OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-53) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (37-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four straight and eight of the last 10...are 5-23 (.179) dating back to May 30 and 10-33 (.233) since winning the day game of the May 14 doubleheader...are 25-53 (.321) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds (26-49, .347)...are 28 games under .500 for the first time since Sept. 29, 2015 when they were 65-93...have not been more than 28 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...have the second lowest winning percentage in Oakland history after 78 games to the 1979 club (22-56, lost game 79)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100-loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 24½ games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out...won back-to-back games last Saturday and Sunday at Kansas City for the first time since May 24-25 at Seattle.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's went 5-21 (.192) in June, which was the lowest winning percentage in the majors (Reds, 9-18/.333)...it was the second lowest winning percentage in a month of five or more games in Oakland history...the lowest is .172 (5-24) in June of 1979...it was the 14th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses and the 21 losses tied for third most...went 10-21 in May and have lost 21 or more games in consecutive months for the first time since 1954 when the Philadelphia A's went 7-23 in July and 9-23 in August...it is the third time in Oakland history the A's lost 20 or more games in consecutive months (Aug. and Sept. 1978, June and July 1979)...ranked last in the majors in on-base percentage (.263), slugging (.332), OPS (.595) and runs (75) and second to last in batting average (.210)...the on-base percentage was second lowest in Athletics history in a month of more than 15 games (.256 in Sept. 1908)...the OPS was third lowest in Oakland history (.572 in April 1968, .581 in April 1979)...the batting average when rounded to four decimals (.2102) was third lowest in Oakland history (.2099 in April 1979, .2101 in May 2012)...averaged 2.88 runs per game, which was third lowest in Oakland history (2.50 in Aug. 1978, 2.73 in Aug. 2008)...had a 5.25 ERA, which was the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.

SERIES NOTES: With the loss last night, the A's have now lost the first game of each of the last 12 series...that is one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (13, three times, last: April 11-May 20, 1994)...are 4-21 in the first game of a series and 11-13 in the final game...were swept by New York (AL) to start the week, which was the eighth time the A's were swept this year...won two of three at Kansas City last weekend for their first series win since taking two of three at Seattle, May 23-25...it snapped an eight-series losing streak, which was the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 3-16-1 over the previous 20 series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-5 on this 10-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1), New York-AL (0-3) and Seattle (0-1)...it is their second of two 10-game road trips this year (April 9-17) and is part of a stretch from June 7-July 3 where they are scheduled play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 17-25 (.405) on the road compared to 8-28 (.222) at home...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Toronto (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...are batting .223 (315-for-1410) with 164 runs scored (3.9 per game) and 39 home runs in 42 games on the road compared to .198 with 86 runs (2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .254 (54-for-213) with 29 runs over the last six games after hitting .190 with 18 runs scored over the previous 11 contests...rank last in the majors in batting (.212), on-base percentage (.274), slugging percentage (.330) and OPS (.604)...have finished last in the majors in all four categories once in Athletics history (1943)...have the second fewest runs (250), home runs (54) and extra base hits (185) and the third fewest walks (196)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 28 of 78 (35.9%) games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.34 ERA (221 er in 372.2 ip) over the last 43 games after posting a 3.44 ERA over the first 35 contests...have a 4.48 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.327), slugging percentage (.420) and OPS (.746) and third highest batting average (.253)...have issued the third most walks (262), have the fourth fewest strikeouts (586) and the fourth most home runs (87).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-6 with a 5.69 ERA (35 er in 55.1 ip) over the last 10 games and 4-25 with a 5.06 ERA (137 er in 243.2 ip) over the last 46 games dating back to May 12...are 15-39 with a 4.53 ERA for the season...the losses are second most in the majors (Nationals, 40)...have the third fewest wins in the American League, the fourth highest ERA and the fourth most innings pitched (409.1).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 3-7 with three saves, eight blown saves and a 6.14 ERA (70 er in 102.2 ip) over the last 32 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.40 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 16-for-29 (55.2%) in save opportunities...has the third lowest save percentage and third fewest saves...has allowed 14-of-18 (77.8%) inherited runners to score over the last nine games.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 48-of-60 (80.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...rank fourth in steals...A's opponents are 27-for-41 (65.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the AL...have allowed the third fewest stolen bases...A's pitchers have six pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last 10 games but have 51 for the season, which is third most in the American League...rank second in double plays (68).

