OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-50) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (54-20)

TUESDAY, JUNE 28, 2022 — YANKEE STADIUM — 7:05 ET

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their two-game winning streak snapped last night...it was the first time the A's won consecutive games since May 24-25 at Seattle...have lost five of the last seven games, 10 of the last 14 and 20 of the last 25...are 10-30 (.250) over the last 40 games and 25-50 (.333) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds (25-47, .347)...are 25 games under .500, which is one short of the season high of 26 (23-49 on June 24)...have the second lowest winning percentage in Oakland history after 75 games to the 1979 club (22-53, lost games 76 through 79)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100-loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by 21½ games, which is one-half game short of the season high of 22 (twice, last: June 25).

SERIES NOTES: With the loss last night, the A's have now lost the first game of each of the last 11 series...that is their longest such streak since April 11-May 20, 1994 when they lost the first game of 13 consecutive series, which is the longest streak in Oakland history (three times)...are 4-20 in the first game of a series and 11-12 in the final game...won two of three at Kansas City over the weekend for their first series win since taking two of three at Seattle, May 23-25...it snapped an eight-series losing streak, which was the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 3-15-1 over the previous 19 series.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 5-18 (.217) in June, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors (Pirates, 8-17/.320)...the only time in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .241 in any month (min. 6 games) was in June of 1979 when they were 5-24 (.172)...went 10-21 (.323) in May, which was the 13th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses...this is the first time the A's have lost 18 or more games in back-to-back months since 1979 when they went 5-24 in June and 8-20 in July...rank last in the majors in batting (.204), on-base percentage (.257), slugging (.327), OPS (.585) and runs (65) this June...the lowest single-month batting average in Athletics history in a month with more than 15 games is .207 in August of 1906 and the lowest on-base percentage is .258 in September of 1908...are averaging 2.83 runs per game in June...have averaged fewer than three runs in a game in a month three times in Oakland history (2.50 in Aug. 1978, 2.73 in Aug. 2008, 2.96 in June 1977)...have a 5.26 ERA (116 er in 198.2 ip) this June, which is second highest in the majors (Cubs, 6.08).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this 10-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1), New York-AL (0-1) and Seattle (four games)...it is their second of two 10-game road trips this year (April 9-17) and is part of a stretch from June 7-July 3 where they are scheduled play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 17-22 (.436) on the road compared to 8-28 (.222) at home...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...won three of four from Baltimore in the first home series of the season but have lost each of the 10 home series since then...it is the first time the A's have lost 10 or more consecutive home series since June 20, 1916 to May 8, 1917 when they lost 17 straight (final 14 of 1916, first three of 1917)...won the first two home games against Baltimore but have not put together back-to-back home wins since then...are batting .221 (289-for-1307) with 154 runs scored (3.9 per game) and 36 home runs in 39 games on the road compared to .198 with 86 runs (2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 19 runs in the last three games after scoring 18 runs over the previous 11 contests...have scored 240 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Tigers, 216)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 27 of 75 (36.0%) games...are batting .201 (165-for-819) with 67 runs scored over the last 25 games (2.7 runs per game)...rank last in the majors in batting (.210), on-base percentage (.273), slugging percentage (.328) and OPS (.601)...have finished last in the majors in all four categories once in Athletics history (1943)...have the second fewest home runs (51) and extra base hits (179) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.34 ERA (207 er in 348.2 ip) over the last 40 games and have a 4.45 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.328), slugging percentage (.418) and OPS (.746) and third highest batting average (.253)...have issued the third most walks (256), allowed the third most home runs (82) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (565).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-3 with a 5.02 ERA (21 er in 37.2 ip) over the last seven games and 4-22 with a 4.90 ERA (123 er in 226.0

