## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-54) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (38-42)

SUNDAY, JULY 3, 2022 — T-MOBILE PARK — 1:10 PT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost five of their last six games and have lost nine of the last 12...are 6-24 (.200) dating back to May 30 and 11-34 (.245) since winning the day game of the May 14 doubleheader...are 26-54 (.325) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds (26-51, .338)...are 28 games under .500...have not been more than 28 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...have the second lowest winning percentage in Oakland history after 80 games to the 1979 club (23-57, lost game 81)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100-loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by 25½ games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out...won back-to-back games last Saturday and Sunday at Kansas City for the first time since May 24-25 at Seattle.

**A'S IN JUNE:** The A's went 5-21 (.192) in June, which was the lowest winning percentage in the majors (Reds, 9-18/.333)...it was the second lowest winning percentage in a month of five or more games in Oakland history...the lowest is .172 (5-24) in June of 1979...it was the 14th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses and the 21 losses tied for third most...went 10-21 in May and have lost 21 or more games in consecutive months for the first time since 1954 when the Philadelphia A's went 7-23 in July and 9-23 in August...it is the third time in Oakland history the A's lost 20 or more games in consecutive months (Aug. and Sept. 1978, June and July 1979)...ranked last in the majors in on-base percentage (.263), slugging (.332), OPS (.595) and runs (75) and second to last in batting average (.210)...the on-base percentage was second lowest in Athletics history in a month of more than 15 games (.256 in Sept. 1908)...the OPS was third lowest in Oakland history (.572 in April 1968, .581 in April 1979)...the batting average when rounded to four decimals (.2102) was third lowest in Oakland history (.2099 in April 1979, .2101 in May 2012)...averaged 2.88 runs per game, which was third lowest in Oakland history (2.50 in Aug. 1978, 2.73 in Aug. 2008)...had a 5.25 ERA, which was the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.

**SERIES NOTES:** With the loss Thursday night, the A's have now lost the first game of each of the last 12 series...that is one shy of the longest such streak in Oakland history (13, three times, last: April 11-May 20, 1994)...are 4-21 in the first game of a series and 11-13 in the final game...were swept by New York (AL) to start the week, which was the eighth time the A's were swept this year...won two of three at Kansas City last weekend for their first series win since taking two of three at Seattle, May 23-25...it snapped an eight-series losing streak, which was the A's longest such streak since July 11-Aug. 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 3-16-1 over the previous 20 series.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-6 on this 10-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1), New York-AL (0-3) and Seattle (1-2)...it is their second of two 10-game road trips this year (April 9-17) and is part of a stretch from June 7-July 3 where they are scheduled play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 18-26 (.409) on the road compared to 8-28 (.222) at home...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Toronto (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...are batting .224 (331-for-1477) with 168 runs scored (3.8 per game) and 40 home runs in 44 games on the road compared to .198 with 86 runs (2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .250 (70-for-280) with 33 runs over the last eight games after hitting .190 with 18 runs scored over the previous 11 contests...rank last in the majors in batting (.213), on-base percentage (.274), slugging percentage (.330) and OPS (.604)...have finished last in the majors in all four categories once in Athletics history (1943)...have the second fewest runs (254), home runs (55) and extra base hits (189) and the third fewest walks (199)...have been shut out nine times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 29 of 80 (36.3%) games.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.17 ERA (224 er in 389.2 ip) over the last 45 games after posting a 3.44 ERA over the first 35 contests...have a 4.41 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the third highest opponents slugging percentage (.417), second highest on-base percentage (.325) and OPS (.743) and fourth highest batting average (.251)...have issued the third most walks (269), have the fourth fewest strikeouts (601) and are tied for the sixth most home runs (88).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 1-6 with a 4.79 ERA (36 er in 67.2 ip) over the last 12 games and 5-25 with a 4.85 ERA (138 er in 256.0 ip) over the last 48 games dating back to May 12...are 16-39 with a 4.42 ERA for the season...the losses are third most in the majors (Nationals, 42)...have the third fewest wins in the American League, the fourth highest ERA and the fourth most innings pitched (421.2).

