OAKLAND ATHLETICS (24-49) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (26-44)

SUNDAY, JUNE 26, 2022 — KAUFFMAN STADIUM — 1:10 CT

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped a four-game losing skid last night, beating Kansas City by a score of 9-7...have lost six of the last eight and 19 of the last 23 games...are 9-29 (.237) over the last 38 games and 24-49 (.329) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds (24-47, .338)...are 25 games under .500...have the second worst record in Oakland history after 73 games to the 1979 club (22-50, lost games 74 through 79)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100-loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 22 games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out.

SERIES NOTES: The A's have lost the first game of each of the last 10 series, which is their longest such streak since Aug. 16-Sept. 8, 1997 when they had a nine-game streak...the Oakland record is 13 (three times, last: April 11-May 20, 1994)...are 4-19 in the first game of a series and 10-12 in the final game...were swept by Seattle in a three-game series to close out the last homestand, which was the seventh time they were swept this year... have now lost eight consecutive series, which is the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 2-15-1 over the last 18 series.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 4-17 (.190) in June, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors (Angels, 7-17, .292)...the only time in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .241 in any month (min. 6 games) was in June of 1979 when they were 5-24 (.172)...went 10-21 (.323) in May, which was the 13th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses...rank second to last in the majors in batting (.205) and last in on-base percentage (.258), slugging (.329), OPS (.588) and runs (55) in June...the lowest single-month batting average in Athletics history in a month with more than 15 games is .207 in August of 1906 and the lowest on-base percentage is .258 in September of 1908...are averaging 2.62 runs per game in June... have averaged fewer than three runs in a game in a month three times in Oakland history (2.50 in Aug. 1978, 2.73 in Aug. 2008, 2.96 in June 1977)... have a 5.25 ERA (106 er in 181.2 ip) this June, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to Kansas City (1-1), New York-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games) tonight...it is their second of two 10-game road trips this year (April 9-17) and is part of a stretch from June 7-July 3 where they are scheduled play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 16-21 (.432) on the road compared to 8-28 (.222) at home...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...won three of four from Baltimore in the first home series of the season but have lost each of the 10 home series since then...it is the first time the A's have lost 10 or more consecutive home series since June 20, 1916 to May 8, 1917 when they lost 17 straight (final 14 of 1916, first three of 1917)...won the first two home games against Baltimore but have not put together back-to-back home wins since then...are batting .222 (275-for-1238) with 144 runs scored (3.89 per game) and 35 home runs in 37 games on the road compared to .198 with 86 runs (2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games.

OFFENSE: The A's scored nine runs yesterday, their highest total in a game since June 11 at Cleveland...had been held to one run or fewer in seven of the previous 11 games and scored 15 runs total over that span...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for fourth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 27 of 73 (37.0%) games and have 230 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Tigers, 209)...rank last in the majors in batting (.211), on-base percentage (.274), slugging percentage (.329) and OPS (.602)...have finished last in the majors in all four categories once in Athletics history (1943)...have the second fewest home runs (50) and extra base hits (174) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.35 ERA (197 er in 331.2 ip) over the last 38 games and have a 4.43 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 4.98)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.254) and slugging percentage (.418), and have the second highest OPS (.745) on-base percentage (.326)...have the third fewest strikeouts (551) and are third in most walks (245).

STARTING PITCHING: Frankie Montas tossed 8.0 scoreless innings Thursday, which marks the second time an A's starter has tossed 8.0 innings without allowing a run this year (Blackburn, June 10 at Cleveland)...both times the

starter has ended up with a no decision...starters are 4-22 with a 4.88 ERA (117 er in 215.2 ip) over the last 41 games dating back to May 12...are 15-36 with a 4.39 ERA for the season...have the fourth fewest wins and fourth highest ERA in the American League and have the fourth most innings pitched (381.1).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 2-7 with two saves, six blown saves and a 6.70 ERA (66 er in 88.2 ip) over the last 27 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.48 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 4.72)...is 15-for-26 (57.7%) in save opportunities...has the third lowest save percentage and third fewest saves.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 44-of-54 (81.5%) stolen base attempts, which is the sixth best percentage in the Majors...are tied for eighth in steals...A's opponents are 23-for-37 (62.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the American League and the majors...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed (23) and tied for third in most caught stealing (14)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in the last seven games after making at least one error in nine consecutive games...have 48 errors for the season, which is third most in the AL...rank second in the AL in double plays (63) and are fourth in fewest outfield assists (7).

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 46 players, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year...21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers...have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two years...have used three different position players as pitchers for the first time in Oakland history (Bethancourt, Neuse, Pinder).

THIS AND THAT: Are 20-10 (.667) when scoring first and 4-39 (.093) when the opponent scores first...have seven come-from-behind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)... are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-5)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.

