OUT OF THE GATES

- The Rockies conclude their five-game road trip to begin the 2020 season with the second of two games at Oakland this afternoon.
- The Rockies won last night's series opener 8-3 ... Sam Hilliard connected for his first home run of the season while all nine Rockies starters logged at least one hit ... Antonio Senzatela recorded the win in his first start of the season.
- Colorado began the 2020 season by taking two of three from the Texas Rangers at Globe Life Field, the first games in the ballpark's history.
- The series win was the Rockies' first opening series win since 2017, and their first road series win since taking two of three from San Francisco June 24-26 of last season.

THE NAME OF THE GAME

- The Rockies lead the Majors with the fewest runs allowed, having allowed eight runs through their first four games.
- Rockies relievers have allowed two runs in 13.2 innings, the fewest runs allowed by a bullpen in the Majors.
- Rockies starters have allowed six runs in 21.1 innings pitched, a 2.53 ERA that ranks sixth in MLB, third in the NL.
- Colorado has allowed three runs or fewer in each of the first four games of the season, the longest streak to start a season in club history.

BACK TO BLAKE

- Following an off-day tomorrow, the Rockies return home for their Home Opener on Friday against the San Diego Padres ... will host the Padres for three games and the Giants for four in the first homestand of the season.
- Friday's 6:10 p.m. MDT first pitch will be the second night game Home Opener in franchise history ... the first game in Coors Field history, April 26, 1995, was a 5:35 p.m. first pitch against the New York Mets.

- Trevor Story connected for two home runs in Sunday's 5-2 win, his 15th career multi-home run game ... his 15 multi-homer games passed Dante Bichette for the seventh-most in franchise history, two shy of Andres Galarraga for sixth.
- His 15 multi-homer games are also tied for the fifth-most in the Majors since his debut in 2016 (Khris Davis leads with 20 such games), the most for any National League player.

AT LAST

- Daniel Bard made his Rockies debut in Saturday's game, pitching 1.1 scoreless innings with two hits allowed and one strikeout ... it was his first Major League appearance since April 27, 2013, as a member of the Boston Red Sox.
- Earned the win, his first since May 29, 2012 in a start vs. Detroit.
- Per the Elias Sports Bureau, the eight years, 57 days elapsed between the two wins is the third-longest stretch of time between wins among pitchers who have debuted in the last 50 years (longest: Chin-Hui Tsao, 10 years, 60 days from May 11, 2005-July 10, 2015).

STOMPERVILLE

- The Rockies are 17-15 all-time against Oakland, 11-6 in Denver and 6-9 at the Coliseum.
- Colorado swept Oakland in three games the last time the two teams met, July 27-29, 2018 at Coors Field ... the Rockies held the Athletics to four runs in the series.
- Colorado last played at the Coliseum in 2015, dropping two of three games ... have won one of five series all-time in Oakland (a three-game sweep in 2009), losing seven-straight here from June 15, 1997-July 17, 2001.
- The Rockies will host the Athletics at Coors Field Sept. 15-16.

STOP BULLYING JUNIOR

- Nolan Arenado has reached base safely in 22 consecutive games against the American League, batting .386 (32-for-83) with eight doubles, nine home runs and 29 RBI over that span.
- Since 2018, Arenado leads the Majors with 43 Interleague RBI and is tied for the lead with 13 home runs ... his .335 average over that span ranks fifth.
- Arenado's 29 Interleague RBI in 2019 were the most in a single-season in Interleague history.

EVERY PLAY, EVERY DAY

- The Rockies will play 60 games in his pandemic-shortened season ... the best 60-game stretch at any point in a season in franchise history came in 2009 when the club went 42-18 from June 4-Aug. 10 ... outside of 2009, the club's best 60-game run was a 39-21 stretch from June 28-Sept. 7, 2018.
- Per Elias, Carlos González's 27 home runs from July 2-Sept. 10, 2015 is the franchise record for home runs in a 60-game stretch ... Larry Walker holds the record for highest batting average in a 60-game stretch, batting .423 from April 2-June 10, 1997 ... Andres Galarraga's 72 RBI from April 9-June 19, 1997 is the record for RBI in 60 games.

THINK HE'LL GET THERE?

- Nolan Arenado enters the 2020 season tied with Carlos González for fourth in franchise history with 227 home runs ... Charlie Blackmon's 172 home runs are tied with Andres Galarraga for eighth-most in franchise history ... Arenado's 1,162 career hits are three shy of tying Troy Tulowitzki for the seventh-most in franchise history.

GERMÁN ANDRES MÁRQUEZ

- Pronounced *HAIR-mahn MAR-keh-z*.
- Signed a five-year contract extension on April 6, 2019, covering the 2019-23 seasons with an option for '24.

JOINING THE CLUB

- The 25-year-old right-hander made his first Opening Day start Friday at Texas, his first appearance against the Rangers ... suffered his first-ever Interleague loss in eight decisions, 1-0, allowing two hits and one run over 5.2 innings with three walks and six strikeouts.
- Took a no-hitter into the sixth inning before allowing back-to-back doubles with one out ... sixth career start pitching at least 5 hitless innings, a franchise record.