**THE BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen is 3-8 with four saves, nine blown saves and a 6.04 ERA (72 er in 107.1 ip) over the last 34 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.39 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 17-for-31 (54.8%) in save opportunities...has the third lowest save percentage and is tied for the third fewest saves...has allowed 14-of-20 (70.0%) inherited runners to score over the last 11 games.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have been successful in 49-of-62 (79.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth best percentage in the American League...are tied for fourth in steals...A's opponents are 28-for-42 (66.7%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the AL...have allowed the third fewest stolen bases...A's pitchers have six pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL, and lead the majors in pitcher pickoff attempts (380).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed six errors in the last 12 games and have 53 for the season, which is tied for most in the American League...rank second in double plays (70).

**PLAYER NOTES:** Skye Bolt and Vimal Machin made their 2022 debuts on Thursday and the A's have now used 48 players this year, which is tied for third most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year...21 of the 48 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have seven rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 22-12 (.647) when scoring first and 4-42 (.087) when the opponent scores first...have the lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first (Royals, 6-38/.136)...have eight come-from-behind wins, which is tied for fewest in the majors...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are the only team in the majors without an extra inning win...the two extra inning games are tied with the Tigers and Reds for the fewest in the majors.

**A'S vs. MARINERS:** The A's are 3-6 against the Mariners...are 3-3 in Seattle and 0-3 in Oakland...have lost 18 of the last 21 games...have dropped nine of the last 12 in Seattle...lost the season series last year 15-4 and the 15 losses were the A's most against one team since they went 2-16 against Chicago in 1964...went 3-7 in Seattle and 1-8 in Oakland...the home record matched the A's worst against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)...have lost seven of the previous nine season series and are 69-102 (.404) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 373-326 against the Mariners...that includes 198-147 in Oakland, 174-176 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 98-112 at T-Mobile Park.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Sean Murphy** is 23-for-77 (.299) with four home runs and 11 RBI over his last 21 games and is tied for 15th in the American League in doubles (76)...**Frankie Montas** is tied for the AL lead in games started (16), ranks seventh in strikeouts (99)...**Nick Allen** is 11-for-37 (.297) with a home run and five RBI in 11 starts since being recalled on June 21...**Zach Jackson** is tied for second in the American League in holds (14) and tied for fourth among AL relievers in strikeouts (43)...ranks third in opponents slugging percentage (.214).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1983 Carney Lansford hits the 7000th home run in the history of the A's franchise, but the A's lose to Texas 16-4 when the Rangers score 12 times in the top of the 15th inning...in 1988 Jose Canseco hits three home runs but it's Mark McGwire's 16th inning solo home run that lifts the A's to a 9-8 victory at Toronto...the following day, McGwire again homers in the 16th inning of the A's 4-2 win at Cleveland...in 1994 Bobby Witt ties Mike Torrez' club record with his third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 10-0 win at Boston.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (3-8, 3.20 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Has a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) over his last three starts but the A's have scored just one run in each of the starts and he has two losses and a no decision...Oakland has scored one run or fewer nine times in his 16 starts, including three shutouts...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his starts and has just one win in those starts...has allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and two earned runs or fewer 11 times...is now 1-7 with a 3.09 ERA (27 er in 78.2 ip) over his last 13 starts after going 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA over his first three starts...the A's have lost in all five of his no decisions and are 3-13 (.188) in his starting assignments

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received one run of support or fewer in each of his last three starts and 10 of his last 11...overall, has no runs of support five times and one run seven times...has support of four runs or more in his other four starts (4,5,6,7)...has 29 runs of support in his 16 starts this year (95.2 ip, 2.73 RSA).