A'S vs. ROYALS: The A's trail in the season series 2-3 after winning yesterday and losing three of the previous four...won the season series last year as they went 5-2 against the Royals for the third consecutive season series... won three of four in Oakland and two of three in Kansas City...are now 26-13 (.667) against the Royals dating back to 2016, which includes 12-8 in Oakland and 14-5 in Kansas City...all-time, the A's are 334-272 (.551) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.583)...are 181-122 in Oakland and 153-150 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and in go-ahead RBI (13)...his 10 game-winning RBI are most in the AL...**Sean Murphy** is second among AL catchers in RBI (28) and ranks third in home runs (8)...he leads AL catchers in games started (54), total chances (455) and putouts (431), is tied for the lead in assists (23) and ranks first in fielding percentage (.998).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1958** Hector Lopez hits three home runs in the A's 8-6, 12 inning win over Washington...in **1974** Campy Campaneris has two hits in the A's 5-0 win over California, giving him 1000 in his Oakland career...in **1997** Mark McGwire hits his ninth career grand slam in a 6-3 win over Texas, tying the franchise record held by Jimmie Foxx, Sam Chapman and Gus Zernial...in **2005** switch-hitter Nick Swisher becomes just the second player in Oakland history to homer from both side of the plate in the same game in a 16-0 win over San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (0-5, 5.98 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-3 with a 6.91 ERA (22 er in 28.2 ip), .302 (35-for-116) opponents batting average and .943 OPS over his last six starts after going 0-2 with a 4.50 ERA, .197 opponents batting average and .697 OPS over his first four starts...has started the season 0-5, which is the longest losing streak of his career...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 0-5 since Kendall Graveman also lost each of his first five decisions in 2018...the last A's pitcher to lose more than his first five decisions in a season is Mike Mohler, who went 0-8 to start the 1997 season...began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint and was reinstated on May 1.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held right-handed hitters to a .231 (21-for-91) batting average and .743 OPS...left-handers are batting .297 (27-for-91) with a .962 OPS...his career marks are .208 with a .640 OPS against righties, .277 with a .905 OPS against lefties...has issued 12 of his 21 walks this year and 43 of 64 in his career to lefties.

THROUGH THE ORDER: Has a .188 (15-for-80) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .324 (33-for-102) with eight of his 11 home runs allowed after that...his career numbers and are .188 the first time through the order, .277 with 25 of his 32 home runs after that

...AND INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 8.78 ERA (26 er in 26.2 ip) from the third inning on...now has a 2.03 career ERA (14 er in 62.0 ip) in innings one and two and a 6.19 ERA (74 er in 107.2) from the third inning on.

THIS AND THAT: His 5.98 ERA is second highest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...has allowed 10 home runs in his last seven starts and 11 in 46.2 innings for the season (2.12 per nine innings)...nine of the 11 home runs have been solo shots...the A's have won four of his five no decisions and are 4-6 (.400) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Did not pitch during the spring and began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint...was sent to Low-A Stockton on April 15 to begin a rehab assignment and picked up the win in a 14-10 Ports win that day against Modesto (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so, 2 hr)...was moved up to Triple-A Las Vegas and had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma (4.0 ip, 3 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...was 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) in three starts overall when he reinstated from the IL on May 1...took the loss in each of his first two starts...logged 2.0 innings and walked four batters in his first start, a 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...it was the shortest start of his career...then lost a 1-0 decision at Minnesota on May 7, allowing a Polanco home run in the sixth for the only run of the game...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings and struck out a season-high seven batters while logging a season-high 99 pitches...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...left his start on May 12 at Detroit with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save in a game the A's would come back to win 5-3...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in one of his starts (June 9 at Cleveland)...allowed five runs on a season-high seven hits in 5.0 innings on May 24 at Seattle but had a no decision in the As 7-5 win...walked a career-high six batters, allowed a career-high tying six runs and a season-high tying seven hits in 3.2 innings in a 10-1 loss at Boston on June 15.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-2 loss to Seattle last Tuesday in Oakland...struck out a season-high tying seven batters in 5.1 innings...allowed just one run over his first five innings on a lead off home run to Trammell in the fifth...then surrendered a RBI double to Winker in the sixth and left trailing 2-0...the pen then allowed five runs in the seventh.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .201 (46-for-229) with a .602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a .189 opponents batting average and .569 OPS the first time through the order, .285 with a .907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that...yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order...allowed a .083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit .107 when putting his curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0-for-2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, 3-2 with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road...had a 4-3 record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night...was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts...logged a 7-3 record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

RHP Paul Blackburn (6-3, 2.97 ERA):	Is 1-3 with a 5.14 ERA and .288 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA and .211 opponents average over his first nine starts...ranks ninth in the American League in ERA (2.97), tied for ninth in wins (6) and tied for 10th in winning percentage (.667)...is 5-0 with a 1.00 ERA, .209 opponents batting average and .531 OPS in seven starts on the road compared to 1-3 with a 5.87 ERA, .286 opponents average and .865 OPS in six starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for the lead in road wins...has not allowed a home run in 45.0 innings on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-0 A's loss to Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland (4.0 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against the Yankees, a start in the A's 3-1 win in Oakland last year on Aug. 29 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 0 r, 1 bb, 1 so).

- Has allowed runs in six of his last 11 appearances, but allowed six runs in the other five...in total over the stretch, he has (9.0 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 10 bb, 14 so, 6.00 ERA).
- Is tied for fourth in the American League in holds (12) and tied for seventh in games pitched (30)...is tied for fourth among AL relievers in strikeouts (40).
- Has a .188 opponents batting average but has issued 23 walks in 28.2 innings for a .347 on-base percentage...the walks are second most among Major League relievers (Coleman, KC)...has walked the first batter faced eight times which is the most in the Majors.
- Has allowed just 1-of-11 (9.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the ninth lowest percentage in the AL.

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

- Has allowed six earned runs in his last 15 games (11.1 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 6 er, 11 bb, 17 so, 4.76 ERA) after allowing no runs over his first 12 contests (10.0 ip).
- Has allowed 5-of-10 (50.0%) inherited runners to score over his last 10 games after allowing 1-of-6 (16.7%) to score over his first 17 outings.