ip) over the last 43 games dating back to May 12...are 15-36 with a 4.41 ERA for the season...the losses are tied with the Reds for second most in the majors (Nationals, 40)...have the third fewest wins in the American League, the fourth highest ERA and the fourth most innings pitched (391.2).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has three blown saves in the last five games and is 3-7 with three saves, eight blown saves and a 6.54 ERA (70 er in 96.1 ip) over the last 29 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.51 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 16-for-29 (55.2%) in save opportunities...has the second lowest save percentage and third fewest saves...has the fifth lowest opponents batting average against first batters faced (.229).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a base in each of the last five games, which matches their longest streak this year (May 24-28)...have stolen a base in six consecutive games just once over the last 10 years (Aug. 18-23, 2021)...have been successful in 46-of-56 (82.1%) stolen base attempts overall, which is the second best percentage in the American League...rank fourth in steals...A's opponents are 26-for-40 (65.0%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the AL...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed and tied for third in most caught stealing (14)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed two errors last night, both on catchers interference by Sean Murphy...it was just the second time in Oakland history the A's had two catchers interference in the same game (April 28, 2017 vs. Houston), but it was the first time in the same inning...now have 50 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...also rank second in double plays (65) and tied for fourth in fewest outfield assists (8).

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 46 players, which is fifth most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year...21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have eight rookies on the roster, including six pitchers...have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two years...have used three different position players as pitchers for the first time in Oakland history (Bethancourt, Neuse, Pinder).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 21-10 (.677) when scoring first and 4-40 (.091) when the opponent scores first...have the second lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 3-23/.115)...have eight come-from-behind wins, which is tied for third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 7)...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are the only team in the majors without an extra inning win...the two extra inning games are tied with the Tigers and Reds for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.

A'S vs. YANKEES: The A's lost the first meeting of 2022 last night after losing the season series last year, 3-4...it was the A's first season series loss to the Yankees since 2016 (3-4)...went 1-2 in New York and 2-2 in Oakland...are 18-16 against the Yankees dating back to 2016...have won 11 of the last 14 games and 23 of the last 32 in Oakland but have dropped nine of the last 12 games in New York...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 257-288 against the Yankees...that includes 143-130 in Oakland and 114-158 in New York...are 17-27 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 798-1154 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and tied for sixth in go-ahead RBI (13)...has hit safely in each of his last six games and is 11-for-25 (.440) with three doubles, two home runs and five RBI during the streak...**Sean Murphy** ranks third among AL catchers in home runs (8) and RBI (28)...leads AL catchers in games started (55) and total chances (466).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz tosses a two-hit shutout and Gus Zernial homers twice and drives in five runs in the A's 12-0 win at New York...in **1994** Bobby Witt pitches a two-hit shutout to defeat the California Angels 3-0, setting a club record for fewest hits in consecutive complete games...in his previous start, he tossed a one-hitter against Kansas City.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (3-7, 3.21 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Tossed 8.0 scoreless innings in his last start, a no decision in the A's 2-1 loss...it was the eighth time in his 15 starts that the A's have scored one run or fewer...have been shut out in three of his starts and scored one run five times...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his starts and has just one win in those starts...has allowed two runs or fewer nine times and two earned runs or fewer 10 times...is now 1-6 with a 3.11 ERA (25 er in 72.2 ip) over his last 12 starts after going 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA over his first three starts...the A's have lost in all five of his no decisions and are 3-12 (.200) in his starting assignments

RUN SUPPORT: Received one run of support in his last start for the second consecutive start and it was the ninth time in his last 10 starts he has received one run of support or fewer...has support of one run or fewer in 11 of his 15 starts, including four starts with no run support...has support of four runs or more in his other four starts (4,5,6,7)...has 29 runs of support in his 15 starts this year (89.2 ip, 2.91 RSA).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in games started (15), ranks fourth in innings pitched (89.2), sixth in strikeouts (92) and opponents on-base percentage (.272) and 10th in slugging percentage (.347) and OPS (.620)...is tied for fourth in losses (7).

