LEADING OFF: 2020 represents the Angels' 60th MLB season...Today marks the 9,432nd regular season game in team history...LAA holds an all-time record of 4,709-4,719-3 (.499)...On Opening Day, Halos are 30-29 overall, 18-16 at home and 12-13 on the road all-time...Angels have dropped each of last six season openers (2014-19) after winning each of five previous Opening Day games (2009-13)...The six-game season opening skid is longest in team annals; last MLB streak longer than six games was eight game stretch by Twins (2009-16)...A complete listing of the Club's Opening Day results and lineups can be found on page 339 of the 2020 Angels Media Guide (angelsmediaguide.com).

A TRADITION UNLIKE ANY OTHER: Today marks the fourth straight and eighth overall Opening Day meeting with Oakland (LAA is 2-5); second-most openers vs. one opponent; Halos have opened a club record 11 times vs. Seattle...**Angels become first team all-time to play four consecutive Opening Day games in the same road ballpark** (STATS LLC)...Angels are 12-13 all-time opening on the road and 0-4 when opening in Oakland (1982, 2017-19).

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: Today's game marks the latest Opening Day game in Angels history...The previous mark was set when the 1995 season got underway on April 26...Last year, the Angels played their earliest Opening Day game (March 28 at Oakland).

SHORTENED SEASON: 2020 represents the fifth officially shortened season in Angels history and the 10th season playing fewer than 162 games...The four previous officially shortened seasons were due to player strikes:

1972 – 155 games

1981 – 110 games

1994 – 115 games

1995 – 145 games

The Angels had an additional five seasons where postponed games were not made up: Halos played 161 games four times (1963, 1967, 1975, 1996) and 160 games in 1980.

JOE'S BACK: After spending the first 30 seasons of his professional baseball career as a member of the Angels organization, Joe Maddon returns as the new Angels manager for the 2020 season...He owns a 1252-1068 (.540) career managerial record during his time with the Rays (2006-14), Cubs (2015-19) and interim managerial stints with the Angels in 1996 (8-14) and 1999 (19-10).

STRAIGHT A'S: Mike Trout owns a career .301 (157/521) average against Oakland with 34 home runs and 83 RBI (140 G)...His 34 HR vs. A's rank second among all active players behind only **Nelson Cruz** (35)...In his 22 career games vs. Oakland as a hitter, **Shohei Ohtani** owns a .310 average (26/84) with six home runs and 19 RBI.

ANTHONY THE ANGEL: On Dec. 13, 2019, the Angels signed **Anthony Rendon** to a seven-year contract...In 2019, he finished third in National League Most Valuable Player voting and was named to his first All-Star team, in addition to earning his second Silver Slugger Award and helping lead the Nationals to a World Series championship.

HALOS OPENING DAY STAPLES: With a start today, **Albert Pujols** would become the sixth player in Angels history to start nine consecutive Opening Day games, joining **Garret Anderson** (13), **Tim Salmon** (12), **Brian Downing** (11), **Darin Erstad** (10) and **Jim Fregosi** (9)...With a start today, **Mike Trout** would be making his eighth consecutive Opening Day start in CF...Club record for consecutive Opening Day starts at one position is **Tim Salmon's** 11 straight in right field from 1993-2003.

298 DAY DROUGHT: Tonight marks the Angels first regular season game since Sept. 29, 2019 vs. HOU...The 298-day span without a regular season game is the longest in franchise history (previous was 258 days between the 1994 and 1995 seasons).

VS. OAKLAND: Halos went 6-13 vs. A's in 2019, dropping the season series for the first time since 2013...Since 2014, Angels hold a 61-53 advantage in the head-to-head series.

20 IN 2020: With a start today, **Albert Pujols** would become the fifth player all-time to make an Opening Day start in each of his first 20 Major League seasons, joining: **Pete Rose**, **Carl Yastrzemski**, **Eddie Murray** and **Frank Robinson**.

MAN ON THE MOUND: LHP **Andrew Heaney** is scheduled to make his first career Opening Day start tonight...He is the Angels fifth different Opening Day starter in the last six years, after **Jered Weaver** made six straight from 2010-15.

MACHINE PRODUCTION: **Albert Pujols** enters 2020 ranking in the Top 10 all-time in several offensive categories, including: doubles (7th; 661), home runs (6th; 656), RBI (3rd (ELIAS); 2075), extra-base hits (5th; 1333) and total bases (5th; 5863).

RACK UP(TON) THE NUMBERS: **Justin Upton** could reach several personal milestones in 2020: He needs two more home runs to reach 300, 11 more runs to reach 1,000 and three more stolen bases to reach 150.