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for the American League lead in games started (16), ranks fifth in innings pitched (95.2), seventh in strikeouts (99), sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.272) and eighth in slugging percentage (.350) and OPS (.623)...has eight losses, which is tied for third most and is one short of his career high of nine from last year.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 0-3 despite a 1.70 ERA (7 er in 37.0 ip) and .169 (22-for-130) opponents batting average in six starts against American League West teams...is 3-5 with a 4.14 ERA (27 er in 58.2 ip) and .254 (57-for-224) opponents average in 10 starts against all other teams.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 2-3 with a 3.07 ERA (15 er in 44.0 ip) in eight starts at night compared to 1-5 with a 3.31 ERA (19 er in 51.2 ip) in eight starts during the day...is tied for the Major League lead in losses in day games...now has a career record of 21-15 at night and 13-16 during the day.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-5 despite a 2.38 ERA (17 er in 64.1 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 2-3 with a 4.88 ERA (17 er in 31.1 ip) in six starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead in losses at home but has the 12th lowest home ERA...in six seasons with the A's, he is 17-16 with a 3.31 ERA (105 er in 285.2 ip) in 58 games at home, 17-13 with a 4.19 ERA (113 er in 243.0 ip) in 53 games on the road.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-5 with a 1.84 ERA (12 er in 58.2 ip) and .189 (40-for-212) opponents batting average in nine starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 4.78 ERA (17 er in 32.0 ip) and .273 (33-for-121) opponents average in five starts on five days rest...in his career, he is 13-14 with a 2.65 ERA (64 er in 217.1 ip) in 36 starts on four days rest, 18-13 with a 4.08 ERA (114 er in 251.1 ip) in 45 starts on five days rest or more.

**STRIKEOUTS:** Struck out 11 batters on May 26 against Texas after fanning 12 batters on May 15 against Los Angeles (AL)...now has nine career 10-strikeout games, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...has one game with 13 strikeouts, one with 12 and two with 11...had 207 strikeouts last year, which ranked fourth in the AL and was the second highest single-season total in Oakland history.

**2022 HIGHLIGHTS:** Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss...his other Opening Day start came in 2020 and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 11 so) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore...was 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA over his first three starts through April 18...then had a career-high five-game losing streak from April 23 to June 5 (previous: 3, two times, last: May 19-29, 2021)...compiled a 2.87 ERA and .214 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...logged 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning...retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...it was the first of three times the A's were shut out in one of his starts (May 4 vs. Tampa Bay, May 10 at Detroit)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Cleveland in Oakland on April 29...struck out Frammil Reyes to end the fifth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high four batters, allowed a season-high two home runs and matched his highs in runs (5)...left with a 6-5 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in one of his

starts (June 23 vs. Seattle)...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a .194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average...then went 0-3 despite a 2.31 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in six starts in May...threw a season-high 105 pitches in a 6-0 loss at Detroit in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader...struck out a season-high 12 batters in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 15 in Oakland...had a no decision in his next start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) after leaving the game with two outs in the second inning after being hit in the hand by a Rengifo line drive...the 1.2 innings pitched matched the shortest start of his career (Aug. 18, 2020 at Arizona)...struck out 11 in 7.0 innings on May 26 against Texas, his ninth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...went over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...snapped his career-high five game losing streak in the A's 10-5 win at Cleveland on June 11, despite allowing a season-high tying five runs in 6.0 innings...allowed a season-high tying five runs on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in a 5-1 loss to Kansas City on June 17...tossed a season-high 8.0 innings and did not allow a run on June 23 against Seattle but had a no decision in a 2-1 loss...had a no-hitter until Frazier singled with two outs in the eighth.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at New York (AL) on Tuesday...logged a season-high tying 105 pitches in 6.0 innings...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings on a Trevino RBI single and a Gonzalez solo home run...retired 13 of the final 14 batters he faced but the A's were shut out on four hits and three walks over the first eight innings before scoring once in the ninth.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Cole Irvin (2-6, 3.58 ERA):** Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list May 22 and is 0-5 with a 3.97 ERA in eight starts since his return...the five-game losing streak is a career high...is 0-5 with a 3.69 ERA (22 er in 53.2 ip) over his last nine starts, all A's losses...is the third pitcher in Oakland history to appear in nine consecutive team losses, with all nine appearances being starts (Montas, April 23-June 5, 2022; Morgan, June 11, 1978-July 24, 1979)...is 1-1 with a 1.57 ERA in six starts at home compared to 1-5 with a 5.27 ERA in seven starts on the road...has allowed all 11 of his home runs on the road...his home ERA is third lowest among American League pitchers with 30 or more innings at home...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's loss at New York (AL) on Wednesday (7.0 ip, 6 h, 5 er, 5 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 1-1 with a 6.97 ERA (10.1 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 8 er, 1 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against Toronto, both last year.