PLAYER NOTES: Skye Bolt and Vimal Machin made their 2022 debuts yesterday and the A's have now used 48 players this year, which is tied for third most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year...21 of the 48 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have seven rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 21-11 (.656) when scoring first and 4-42 (.087) when the opponent scores first...have the lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 3-24/.111)...have eight come-from-behind wins, which is tied for third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 7)...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are the only team in the majors without an extra inning win...the two extra inning games are tied with the Tigers and Reds for the fewest in the majors.

A'S vs. MARINERS: The A's are 2-5 against the Mariners...are 2-2 in Seattle and 0-3 in Oakland...have lost 17 of the last 19 games...have dropped eight of the last 10 in Seattle and have a nine-game home losing streak, which is the A's longest ever against the Mariners...lost the season series last year 15-4 and the 15 losses were the A's most against one team since they went 2-16 against Chicago in 1964...went 3-7 in Seattle and 1-8 in Oakland...the home record matched the A's worst against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)...have lost seven of the previous nine season series and are 68-101 (.402) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 372-325 against the Mariners...that includes 198-147 in Oakland, 173-175 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 97-111 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and tied for eighth in go-ahead RBI (13)...**Ramón Laureano** had his fourth career regular season multi-homer game yesterday (also homered twice in Game 4 of the 2020 ALDS)...had homered just twice over his first 46 games...**Sean Murphy** ranks third among AL catchers in home runs (8) and RBI (28)...leads AL catchers in games started (57) and total chances (484).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1902** Rube Waddell becomes the first major league pitcher to strikeout the side on nine pitches...he turns the trick in the third inning of the A's 2-0 win over Baltimore, his first victory as an Athletic...in **1979** the A's collect a club record 29 hits in a 13-12, 15 inning win at Texas...Jim Essian has five hits and Rickey Henderson, Mike Heath and Mike Edwards add four each...Texas starter Jon Matlack allows 12 hits in 5 1/3 and losing pitcher Doc Medich allows 12 hits in 8 1/3 innings of relief...in **2007** Dan Haren extends his winning streak to 10 games in the A's 11-5 win at New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (0-5, 5.88 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-3 with a 6.62 ERA (25 er in 34.0 ip), .278 (37-for-133) opponents batting average and .888 OPS over his last seven starts after going 0-2 with a 4.50 ERA, .197 opponents batting average and .697 OPS over his first four starts...has started the season 0-5, which is the longest losing streak of his career...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 0-5 since Kendall Graveman also lost each of his first five decisions in 2018...the last A's pitcher to lose more than his first five decisions in a season is Mike Mohler, who went 0-8 to start the 1997 season...began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint and was reinstated on May 1.

SIX INNINGS OR FEWER: Has tossed six innings or fewer in each of his last 22 starts dating back to July 10, 2021...that is the longest such streak by a starting pitcher in Athletics history (previous: 19 by Frankie Montas and Vin Mazzaro)...his longest outing this year is 5.2 innings and he last tossed more than six innings on July 4, 2021 when he logged 7.0 innings against Boston...has tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 32 career starts, which is tied for the sixth longest such streak in Athletics history.

IN A PINCH: Pinch ran in the ninth inning on Tuesday at New York (AL) to become the first A's pitcher to pinch run since Tim Hudson did it on June 23, 2001 against Texas...Hudson pinch ran in the 10th inning and scored the winning run on an Eric Chavez walk-off single...Gene Nelson's status as the last A's pitcher to steal a base (July 3, 1988 at Toronto) remains intact.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held right-handed hitters to a .227 (22-for-97) batting average and .732 OPS...left-handers are batting .275 (28-for-102) with a .912 OPS...his career marks are .207 with a .639 OPS against righties, .271 with an .892 OPS against lefties...has issued 14 of his 25 walks this year and 45 of 68 in his career to lefties.