SPRING TRAINING 1.0: The Angels completed 19 Spring Training games prior to the shutdown and finished their time in Arizona with a 6-10-3 record...Newly acquired RHP **Dylan Bundy** was leading the Cactus League in ERA (1.59), wins (3), opponent batting average (.108) and WHIP (0.44) when play was suspended on March 13.

SUMMER CAMP: The Angels went 1-2 in their three exhibition games against the San Diego Padres (1-1) and Los Angeles Dodgers (0-1) following Summer Camp practices at Angel Stadium and Blair Field (Long Beach State University).

MVP, MVP, MVP: OF **Mike Trout** enters his 10th Major League season (ninth full year) with the Angels in 2020...Last season, Trout earned his third career MVP award (also 2014 and 2016)...He is one of 11 players to win at least three MVP awards and was the sixth to win three times in the American League, joining **Yogi Berra**, **Joe DiMaggio**, **Jimmie Foxx**, **Mickey Mantle** and **Alex Rodriguez**...The only player to win more than three MVP Awards in a career is **Barry Bonds** (7)...His 72.8 career bWAR is the best ever by a player before their age-28 season, ahead of **Ty Cobb** (68.9) and **Mickey Mantle** (67.9).

FISH FEED: **Mike Trout** enters 2020 ranking in the top five in Angels history in several offensive categories and is just 14 home runs away from becoming the franchise's all-time home run leader.

Making first career Opening Day start

- TODAY'S GAME:** Making first start of the year...First career Opening Day start...Enters season as a member of Angels opening rotation for second time in career (started Angels second game of 2016 season; has been on injured list to begin each of last three campaigns).
- RECENT LAA OPENING DAY STARTERS:** Heaney becomes the Angels fifth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...Last year, Trevor Cahill got the Opening Day nod...Garrett Richards made the Halos first starts in 2016 and 2018, while Ricky Nolasco had the honors in 2017...Jered Weaver made a franchise record six consecutive Opening day starts from 2010-15.
- LAST TIME OUT:** Most recent game appearance on the mound came in an intrasquad contest on July 12.
- SPRING TRAINING 1.0:** Made three starts during Arizona Spring Training, going 0-0 with a 7.04 ERA (7.2 IP – 6 ER) and seven strikeouts...Last Cactus League start came on March 9 vs. Cleveland (2.2 IP, 5 H, 4 ER, 0 BB, 3 SO).
- TROUBLE WITH THE CURVE:** Since 2017, opponents are batting .197 (68/346) against his curveball with 156 SO.
- REPAVING THE ROAD:** Has earned wins in two of his last three road starts, after having two total wins across his previous 26 road starts...Went an Angels record 17 straight road starts without a winning decision from Sept. 19, 2015 – Aug. 18, 2018.
- VS. OAKLAND:** In six career starts against the Athletics, is 2-2 with a 3.99 ERA (38.1 IP – 17 ER) and 43 strikeouts...Made two starts vs. A's last year, going 0-1 with a 4.76 ERA (11.1 IP - 6 ER) and 15 strikeouts...In five starts vs. Oakland since joining Angels, is 2-1 with a 3.62 ERA (32.1 IP – 13 ER).
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Tonight marks third career start at the Coliseum and first since June 17, 2018 (ND; 8 IP, 3 H, 3 ER, 1 BB, 8 SO)...In his two starts at the ballpark, is 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (15 IP - 6 ER) and 14 strikeouts.
- FIRST PITCH SWINGING:** In 2019, opponents swung at the first pitch in 34.2% of plate appearances, which ranked third in the A.L. (min. 1500 pitches thrown).
- SWING AND A MISS:** Owned a 31.2% swing and miss rate in 2019, which ranked eighth in the A.L. (min. 1500 pitches)
- 2019 RECAP:** Made 18 starts for the Angels, going 4-6 with a 4.91 ERA (95.1 IP – 52 ER) and 118 strikeouts...Missed 72 games across two injured list stints, with left elbow inflammation (start of season – May -26) and left shoulder inflammation (July 17-Aug. 10)...Pitched to a 1.82 ERA (24.2 IP – 5 ER) in first four starts following return from second IL trip...Set career high with 14 strikeouts on Aug. 20, 2019 (Game 1) at Texas.
- IN THE COMMUNITY:** Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacks and shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball...Is Angels ambassador for the “Home Plate Project,” a league-wide initiative by all 30 MLB Clubs and more than four dozen Major League players to support childhood hunger prevention and battle food insecurity...Hosts an annual ‘Pup Cup Orange County 5K-9’ which raises funds to help provide full-time therapy dogs for the Children’s Hospital at Orange County Resident Dog Therapy Program and OC Animal Care.
- CAREER NOTES:** Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF Austin Barnes, RHP Chris Hatcher and OF Enrique Hernandez in exchange for INF Dee Gordon, RHP Dan Haren, INF Miguel Rojas and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF Howie Kendrick.
