LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the first game of an eight game homestand against the Oakland Athletics (Aug. 10-12), Los Angeles Dodgers (Aug. 14-16) and San Francisco Giants (Aug. 17-18)...LAA went 2-4 on last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Texas (0-3)...The Seattle series marked first series win of the year...Angels went 2-4 on last homestand vs. Mariners (1-2) and Astros (1-2).

VS. ATHLETICS: Oakland leads the 2020 season series 3-1 after winning the opening series of the year at the Oakland Coliseum...Halos went 6-13 vs. A's in 2019, dropping the season series for the first time since 2013...Since 2014, Angels hold a 62-56 advantage in the head-to-head series.

SLOW START: Angels are just 5-11 through the first 16 games of the season, which matches the fewest wins through 16 games in club history (also, 1961 and 1976)...Five wins is also the fewest through 17 games (1961 and 1976).

STRAIGHT A'S: Mike Trout owns a career .299 (160/535) average against Oakland with 35 home runs and 87 RBI (144 G)...His 35 HR vs. A's are tied with Nelson Cruz for the most among all active players...David Fletcher is a lifetime .330 (30/91) hitter against the A's...In his 24 career games vs. Oakland as a hitter, Shohei Ohtani owns a .290 average (27/93) with six home runs and 19 RBI.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Saturday, the Angels recalled LHP Patrick Sandoval to make the start on the mound...In a corresponding move, RHP Luke Bard was optioned to the Alternate Training Site...Following Wednesday night's game, the Angels optioned INF Matt Thaiss and RHP José Rodríguez to the Alternate Training Site to set the new active roster at 28 players.

ANOTHER BIRTHDAY HOMER: Friday, Mike Trout celebrated his 29th birthday and hit his fifth career birthday home run, which tied Alex Rodríguez (5) for most birthday homers by age-29...The overall birthday HR record is six by Rodríguez and Mark Reynolds.

DYLAN'S DAY: Thursday afternoon at Seattle, Dylan Bundy tossed his third career complete game (W; 9 IP, 4 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 10 SO), and his first since May 24, 2018 at Chicago White Sox...Marked the first complete game for an Angels pitcher since Andrew Heaney on June 5, 2018 vs. Kansas City and first on the road since Jered Weaver on June 19, 2016 at Oakland...Per ELIAS, it was his third CG victory with 10+ strikeouts and no more than five baserunners (via hit, walk or HBP) since 2017...The only other major-league pitcher with three such games since 2017 is Corey Kluber (also three).

JO'S IN THE SHOW: Tuesday the Angels selected OF Jo Adell to the Major League roster...He made his Major League debut that night and went 1-for-4 with an infield single in his first career at-bat...Adell is the top prospect in the Angels organization and the #3 overall prospect in all of baseball, according to Baseball America...He was the Angels first round selection (10th overall) in the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of Ballard HS (Louisville, KY).

MACHINE PRODUCTION: Albert Pujols ranks in the Top 10 all-time in several offensive categories, including: doubles (7th; 662), home runs (6th; 659), RBI (3rd (ELIAS); 2082), extra-base hits (5th; 1337) and total bases (5th; 5881).

FISH FEED: Mike Trout ranks in the top five in Angels history in several offensive categories and is just 11 home runs away from becoming the franchise's all-time home run leader.

DYNAMIC DUO: Tuesday night in Seattle was the 47th time that Mike Trout and Albert Pujols have homered in the same game for the Angels...That is the most by any pair of teammates in Angels history and the most among all active sets of teammates (Colorado's Nolan Arenado and Trevor Story are second with 33 games). (ELIAS)

RACK UP(TON) THE NUMBERS: Last Wednesday night, Justin Upton hit the 300th home run of his career and became the ninth active player with 300+ career homers: (A. Pujols, M. Cabrera, E. Encarnacion, N. Cruz, R. Braun, R. Cano, J. Bruce & G. Stanton)...Upton could also reach some additional milestones in 2020: He needs eight more runs to reach 1,000 and three more stolen bases to reach 150.

425 AND COUNTING: Tuesday night, Justin Dunn became the 425th different pitcher that Albert Pujols has homered against in his career, which is second-most all-time...Trails only Barry Bonds who homered off of 449 different pitchers (ESPN Stats & Info).

20 IN 2020: Albert Pujols became the fifth player all-time to make an Opening Day start in each of his first 20 Major League seasons, joining: Pete Rose, Carl Yastrzemski, Eddie Murray and Frank Robinson.