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out 11 batters on May 26 against Texas after fanning 12 batters on May 15 against Los Angeles (AL)...now has nine career 10-strikeout games, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...has one game with 13 strikeouts, one with 12 and two with 11...had 207 strikeouts last year, which ranked fourth in the AL and was the second highest single-season total in Oakland history.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 2-1 with a 1.07 ERA (3 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts against American League East teams compared to 1-6 with a 4.06 ERA (29 er in 64.1 ip) in 11 starts against everyone else...is now 6-4 with a 2.36 ERA (21 er in 80.0 ip) in 17 career appearances against the AL East.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .224 batting average against left-handed hitters, .226 against right-handers...has yielded six home runs in 170 at bats against left-handed hitters, three in 164 against right-handers...has issued 16 of his 22 walks to lefties...six of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...opponents are batting .150 with two strikes and are 3-for-33 (.091) on an 0-2 count.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-5 despite a 2.38 ERA (17 er in 64.1 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 5.33 ERA (15 er in 25.1 ip) in five starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead in losses at home...in six seasons with the A's, he is 17-16 with a 3.31 ERA (105 er in 285.2 ip) in 58 games at home, 17-12 with a 4.22 ERA (111 er in 237.0 ip) in 52 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-2 with a 3.08 ERA (13 er in 38.0 ip) in seven starts at night compared to 1-5 with a 3.31 ERA (19 er in 51.2 ip) in eight starts during the day...is tied for the Major League lead in losses in day games...now has a career record of 21-14 at night and 13-16 during the day.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-4 with a 1.71 ERA (10 er in 52.2 ip) and .188 (36-for-192) opponents batting average in eight starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 4.78 ERA (17 er in 32.0 ip) and .273 (33-for-121) opponents average in five starts on five days rest...in his career, he is 13-13 with a 2.64 ERA (62 er in 211.1 ip) in 35 starts on four days rest, 18-13 with a 4.08 ERA (114 er in 251.1 ip) in 45 starts on five days rest or more.

THE THIRD INNING: Has allowed nine of his 38 runs in the third inning for a 5.79 ERA (9 er in 14.0 ip)...has a 2.43 ERA (8 er in 35.2 ip) over innings 1-2 and a 2.42 ERA (12 er in 44.2 ip) in innings 4-7...has yielded three runs in the eighth inning (1.1 ip)...last year, he allowed 20 of his 79 runs (25.3%) in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss...his other Opening Day start came in 2020 and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 r, 4 bb, 11 so) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore...was 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA over his first three starts through April 18...then had a career-high five-game losing streak from April 23 to June 5 (previous: 3, two times, last: May 19-29, 2021)...compiled a 2.87 ERA and .214 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...logged 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering

the eighth inning...retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...it was the first of three times the A's were shut out in one of his starts (May 4 vs. Tampa Bay, May 10 at Detroit)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Cleveland in Oakland on April 29...struck out Franmil Reyes to end the fifth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high four batters, allowed a season-high two home runs and matched his highs in runs (5)...left with a 6-5 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in one of his starts (June 23 vs. Seattle)...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a .194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average...then went 0-3 despite a 2.31 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in six starts in May...threw a season-high 105 pitches in a 6-0 loss at Detroit in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader...struck out a season-high 12 batters in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 15 in Oakland...had a no decision in his next start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) after leaving the game with two outs in the second inning after being hit in the hand by a Rengifo line drive...the 1.2 innings pitched matched the shortest start of his career (Aug. 18, 2020 at Arizona)...struck out 11 in 7.0 innings on May 26 against Texas, his ninth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...went over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...snapped his career-high five game losing streak in the A's 10-5 win at Cleveland on June 11, despite allowing a season-high tying five runs in 6.0 innings...allowed a season-high tying five runs on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in a 5-1 loss to Kansas City on June 17.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1 loss to Seattle last Thursday in Oakland...tossed a season-high 8.0 innings and did not allow a run...allowed just two base runners over the first seven innings, both walks, and had a no-hitter until Frazier singled with two outs in the eighth...Torrens followed with a single but Montas got the final out...was relieved by Jackson to start the ninth and he walked two batters before being relieved by Puk with runners on first and second and two outs...Puk allowed both runs to score on two wild pitches.

LHP Cole Irvin (2-5, 3.29 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list May 22 and is 0-4 with a 3.54 ERA in seven starts since his return...the four-game losing streak matches his career high (third time, previous: May 9-30, 2021)...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...has allowed 10 of his 27 runs in the first inning and has a 6.00 ERA and .327 opponents batting average...has a 1.50 ERA and .210 opponents average over innings two through five...has a 9.72 ERA and .351 opponents average from the sixth inning on...is 1-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 5.03 ERA and .290 opponents average in six starts on the road...has allowed all nine of his home runs on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss at Kansas City last Friday (5.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Yankees in his career.
