OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-52) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (36-41)

THURSDAY, JUNE 30, 2022 — T-MOBILE PARK — 7:10 PT

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series at New York (AL) to start the week after winning back-to-back games last Saturday and Sunday for the first time since May 24-25 at Seattle...have lost seven of the last nine games, 12 of the last 16 and 22 of the last 27...are 10-32 (.238) over the last 42 games and 25-52 (.325) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds (26-48, .351)...are 27 games under .500 for the first time since Sept. 30, 2015 when they were 66-93...have not been 28 games under since Sept. 29, 2015 when they were 65-93...have the second lowest winning percentage in Oakland history after 77 games to the 1979 club (22-55, lost games 78 and 79)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100-loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 23½ games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 5-20 (.200) in June, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors (Pirates, 9-18/.333)...will finish with the second lowest winning percentage in a month of six or more games in Oakland history whether they win or lose today...the lowest was in June of 1979 when the A's were 5-24 (.172)...this is the 14th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses...went 10-21 in May and have lost 20 games in consecutive months for the third time in Oakland history...in 1979, went 5-24 in June and 8-20 in July...in 1978, went 7-21 in August and 7-20 in September...rank last in the majors in on-base percentage (.260), slugging (.323), OPS (.583) and runs (69) this June and second to last in batting average (.206)...the lowest single-month batting average in Athletics history in a month with more than 15 games is .207 in August of 1906 and the lowest on-base percentage is .258 in September of 1908...the three lowest single-month OPS in Oakland history are .572 (April, 1968), .581 (April, 1979) and .598 (May, 2022)...are averaging 2.76 runs per game in June...have averaged fewer than three runs per game in a month three times in Oakland history (2.50 in Aug. 1978, 2.73 in Aug. 2008, 2.96 in June 1977)...have a 5.16 ERA (123 er in 214.2 ip) this June, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.

SERIES NOTES: The A's were swept by New York (AL), which was the eighth time they were swept this year...have lost the first game of each of the last 11 series...that is their longest such streak since April 11-May 20, 1994 when they lost the first game of 13 consecutive series, which is the longest streak in Oakland history (three times)...are 4-20 in the first game of a series and 11-13 in the final game...won two of three at Kansas City last weekend for their first series win since taking two of three at Seattle, May 23-25...it snapped an eight-series losing streak, which was the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 3-16-1 over the last 20 series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on this 10-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1), New York-AL (0-3) and Seattle (four games)...it is their second of two 10-game road trips this year (April 9-17) and is part of a stretch from June 7-July 3 where they are scheduled play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 17-24 (.415) on the road compared to 8-28 (.222) at home...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Toronto (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...are batting .221 (304-for-1373) with 158 runs scored (3.9 per game) and 36 home runs in 41 games on the road compared to .198 with 86 runs (2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .203 (180-for-885) with 71 runs scored over the last 27 games dating back to May 30 (2.6 runs per game)...rank last in the majors in batting (.211), on-base percentage (.273), slugging percentage (.327) and OPS (.600)...have finished last in the majors in all four categories once in Athletics history (1943)...have the second fewest runs (244), home runs (51) and extra base hits (182)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 28 of 77 (36.4%) games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.28 ERA (214 er in 364.2 ip) over the last 42 games and have a 4.44 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.326) and OPS (.744) and third highest batting average (.252) and slugging percentage (.417)...have issued the third most walks (260), have the fourth fewest strikeouts (579) and are tied for the fourth most home runs (85).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-5 with a 4.97 ERA (28 er in 50.2 ip) over the last nine games and 4-24 with a 4.90 ERA (130 er in 239.0 ip) over the last 45 games dating back to May 12...are 15-38 with a 4.43 ERA for the season...the losses are second most in the majors (Nationals, 40)...have the third fewest wins in the American League, the fourth highest ERA and the fourth most innings pitched (404.2).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 3-7 with three saves, eight blown saves and a 6.34 ERA (70 er in 99.1 ip) over the last 31 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.46 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 16-for-29 (55.2%) in save opportunities...has the third lowest save percentage and third fewest saves...has the fifth lowest opponents batting average against first batters faced (.231).

ON THE BASES: The A's had their streak of six consecutive games with a stolen base end yesterday...that matched the A's longest such streak over the last 10 years (Aug. 18-23, 2021)...have been successful in 48-of-60 (80.0%) stolen base attempts overall, which is the third best percentage in the American League...rank fourth in steals...A's opponents are 27-for-41 (65.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the AL...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed...A's pitchers have six pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last nine games but have 50 for the season, which is third most in the American League...rank second in double plays (67).

