OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-55) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (44-37)

TUESDAY, JULY 5, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PT

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 2-2 over the last four games but have lost 10 of the last 14...are 7-25 (.219) dating back to May 30 and 12-35 (.255) since winning the day game of the May 14 doubleheader...are 27-55 (.329) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds (27-52, .342)...are 28 games under .500 which is one short of the season high of 29 (26-55 on July 3)...have the second lowest winning percentage in Oakland history after 82 games to the 1979 club (23-59, lost game 83)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100-loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 26½ games for the second consecutive day, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since Sept. 7, 2017 when they were 27 games back...have been more than 27 games out of first just once over the last 43 years and that was on Sept. 30, 2016 when they were 28 back.

SERIES NOTES: Last night, the A's won the first game of a series for the first time since May 20 at Los Angeles (AL)...it snapped a streak of 12 consecutive losses in the first game of a series, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (13: April 11-May 20, 1994; Aug. 23, 1982-April 4, 1993; June 26-Aug. 6, 1979)...are 5-21 in the first game of a series and 11-14 in the final game...have lost 10 of the previous 11 series and are 3-17-1 over the previous 21 series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Toronto (1-0) and Houston (three games)...have not won back-to-back home games since winning the first two home games of the season on April 18 and 19 against Baltimore...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...won three of four from Baltimore in the first home series of the season but have lost each of the 10 home series since then...it is the first time the A's have lost 10 or more consecutive home series since June 20, 1916 to May 8, 1917 when they lost 17 straight (final 14 of 1916, first three of 1917)...are 9-28 (.243) at home compared to 18-27 (.400) on the road...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors behind the Nationals (14-31, .311)...the lowest home winning percentage in Oakland history is .383 in 1979 (31-50)...went 3-7 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1), New York-AL (0-3) and Seattle (1-3) to conclude a stretch where they played 19 of 25 games on the road...are batting .199 (233-for-1170) with 91 runs (2.5 per game) and 17 home runs in 37 home games compared to .222 with 169 runs scored (3.8 per game) and 41 home runs in 45 games on the road...rank last in the majors in batting, runs and home runs at home.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .239 (81-for-339) with 39 runs scored over the last 10 games after hitting .186 with 15 runs scored over the previous 10 contests...rank last in the majors in batting (.212), on-base percentage (.274), slugging percentage (.330) and OPS (.604)...the lowest batting average by an American League or National League team since 1900 is .211 by the 1910 Chicago White Sox...the lowest on-base percentage by an AL team is .274 by the 1905 Washington Senators...have the second fewest runs (260), home runs (58) and extra base hits (193) in the majors and the third fewest walks (203)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 30 of 82 (36.5%) games.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has not walked a batter in the last two games, which marks the second time over the last five years they have not issued a free pass in back-to-back games (Aug. 4-6, 2021)...however, have 269 walks for the season, which is third most in the American League...has allowed six runs over the first four games of July (6 er in 34.0 ip, 1.59 ERA)...however, has compiled a 5.02 ERA (227 er in 406.2 ip) over the last 47 games after posting a 3.44 ERA over the first 35 contests...has a 4.34 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (Royals, 4.92)...has the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.323) and OPS (.737) and the fourth highest batting average (.250) and slugging percentage (.414)...has the fourth fewest strikeouts (615).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in each of the last four games and are 2-1 with a 1.27 ERA (3 er in 21.1 ip) over that span...however, are 6-26 with a 4.75 ERA (140 er in 265.0 ip) over the last 50 games dating back to May 12...are 17-40 with a 4.37 ERA for the season...have the most losses in the American League, are tied for the third fewest wins and have the fifth highest ERA...also rank fifth in innings pitched (430.2).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 1.42 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) over the last seven games but is 3-9 with four saves, nine blown saves and a 5.70 ERA (73 er in 115.1 ip) over the last 34 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.30 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 4.72)...is 17-for-31 (54.8%) in save opportunities, which is the fourth lowest

