15 (2.55 per nine innings) and surrendered four home runs (0.68 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: At the time of his June 8 promotion to Oakland, he led the Pacific Coast League in opponents on-base percentage (.261) and pitches per game (91.8), ranked second in ERA (2.21), tied for second in strikeouts (61), third in opponents batting average (.203), slugging percentage (.318) and OPS (.579), tied for third in wins (4), fourth in innings pitched (53.0) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.07), fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.55) and sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.68).

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Went 4-0 with a 1.64 ERA (7 er in 38.1 ip) and .187 (26-for-139) opponents batting average over his final six starts...struck out 48 batters in 38.1 innings, walked just eight and surrendered two home runs...was 0-2 with a 3.68 ERA over his first three games.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Held the opposition to a .203 batting average, including .200 (31-for-155) against right-handed hitters and .216 (8-for-37) against left-handers...surrendered all four of his home runs to righties...three were solo shots...had a .191 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .129 the second time and .315 after that...held the opposition to a .127 batting average with two strikes

THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in the first (8.0 ip) or second (8.0 ip) innings and compiled a 0.55 ERA (2 er in 33.0 ip) over innings one through four...had a 4.95 ERA (11 er in 20.0 ip) from the fifth inning on...allowed all

four of his home run at home where he compiled a 2.20 ERA and .184 opponents batting average in five games...the Aviators were 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments

2022 DAY-BY-DAY: Made his only relief appearance in his first outing on April 8 against Reno when he tossed 4.0 innings...made his first start on April 16 at Salt Lake and allowed a season-high three runs and walked a season-high four batters in 5.2 innings in a 5-1 loss...lost again on April 22 against El Paso but then won each of his next four starts from April 30 to May 19...finished April 1-2 with a 3.54 ERA and .240 opponents batting average in four games, three starts...then went 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA and .177 opponents average in four starts in May...tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins in May, ranked second in opponents OPS (.468) and strikeouts (34), third in batting average and fourth in ERA...struck out a season-high 10 batters in back-to-back starts on May 7 at Sacramento and May 13 against Salt Lake...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in the 13-0 win over the River Cats...logged a season-high 8.0 innings, allowed one run and did not walk a batter in a 5-2 win over the Bees...allowed a season-high tying three runs on a season-high nine hits on May 19 at Reno but picked up the win in a 5-3 decision...logged a season-high 108 pitches and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings on May 25 at Tacoma but had a no decision in the Aviators 3-1 win...left his start on June 1 against Sacramento after six innings with a 2-1 lead but ended up with a no decision after the bullpen allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save.

2021 RECAP: Spent his first season in the A's organization and in affiliated baseball at Double-A Midland and was 7-5 with a 3.26 ERA in 24 games, including 21 starts...led the Double-A Central in ERA, opponents batting average (.240) and innings pitched (121.1), ranked second in winning percentage (.583), tied for second in wins, third in on-base percentage (.314), tied for fourth in games started and fifth in slugging percentage (.400) and OPS (.714)...ranked second in the A's farm system in ERA and innings pitched, fourth in strikeouts (100) and tied for fourth in wins...his opponents batting average broke down to .203 (26-for-128) against left-handed hitters compared to .255 (82-for-322) against right-handers...surrendered 13 of his 14 home runs to righties and had a .767 OPS (.582 vs. lefties)...held the opposition to a .195 batting average with runners in scoring position and .145 with two strikes...compiled a 1.25 ERA in May, 4.08 in June, 2.01 in July, 5.70 in August and 1.93 in September...was 6-4 at home, 1-1 on the road.

CAREER: Was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the 35th round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Central Arizona College but did not sign...also attended Old Dominion and Cal State Monterey Bay...pitched in independent leagues from 2017-19...had stops in Monterey (Pecos), Salina (American Association), Birmingham-Bloomfield (United Shore) and San Rafael (Pacific Association) in 2017, San Rafael in 2018 and Lake Erie (Frontier) in 2019...combined for a 22-10 record and a 3.40 ERA in 53 games, including 47 starts, in three seasons of independent ball...was signed by the A's as a free agent on Jan. 14, 2020 and is 11-7 with a 2.94 ERA in 33 games, including 29 starts, in two seasons in the minors.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (0-5, 5.98 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 6.91 ERA, .302 opponents batting average and .943 OPS over his last six starts after going 0-2 with a 4.50 ERA, .197 opponents batting average and .697 OPS over his first four starts...has started the season 0-5, which is the longest losing streak of his career...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 0-5 since Kendall Graveman also lost each of his first five decisions in 2018...has held right-handed hitters to a .231 batting average and .743 OPS...left-handers are batting .297 with a .962 OPS...has a .188 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .324 with eight of his 11 home runs allowed after that...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-2 A's loss to Seattle last Tuesday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Kansas City, a start in the A's 11-2 win last year on June 12 in Oakland (6.0 ip, 2 h, 0 r, 0 er, 4 bb, 7 so).

- Was placed on the Covid-19 injured list on Tuesday but was reinstated yesterday.
- Has allowed three earned runs in his last 14 games (11.1 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 3 er, 8 bb, 17 so, 2.38 ERA) after allowing no runs over his first 12 contests (10.0 ip).