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 46 players this year...Skye Bolt and Vimal Machin, who were added to the roster today, would become numbers 47 and 48...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...the current total of 46 players is fifth most in the American League (Mariners 50, Orioles 49, Angels 48, Twins 47)...have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year...21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have seven rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 21-11 (.656) when scoring first and 4-41 (.089) when the opponent scores first...have the lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 3-24/.111)...have eight come-from-behind wins, which is tied for third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 7)...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are the only team in the majors without an extra inning win...the two extra inning games are tied with the Tigers and Reds for the fewest in the majors.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 2-4 against the Mariners...won two of three in Seattle from May 23-25 but were swept in a three-game series in Oakland June 21-23...have lost 16 of the last 18 games...have dropped seven of the last nine in Seattle and have a nine-game home losing streak, which is the A's longest ever against the Mariners...lost the season series last year 15-4 and the 15 losses were the A's most against one team since they went 2-16 against Chicago in 1964...went 3-7 in Seattle and 1-8 in Oakland...the home record matched the A's worst against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)...have lost seven of the previous nine season series and are 68-100 (.405) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 372-324 against the Mariners...that includes 198-147 in Oakland, 173-174 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 97-110 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and tied for eighth in go-ahead RBI (13)...has hit safely in each of his last eight games and is 13-for-30 (.433) with four doubles, two home runs and five RBI during the streak...**Sean Murphy** ranks third among AL catchers in home runs (8) and RBI (28)...leads AL catchers in games started (56) and total chances (475).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1995** Mark McGwire hits a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning off California's Lee Smith to lift the A's to an 8-5 victory over the Angels...in **2001** Miguel Tejada has three home runs and eight RBI in the A's 15-4 win at Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Adrian Martínez (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas today for his second stint with the A's this year...was acquired from the San Diego Padres on April 3 with minor league infielder Euriel Angeles for pitcher Sean Manaea and minor league pitcher Aaron Holiday...began the year at Las Vegas and was 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA in five starts with the Aviators when he was recalled by Oakland on May 10 as the 27th man for the doubleheader at Detroit...made his Major League debut with a start that day in the second game and tossed 5.1 scoreless innings for the win...was returned to Las Vegas after the game and went 4-1 with a 4.84 ERA in eight starts with the Aviators following his return.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in his Major League debut, a 4-1 win at Detroit in the second game of a May 10 doubleheader...became the 54th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...was the 16th of those 54 to win, the first since Jharel Cotton on Sept. 7, 2016 at Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 5.1 scoreless innings to become the first of the 54 to not allow a run since Vin Mazzaro on June 2, 2009 at Chicago (AL)...allowed just four hits and did not walk a batter...of the 54, he joins Craig Minetto (July 4, 1978 at Seattle) as the only two to not issue a walk.

WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 4-3 with a 5.63 ERA in 13 starts with Las Vegas...was 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA in five starts when he was recalled by Oakland as the 27th man for the May 10 doubleheader at Detroit...was returned to the Aviators following the game and went 4-1 with a 4.84 ERA in eight starts...ranks eighth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts (73) and tied for eighth in games started (13)...has surrendered a career-high 13 home runs...allowed a .273 opponents batting average, which broke down to .258 (34-for-132) against right-handed hitters compared to .292 (33-for-113) against left-handers...has a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .208 after that...was 2-1 with a 4.06 ERA in six starts on the road, 2-2 with a 7.09 ERA in seven starts at home.

2022 LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed five runs in a season-low 2.1 innings in his first start on April 8 against Reno and was the losing pitcher in a 7-1 loss...tossed 46 pitches as he began building his pitch count (his next four starts were 59 pitches, 77, 85 and 92)...logged 4.0 innings in four consecutive starts from April 15 to 28...walked a season-high three batters April 21 against El Paso...allowed a season-high six runs in a 7-1 loss to Tacoma on April 28...finished April with a 0-2 record and an 8.79 ERA in four starts...then went 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA in four starts in May...had a season-high three-game winning streak from May 27 to June 8...had a 2.70 ERA and .214 opponents average during the streak...struck out a season-high eight batters in a season-high 7.0 innings in a 10-6 win over Sacramento on June 2...then tossed 7.0 scoreless innings, walked a season-high tying three and had a season-high 106 pitches in a 5-2 win over Round Rock on June 8...had his winning streak snapped on June 14 at El Paso when he allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in a 10-9 loss...went 1-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .348 opponents batting average over his final three starts with the Aviators

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision in the Aviators 19-6 loss to Albuquerque last Saturday in Las Vegas...allowed a career-high tying three home runs and a season-high tying three walks...yielded leadoff home runs to Wynton Bernard in the first and Bret Boswell in the second and a one-out solo home run to Sam Hilliard in the third...had a 5-3 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Coco Montes in the fifth...was relieved by Adam Kolarek with one out in the fifth and runners on first and third and Kolarek allowed one of the runners to score.

2021 RECAP: Split the season between Double-A San Antonio (AA) and Triple-A El Paso, setting career highs in starts (22), innings pitched (125.0), strikeouts (122) and opponents batting average (.243)...made 17 appearances (13 starts) for San Antonio, going 7-3 with a 2.34 ERA, 83 strikeouts, 24 walks and a .215 opponents batting average...earned Double-A Central Pitcher of the Month honors in July, going 4-0 with a 0.32 ERA and a .168 opponents average...was promoted to El Paso on Aug. 14 and made nine appearances (all starts)...reached the five inning mark in six of those outings, and allowed two earned runs-or-fewer 5 times...struck out a career-high-tying 10 batters with two walks across 6.0 innings in his penultimate start of the season on Sept. 25 vs. Sugar Land.