298 DAY DROUGHT: Opening Day marked the Angels first regular season game since Sept. 29, 2019 vs. HOU...The 298-day span without a regular season game is the longest in franchise history (previous was 258 days between the 1994 and 1995 seasons).

SHORTENED SEASON: 2020 represents the fifth officially shortened season in Angels history and the 10th season playing fewer than 162 games...The four previous officially shortened seasons were due to player strikes:

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

August 10

(1979) Dan Ford became the second Angels' player to hit for the cycle in an 8-6 loss to Seattle; (2009) Vlad Guerrero connects for career home runs 399 & 400 to become one of six players in MLB history with a .320+ career average and at least 400 home runs – the others are Babe Ruth, Ted Williams, Lou Gehrig, Stan Musial and Jimmie Foxx.

Making first start vs. Athletics since July 2, 2017

- TODAY’S GAME:** Making second start of the season and first at home...Is in 10th Major League season and first with Angels after spending first nine big league campaigns with the Atlanta Braves.
- A NEW ANGEL:** Made Angels debut on Aug. 5 after being reinstated from the injured list prior to the game... Missed Angels first 11 games of the year on the IL...Signed with Angels as a free agent on Dec. 21, 2019.
- DURABLE:** Since the start of the 2013 season, ranks fourth in the Majors with 223 starts...Also ranks 10th in the Majors in that span in innings pitched (1336.2).
- THE SINKER:** Last season with Atlanta, held opponents to a .188 (35/186) average against his sinker.
- VS. OAKLAND:** In two career starts against Oakland, is 1-0 with a 2.92 ERA (12.1 IP - 4 ER) and nine strikeouts...Today’s game marks first start vs. A’s since July 2, 2017 for the Braves at the Oakland Coliseum (ND; 6.1 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 4 BB, 8 SO)...Earned the win vs. Oakland on Aug. 16, 2014 at Turner Field (W; 6 IP, 4 H, 2 ER, 3 BB, 1 SO).
- AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Tonight marks second career start at The Big A and first in an Angels uniform...Is 1-0 with a 4.26 ERA (6.1 IP - 3 ER)...Only previous appearance at Angel Stadium, was May 29, 2017 for Braves (W; 6.1 IP, 6 H, 3 ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 3 HR)
- WITH THE BRAVES:** Pitched in 229 games (226 starts) across nine seasons with Atlanta, going 77-73 with a 3.67 ERA (1360 IP - 554 ER) and 1,184 strikeouts...Is one of six players since 1900 to record over 1,000 strikeouts in a Braves uniform, along with Hall of Famers John Smoltz, Phil Niekro, Warren Spahn, Tom Glavine and Greg Maddux.
- 2019 IN REVIEW:** Made career-high-tying 33 starts for Braves, marking seventh straight season with 30+ starts (only others with 30+ GS in each of last seven years are José Quintana, Jon Lester & Mike Leake)... Made 17 starts allowing one-or-fewer earned runs, which tied (with Jack Flaherty and Jacob deGrom) for third-most in Majors among traditional starters, behind Gerrit Cole (19) and Hyun-Jin Ryu (18)...Made eight consecutive such starts, May 5 - June 13, which was longest streak in Majors for a traditional starter).
- OPENING DAY STAPLE:** The 2020 season snapped a streak of six straight seasons as an Opening Day starter... His streak matched Hall-of-Famer Warren Spahn for longest such streak by a pitcher in Braves franchise history and was the longest active streak in the Majors until it was snapped this season.
- CAREER NOTES:** Native of Cartagena, Colombia...Originally signed by Braves as an international free agent on July 2, 2007... Made Major League debut May 7, 2011 vs. Philadelphia...Earned first MLB win, Sept. 8, 2011 (Game 2) at New York (N.L.).

Making fourth start of the season and second at home...Second start of 2020 vs. Athletics...Earned the win in last start on Thursday at Seattle after tossing his third career complete game, allowing one earned run on four hits with no walks and 10 strikeouts...Marked the first complete game for an Angels pitcher since Andrew Heaney on June 5, 2018 vs. Kansas City...Has registered a quality start in all three of his starts this season, becoming the first Angels pitcher to do so in his first three starts with the team since Heaney in 2015 and first right-hander to do it since Joel Pineiro in 2010...In six career games (five starts) against the A’s, is 3-1 with a 4.26 ERA (31.2 IP - 15 ER) and 43 strikeouts... Earned the win in Angels debut vs. A’s on July 25 at the Coliseum (6.2 IP, 3 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 7 SO).