THROUGH THE ORDER: Has a .172 (15-for-87) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .313 (35-for-112) with eight of his 11 home runs allowed after that...his career numbers and are .183 the first time through the order, .275 with 25 of his 32 home runs after that

...AND INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.05 ERA (5 er in 22.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 8.70 ERA (29 er in 30.0 ip) from the third inning on...now has a 1.97 career ERA (14 er in 64.0 ip) in innings one and two and a 6.24 ERA (77 er in 111.0) from the third inning on.

THIS AND THAT: His 5.88 ERA is second highest in the American League among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched (Zimmermann, BAL 5.94)...snapped his streak of seven consecutive starts with a home run in his last start...has allowed 11 home runs in 52.0 innings for the season (1.90 per nine innings)...nine of the 11 home runs have been solo shots...opponents are 9-for-45 (.200) with runners in scoring position...has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save...last year, he left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's have won five of his six no decisions this year and are 5-6 (.455) in his starting assignments...are 16-16 (.500) in his starting assignments in his career.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Did not pitch during the spring and began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint...was sent to Low-A Stockton on April 15 to begin a rehab assignment and picked up the win in a 14-10 Ports win that day against Modesto (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so, 2 hr)...was moved up to Triple-A Las Vegas and had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma (4.0 ip, 3 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...was 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) in three starts overall when he reinstated from the IL on May 1...took the loss in each of his first two starts...logged 2.0 innings and walked four batters in his first start, a 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...it was the shortest start of his career...then lost a 1-0 decision at Minnesota on May 7, allowing a Polanco home run in the sixth for the only run of the game...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings and struck out a season-high seven batters while logging a season-high 99 pitches...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...left his start on May 12 at Detroit with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save in a game the A's would come back to win 5-3...it was the first of three times the pen blew the save in one of his starts (June 9 at Cleveland, June 26 at Kansas City)...allowed five runs on a season-high seven hits in 5.0 innings on May 24 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win...walked a career-high six batters, allowed a career-high tying six runs and a season-high tying seven hits in 3.2 innings in a 10-1 loss at Boston on June 15...struck out a season-high tying seven batters in 5.1 innings in an 8-2 loss to Seattle on June 21.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win at Kansas City last Sunday...blanked the Royals on a hit and two walks over the first five innings and took a 2-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a lead off triple to Lopez in the sixth inning and after retiring the next batter, walked two to load the bases...was

relieved by Moll who allowed all three runners to score for the blown save...the A's came back with two in the seventh and one in the ninth for the win.

in Seattle...is 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA (10.1 ip, 12 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 10 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year...the no decision came in a 7-5 A's win at Seattle on May 24...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run double to France in the third inning...had a 4-2 lead when he yielded three runs in the fifth inning on a France ground out and a Rodriguez two-run home run...Oakland tied the game with a run in the sixth and he was relieved by Moll to start the bottom of the sixth...then took the loss in an 8-2 decision in Oakland on June 21...allowed just one run over his first five innings on a lead off home run to Trammell in the fifth...then surrendered a RBI double to Winker in the sixth and left trailing 2-0...the pen then allowed five runs in the seventh.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27...his opponents batting average broke down to .201 (46-for-229) with a .602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances.

RHP Paul Blackburn (6-3, 3.12 ERA): Is 1-3 with a 5.18 ERA and .285 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA and .211 opponents average over his first nine starts...is tied for 10th in the American League in wins (6) and winning percentage (.667)...is 5-0 with a 1.44 ERA in nine starts on the road...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for second in road wins...has seen his ERA and OPS increased in each month of the season...went 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA and .459 OPS in four starts in April, 2-1 with a 2.62 ERA and .669 OPS in six starts in May and 1-2 with a 5.13 ERA and .872 OPS in five starts in June...had a no decision in his last start, a 9-5 A's loss at New York on Monday (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 7 so, 2 hr)...is 2-3 with a 6.21 ERA (29.0 ip, 35 h, 21 r, 20 er, 11 bb, 18 so, 4 hr) in six career appearances, all starts, against Seattle...is 1-1 with a 6.75 ERA (9.1 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 6 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year.
