LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the third game (2-0) of an eight game homestand against the Oakland Athletics (2-0; Aug. 10-12), Los Angeles Dodgers (Aug. 14-16) and San Francisco Giants (Aug. 17-18)... Angels have won backto-back games for the first time this season...LAA went 2-4 on last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Texas (0-3)...The Seattle series marked first series win of the year...Angels went 2-4 on last homestand vs. Mariners (1-2) and Astros (1-2).

<u>CONGRATS ADAM & KRISTA:</u> The Angels congratulate Director, Communications **Adam Chodzko** and his wife **Krista**, on welcoming their first child, as their daughter, **Emma Jean** Chodzko was born yesterday at 5:37 p.m. and checked in at

HOME RUN DERBY: Angels have hit four home runs in each of the last two games, marking the fifth time in franchise history LAA has hit 4+ HR in back-to-back games and the first time ever doing so at home...There have been just six instances in A.L. history where a club hit 4+ HR in three straight games.

DYLAN'S DOMINATION: Last night, Dylan Bundy earned his third win of the season after tossing seven scoreless innings, allowing just four hits, one HBP and one walk with 10 strikeouts...In his last two starts, he allowed just one run in 16 IP (0.56 ERA) with one walk and 20 strikeouts...He leads the Majors with 28.2 innings pitched this season and ranks second with 35 strikeouts (Cleveland's Shane Bieber has 43)... Additionally, his 1.57 ERA (28.2 IP - 5 ER) ranks eighth in the Maiors.

MORE HISTORY FOR TROUT: Monday night, Mike Trout recorded his 20th career multi-HR game, which tied Angels Hall of Famers Tim Salmon and Vladimir Guerrero for the most such games in Angels history.

DAD STRENGTH: Since returning to the Angels lineup following the birth of his son, Mike Trout is batting .343 (12/35) with nine runs scored, six home runs and 10 RBI in eight games.

VS. ATHLETICS: The 2020 season series is tied 3-3 after A's won three of four in the opening series of the year at the Oakland Coliseum and Angels won first two meetings of current series...Teams will meet again Aug. 21-23 at the Coliseum... Halos went 6-13 vs. A's in 2019, dropping the season series for the first time since 2013...Since 2014, Angels hold a 64-56 advantage in the head-to-head series.

STRAIGHT A's: Mike Trout owns a career .303 (166/545) average against Oakland with 37 home runs and 90 RBI (146 37 HR vs. A's lead all active players...Since 2000, only Adrian Beltre (41) and Mark Teixeira (38) have more homers vs. Oakland than Trout...David Fletcher is a lifetime .320 (32/100) hitter against the A's...In his 26 career games vs. Oakland as a hitter. Shohei Ohtani owns a .307 average (31/101) with seven home runs and 21 RBI.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Monday, the Angels designated RHP José Rodriguez for assignment and reinstated LHP José Suarez from the injured list and optioned him to the Alternate Training Site...Saturday, the Angels recalled LHP **Patrick Sandoval** to make the start on the mound and optioned RHP Luke Bard to the Alternate Training Site.

LOOKING FOR A SWEEP: After taking the first two games of this series, the Angels have secured their first series win at Angel Stadium since taking three of four against the White Sox from Aug. 15-18, 2019...It's the first three-game series win at The Big A since a three-game sweep of the Mariners, July 12-14, 2019 (that series vs. Seattle was also the last sweep achieved by the Angels)...Last time Angels swept a three-game series vs. Oakland was Aug. 28-30, 2017 at Angel Stadium.

<u>LEAGUE LEADING OFFENSE:</u> Angels lead the American League with 32 home runs and 81 walks in 2020, while their 88 runs scored are tied with Houston for the A.L. lead.

STREAKING: David Fletcher owns the longest active hit streak in the American League, at 11 games...It's the second longest streak of his career (13 games, May 21 - June 3, 2019).

MACHINE PRODUCTION: Albert Pujols ranks in the Top 10 alltime in several offensive categories, including: doubles (7th; 662), home runs (6th; 659), RBI (3rd (ELIAS); 2083), extrabase hits (5th; 1337) and total bases (5th; 5883).