save percentage...is tied with the Mariners, Rangers and Royals for the fewest saves...has allowed 14-of-22 (63.6%) inherited runners to score over the last 12 games.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 51-of-65 (78.5%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the third best percentage in the American League...are also tied for third in steals...A's opponents are 28-for-43 (65.1%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the AL...have allowed the third fewest stolen bases...A's pitchers have six pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last 14 games but have 53 for the season, which is tied with the White Sox for second most in the American League (Orioles, 54)...rank second with 72 double plays (Orioles, 73).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of their last four one-run decisions and are 5-15 (.250) for the season, which is the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (Rangers 4-15/.211)...are tied with the Rangers and Orioles for the most one-run losses...are 17-26 (.395) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the losses are tied with the Pirates for the most in the majors, the winning percentage is third lowest and the 43 games are tied for fourth most...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are the only team in the majors without an extra inning win...are tied with the Reds and Tigers for the fewest extra inning games.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 48 players, which is fourth most in the American League and two short of the season total from last year...have used 27 pitchers, which is tied for fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year...21 of the 48 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have seven rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have played three hours or fewer in each of the last six games and are averaging 3 hours and 1 minutes per game for the season, which is second quickest in the majors (Tigers, 2:57)...are 23-12 (.657) when scoring first and 4-43 (.085) when the opponent scores first...have the lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first...have eight come-from-behind wins, which is tied with the Cubs and Royals for the fewest in the majors...went 5-21 (.192) in June, which was the second lowest winning percentage in a month of five or more games in Oakland history (5-24/.172 in June of 1979)...it was the 14th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses and the 21 losses tied for third most...went 10-21 in May and have lost 21 or more games in consecutive months for the first time since 1954 when the Philadelphia A's went 7-23 in July and 9-23 in August.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The season series is even at two games each...won the first game in Oakland last night after losing two of three in Toronto in April...lost the season series last year, 2-5...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Toronto...have lost 13 of the last 17 games and are 17-26 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015...have won just one season series over that span (7-0 in 2018)...have lost eight of the last nine games at Rogers Centre and are 6-20 in Toronto dating back to 2014...are 228-208 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 115-102 in Oakland, 113-104 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 72-72 in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fifth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7)...is tied for the AL lead in game winning RBI (10) and tied for ninth in go-ahead RBI (13)...**Zach Jackson** is tied for third among AL relievers in holds (14), ranks sixth in strikeouts (43) and seventh in opponents slugging percentage (.244).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1989** Mark McGwire connects off Charlie Leibrandt for his 100th career homer, a three-run shot in the third inning of the A's 12-9, 11-inning loss to Kansas City...in **1993** Rickey Henderson becomes just the second player in Major League history to lead off both games of a doubleheader with a homer...Boston's Harry Hooper was the first on May 30, 1913 vs. Washington...prior to the game, Rollie Fingers has his number 34 retired...in **1994** Rickey Henderson becomes Oakland's all-time leader in games played when he plays in his 1411th game as an Athletic...in **1996** the A's set an Oakland record and tie a franchise record by scoring 13 runs in the first inning of a 16-8 win over California...Matt Stairs tied a ML record by driving in six runs in the inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Adrian Martínez (1-1, 6.30 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas last Thursday for his second stint with the A's this year and took the loss that night at Seattle...was recalled for the first time on May 10 as the 27th man for the doubleheader at Detroit...made his Major League debut with a start that day in the second game and tossed 5.1 scoreless innings for the win...was returned to Las Vegas after the game...was acquired from the San Diego Padres on April 3 with minor league infielder Euribiel Angeles for pitcher Sean Manaia and minor league pitcher Aaron Holiday.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in his Major League debut, a 4-1 win at Detroit in the second game of a May 10 doubleheader...became the 54th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...was the 16th of those 54 to win, the first since Jharel Cotton on Sept. 7, 2016 at Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 5.1 scoreless innings to become the first of the 54 to not allow a run since Vin Mazzaro on June 2, 2009 at Chicago (AL)...allowed just four hits and did not walk a batter...of the 54, he joins Craig Minetto (July 4, 1978 at Seattle) as the only two to not issue a walk.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-6 loss at Seattle last Thursday...allowed a Toro sacrifice fly in the first but the A's tied the game with a run in the third...allowed a leadoff home run to Rodriguez in the bottom of the third and a two-run home run to Moore in the fourth but the A's tied the game with a three-run fifth...also yielded a RBI single to Toro in the fifth and was relieved by Puk with two outs and runners on first and second with the A's trailing 5-4...Puk allowed both runs to score plus one of his own.

WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 4-3 with a 5.63 ERA in 13 starts with Las Vegas...was 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA in five starts when he was recalled by Oakland as the 27th man for the May 10 doubleheader at Detroit...was returned to the Aviators following the game and went 4-1 with a 4.84 ERA in eight starts...ranked eighth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts (73) and tied for eighth in games started (13) at the time of his promotion...has surrendered a career-high 13 home runs...allowed a .273 opponents batting average, which broke down to .258 (34-for-132) against right-handed hitters compared to .292 (33-for-113) against left-handers...has a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .208 after that...was 2-1 with a 4.06 ERA in six starts on the road, 2-2 with a 7.09 ERA in seven starts at home.

2022 LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed five runs in a season-low 2.1 innings in his first start on April 8 against Reno and was the losing pitcher in a 7-1 loss...tossed 46 pitches as he began building his pitch count (his next four starts were 59 pitches, 77, 85 and 92)...logged 4.0 innings in four consecutive starts from April 15 to 28...walked a season-high three batters April 21 against El Paso...allowed a season-high six runs in a 7-1 loss to Tacoma on April 28...finished April with a 0-2 record and an 8.79 ERA in four starts...then went 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA in four starts in May...had a season-high three-game winning streak from May 27 to June 8...had a 2.70 ERA and .214 opponents average during the streak...struck out a season-high eight batters in a season-high 7.0 innings in a 10-6 win over Sacramento on June 2...then tossed 7.0 scoreless innings, walked a season-high tying three and had a season-high 106 pitches in a 5-2 win over Round Rock on June 8...had his winning streak snapped on June 14 at El Paso when he allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in a 10-9 loss...allowed a career-high tying three home runs and a season-high tying three walks June 25 against Albuquerque but had a no decision in a 19-6 loss...went 1-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .348 opponents batting average over his final three starts with the Aviators.