REMEMBER SPRING TRAINING?

- Made two starts in March, allowing four hits and two runs in six innings combined against the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim and the Arizona Diamondbacks.

VERY ATHLETIC

- Facing Oakland for the second time today ... winning pitcher in a 3-2 victory two years ago today on July 29, 2018 at Coors Field, allowing two runs on five hits in 7.2 innings en route to the Rockies completing a three-game weekend sweep ... faced Frankie Montas, who got the loss ... allowed solo homers in the fourth (Chapman) and seventh (Davis).

A BEAUTIFUL FLAG

- Since 2016, his 38 wins rank tied for third among Venezuelan-born pitchers.

A LOOK BACK

- In 2019, made 28 starts before being placed on the 10-day injured list on Aug. 26 with right arm inflammation ... missed the remainder of the season ... was leading the National League with 174.0 innings pitched.
- Through his final start on Aug. 22, ranked among the NL leaders in wins (12,T4), strikeouts (175, 9th) and starts (28, 1st) ... strikeout-to-walk ratio was sixth (5.00).

THE JUNIOR CIRCUIT

- Is 7-1 with a 3.20 ERA over 16 Interleague starts ... allowed 36 earned runs,

FRIDAY'S STARTER:

RHP JON GRAY (0-0, 1.93)

The 28-year-old right-hander will start Friday's home opener against the San Diego Padres ... didn't figure in the 3-2 win on Saturday at Texas (4.2, 3, 1, 1, 3, 3) ... has a career mark of 10-4 with a 2.97 ERA (115.1 IP, 38 ER) in 20 games, 19 starts vs. the Padres ... Friars have hit .234 (100-for-428) ... is 5-1 with a 3.21 ERA (61.2 IP, 22 ER) in 11 games, 10 starts, at Coors Field ... was 2-1 with a 3.96 ERA (25.0, 11 ER) in five games, four starts, vs. the Padres last season.

including 14 homers, over 101.1 innings ... the Rockies are 11-5 in his starts vs. the American League. ... is 4-1 with a 2.66 ERA (61.0 IP, 18 ER) at AL parks with Colorado 6-4 in his 10 outings.

- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, seven straight Interleague wins to start his career the longest string in club history ... at the time of Friday's loss, was tied for fourth all-time with three pitchers who won their first seven decisions: Billy Wagner (1997-2010), Jeff Weaver (2000-2001), and Horacio Ramirez (2003-2007) ... the MLB record is eight consecutive wins: Brett Tomko (1997-2000), Cliff Lee (2004-2007), and Justin Verlander (2006-2008).

DO NOT WALK

- Set the single-season road strikeout-to-walk franchise record the previous two seasons, at 5.35 last year and 4.62 in 2018 ... his career K-to-BB ratio of 3.78 on the road is 10th among NL pitchers since 2016 and second all-time in club history.

ROAD WARRIOR

- Is 17-11 with a 3.42 ERA (255.0 IP, 97 ER) in his past 41 road starts with the Rockies 22-19 since July 29, 2017... batting average against .220 (209-for-948) ... among NL hurlers away from home that span, tied for second in wins and is first in starts and innings.
- At the time of his injury on Aug. 23 of last year, ranked among NL leaders in road wins (7,T2), starts (15, 2nd), innings (100.2, 1st), ERA (12th) and opponents batting average (.212, 7th)

ON THE MARQUE

- From the span of June 30, 2018 to Aug. 23, 2019, tied for first in the NL (Clayton Kershaw) with 21 wins ... ranked first in the Majors in innings (287.0) and first in the NL in starts (45) ... third in the NL in strikeouts (321) that time frame.

MORE LIKE IT

- After allowing a career-high 11 runs July 15, was 4-0 with a 3.68 ERA (44.0 IP, 18 ER) over his final seven starts last year ... opponents hit .216 over that span (35-for-162).

COORS HEAVY

- Colorado won nine of his 13 starts at home last year ... the loss against Houston on July 2, 2019 snapped the team's eight-game home winning string over his starts.
- Colorado has won 15 of his past 20 starts at home since July 11, 2018 ... 9-3 with a 4.55 ERA (120.2 IP, 61 ER) that span.

NOT REAL THRILLED ABOUT THE DH

- Career .233 hitter (37-for-159) with 14 runs, six doubles, one triple, a homer and 21 RBI ... batting average since 2016 leads all qualifying active pitchers ... is sixth in hits, tied for eighth in runs and tied for fourth in RBI.
- Batted .229 (11-for-48) with four doubles, one triple and 11 RBI last year ... led all pitchers with 11 RBI, tied for the lead with four doubles and ranked tied for sixth with 11 hits ... his 11 RBI were tied for the second most by a pitcher in a single season in franchise history, the most since Jason Jennings had 11 in 2002.