CAREER: The native of Mexico was originally signed by San Diego as an international free agent on Feb. 16, 2015 and pitched five seasons in the Padres farm system...missed the 2016 season after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery and did not pitch in 2020 due to the pandemic...is 25-21 with three saves and a 4.52 ERA (196 er in 390.2 ip) in 113 games, including 61 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 405 strikeouts in 390.2 innings (9.33 per nine innings) and has walked 123 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.29...allowed a .272 opponents batting average...was named an Organizational All-Star by MiLB.com in 2021.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (0-5, 5.88 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 6.62 ERA, .278 opponents batting average and .888 OPS over his last seven starts after going 0-2 with a 4.50 ERA, .197 opponents batting average and .697 OPS over his first four starts...has started the season 0-5, which is the longest losing streak of his career...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 0-5 since Kendall Graveman also lost each of his first five decisions in 2018...has tossed six innings or fewer in each of his last 22 starts dating back to July 10, 2021...that is the longest such streak by a starting pitcher in Athletics history...has a .172 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .313 after that...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-3 A's win at Kansas City last Sunday (5.1 ip, 2 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb 2 so)...is 1-1 with a 6.26 ERA (27.1 ip, 28 h, 19 r, 19 er, 9 bb, 25 so, 6 hr) in seven career appearances, including four starts, against Seattle...is 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA (10.1 ip, 12 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 10 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year.

- Has a 4.22 ERA (5 er in 10.2 ip) and .158 (6-for-38) opponents batting average in 11 games in June after compiling a 1.29 ERA and .146 opponents batting average in 13 games in May.
- Is tied for third in the American League in games pitched (34)...is tied for third among AL relievers in most home runs allowed (6).
- Has a .163 (13-for-80) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .273 (12-for-44) against left-handers.
- Opponents are 6-for-37 (.162) with runners in scoring position.
- Has faced the Mariners twice this year (1.0 ip, 1 bb, 1 so) and has not allowed a run in four career appearances against Seattle (5.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 4 so).

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

61 RHP ZACH JACKSON (2-2, 3.64)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 11/1 **First Hitters:** 5-23, 8 bb

- Has a 5.40 ERA (10.0 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 11 bb, 16 so) over his last 12 games after compiling a 2.75 ERA over his first 20 contests.
- Is tied for fifth in the American League in holds (13) and tied for seventh in games pitched (32)...ranks fourth among AL relievers in strikeouts (42) and eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.222).
- Has not allowed a home run and his 29.2 innings pitched are tied for fifth most among AL relievers with no home runs.
- Has a .182 opponents batting average but has issued 24 walks in 29.2 innings for a .344 on-base percentage...the walks are tied for the most among Major League relievers (Coleman, KC)...has walked the first batter faced eight times which is the most in the Majors.
- Has a loss in three appearances against Seattle (2.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 10.13 ERA).

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

60 LHP SAM MOLL (2-0, 2.45)

- Has allowed six earned runs in his last 16 games (12.0 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 6 er, 11 bb, 18 so, 4.50 ERA) after allowing no runs over his first 12 contests (10.0 ip).
- Has a .171 (7-for-41) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters, .244 (10-for-41) against right-handers...has issued 12 of his 16 walks to righties.
- Has allowed 8-of-13 (61.5%) inherited runners to score over his last 11 games after allowing 1-of-6 (16.7%) to score over his first 17 outings...has allowed 9-of-19 (47.4%) to score for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League.
- Has a win in two appearances against Seattle (2.1 ip, 1 h, 4 so).

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Reno in the Arizona farm system but had three stints with the A's following a July 2 trade and compiled a 3.48 ERA in eight appearances...had a 4.58 ERA and .231 opponents average in 33 games with Reno and Las Vegas.

29 RHP AUSTIN PRUITT (0-0, 5.14)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 7/3 **First Hitters:** 2-11

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas May 28 and has allowed one run or fewer in nine of his 11 appearances...yielded four runs in each of the other two outings.
- Has a .130 (3-for-23) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters, .324 (11-for-34) against right-handers...has yielded three of his four home runs and issued his only walk to a righty for a 1.049 OPS (.435 vs. lefties).
- Has faced the Mariners twice this year (1.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 so, 3 hr, 27.00 ERA)...including June 21 in Oakland when he allowed back-to-back-to-back home runs, the first time an A's pitcher has done so since Daniel Gossett in 2018...now has an 8.72 ERA (21 er in 21.2 ip) in six career appearances against the Mariners.
- Was 1-0 with a save, a 3.27 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 12 relief appearances with Las Vegas...walked just two and struck out 20 in 22.0 innings.