2021 RECAP: Split the season between Double-A San Antonio (AA) and Triple-A El Paso, setting career highs in starts (22), innings pitched (125.0), strikeouts (122) and opponents batting average (.243)...made 17 appearances (13 starts) for San Antonio, going 7-3 with a 2.34 ERA, 83 strikeouts, 24 walks and a .215 opponents batting average...earned Double-A Central Pitcher of the Month honors in July, going 4-0 with a 0.32 ERA and a .168 opponents average...was promoted to El Paso on Aug. 14 and made nine appearances (all starts)...reached the five inning mark in six of those outings, and allowed two earned runs-or-fewer 5 times...struck out a career-high-tying 10 batters with two walks across 6.0 innings in his penultimate start of the season on Sept. 25 vs. Sugar Land.

CAREER: The native of Mexico was originally signed by San Diego as an international free agent on Feb. 16, 2015 and pitched five seasons in the Padres farm system...missed the 2016 season after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery and did not pitch in 2020 due to the pandemic...is 25-21 with three saves and a 4.52 ERA (196 er in 390.2 ip) in 113 games, including 61 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 405 strikeouts in 390.2 innings (9.33 per nine innings) and has walked 123 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.29...allowed a .272 opponents batting average...was named an Organizational All-Star by MiLB.com in 2021.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (1-5, 5.43 ERA): Is 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA, .172 opponents batting average and .628 OPS over his last three starts...was 0-2 with a 4.50 ERA, .197 opponents average and .697 OPS over his first four starts and 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA, .313 opponents average and .963 OPS in five starts in between...has tossed six innings or fewer in each of his last 23 starts dating back to July 10, 2021...that is the longest such streak by a starting pitcher in Athletics history...has a .158 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .304 with eight of his 11 home runs allowed after that...has a 1.88 ERA over the first two innings of a game, a 6.75 ERA) from the third inning on...he picked up his first win of the season. in his last start, a 3-1 A's win at Seattle last Friday (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...the win snapped a career-high five-game losing streak...has never faced the Blue Jays in his career.

- Had a 4.22 ERA and .158 opponents batting average in 11 games in June after compiling a 1.29 ERA and .146 opponents batting average in 13 games in May.
- Is tied for second in the American League in games pitched (36)...is tied for fourth among AL relievers in most home runs allowed (6).
- Has a .163 (13-for-80) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .286 (14-for-49) against left-handers.
- Opponents are 7-for-39 (.179) with runners in scoring position.
- Has faced the Blue Jays once this season, allowing three runs on five hits and two home runs in 0.2 innings of work on April 16.

- Has a 4.38 ERA (12.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 12 bb, 17 so) over his last 14 games after compiling a 2.75 ERA over his first 20 contests.
- Is tied for third in the American League in holds (14) and tied for 8th in games pitched (34)...ranks sixth among AL relievers in strikeouts (43) and ranks seventh in opponents slugging percentage (.224).
- Has not allowed a home run and his 32.0 innings pitched are fourth most among AL relievers with no home runs.
- Has a .178 opponents batting average but has issued 25 walks in 32.0 innings for a .336 on-base percentage...the walks are the most among Major League relievers...has walked the first batter faced nine times which is the most in the Majors.
- Has faced the Blue Jays three times this year, allowing one run with three hits and two walks in 1.2 innings of work.

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

- Has allowed six earned runs in his last 17 games (12.2 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 6 er, 11 bb, 19 so, 4.26 ERA) after allowing no runs over his first 12 contests (10.0 ip).
- Has a .167 (7-for-42) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters, .244 (10-for-41) against right-handers...has issued 12 of his 16 walks to righties.
- Has allowed 8-of-14 (57.1%) inherited runners to score over his last 12 games after allowing 1-of-6 (16.7%) to score over his first 17 outings...has allowed 9-of-20 (45.0%) to score for the season.
- Has faced the Blue Jays twice this season, allowing one hit and two walks with one strikeout in 2.0 scoreless innings of work.

- Threw a season-long 4.1 innings pitched...threw 3.0 innings on May 28 vs. Texas...the last time he threw 4.1 or more innings was on Sept. 5, 2019 when he made a start for Tampa against Toronto.
- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas May 28 and has allowed one run or fewer in 10 of his 12 appearances...yielded four runs in each of the other two outings.
- Has a .097 (3-for-31) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters, .317 (13-for-41) against right-handers...has yielded three of his four home runs and issued his only walk to a righty for a .992 OPS (.323 vs. lefties).
- Last faced the Blue Jays on Sept. 5, 2019 when he allowed just one earned run in 5.0 innings pitched as the starter.
- Was 1-0 with a save, a 3.27 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 12 relief appearances with Las Vegas...walked just two and struck out 20 in 22.0 innings.