DYNAMIC DUO: Last Tuesday night in Seattle was the 47th time that Mike Trout and Albert Pujols have homered in the same game for the Angels...That is the most by any pair of teammates in Angels history and the most among all active sets of teammates (Colorado's Nolan Arenado and Trevor Story are second with 33 games). (ELIAS)

425 AND COUNTING: Last Tuesday night, **Justin Dunn** became the 425th different pitcher that **Albert Pujols** has homered against in his career, which is second-most all-time... Trails only Barry Bonds who homered off of 449 different pitchers (ESPN Stats & Info).

<u>SHORTENED SEASON:</u> 2020 represents the fifth officially shortened season in Angels history and the 10th season playing fewer than 162 games...The four previous officially shortened seasons were due to player strikes: 1972 – 155 games

1981 – 110 games **1994** – 115 games

1995 – 145 games The Angels had an additional five seasons where postponed games were not made up: Halos played 161 games four times (1963, 1967, 1975, 1996) and 160 games in 1980.

<u>DODGERS ON DECK:</u> Following an off day tomorrow, the Angels will continue the homestand in Freeway Series action as they host the Los Angeles Dodgers in a three-game series. The teams will also meet again at Dodger Stadium in the final three games of the regular season, Sept. 25-27...Last season, the Angels swept the four-game season series against the

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

August 12
(1974) Nolan Ryan set an AL and club record with 19 strikeouts in a 4-2 win over Boston...In the effort, Ryan broke Bob Feller's AL record of 18 K's, a mark that stood for over 40 years The mark would stand until 1986 when Boston's Roger Clemens set a ML record with 20 strikeouts; (1982) Doug DeCinces homers at Minneso-ta, his 12th HR in a 13 games – the most in a two-week stretch in Club history; (2004) Garret Anderson is hit by a pitch for first time since 1998, snapping a span of 890 games and 3,807 plate appearances with out being hit; (2005) Vladimir Guerrero connects for two upper deck home runs at Safeco Field, the first player to accomplish the feat in the same game at the ballpark.

- TODAY'S GAME: Making fourth start of the season and second at home...Second start of 2020 vs. Athletics
- STRIKEOUT SURGE: Has tallied 112 strikeouts across his first 21 big league games, which is the most in Angels history after 21 career games...Angels record through 22 games is 116 by Jered Weaver
- LAST TIME OUT: Charged with loss in last start on Friday at Texas after tossing 3.2 innings and allowing four runs (one earned) on three hits with six walks and four strikeouts.
- TROUBLE WITH THE CURVE: In career, has held opponents to a .182 average (12/66) against his curveball.
- UNFAMILIAR FOES: In his career as a starter, has held opponents to a .161 average (25/155) in opposing batter's first plate appearances of a game.
- OFF THE BOARDS: Dating to last season, has allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in six consecutive starts.
- VS. OAKLAND: In four career starts vs. Oakland, is 1-2 with a 3.97 ERA (22.2 IP 10 ER) and 26 strikeouts... Took loss in first start of year vs. A's on July 27 at the Coliseum (L; 4.2 IP, 4 H, 3 ER, 2 BB, 7 SO)...His 26 strikeouts vs. Oakland are his most against any opponent.
- AT ANGEL STADIUM: In 12 career games (11 starts) at Angel Stadium, is 4-2 with a 3.86 ERA (60.2 IP 26 ER)... This season, is 0-0 with a 1.50 ERA (6 IP - 1 ER) at home... As a starter, is 4-1 with a 3.22 ERA (58.2 IP - 21 ER) at home...Has allowed three-or-fewer runs in 10 of 11 home starts (six of 11 are quality starts).
- SPRING TRAINING 1.0: Limited to one Cactus League start (Feb. 26 at Dodgers) after suffering right elbow injury during the game, but was able to return to pitching regularly when Summer Camp began.
- 2019 IN REVIEW: Made 18 appearances (17 starts) in rookie season last year, going 5-6 with a 4.58 ERA (90.1 - 46 ER) and 96 strikeouts...Held left-handers to a .204 (33/162) batting average in 2019...Opponents swung and missed on 32.2% of swings, which was seventh highest rate in A.L. (min. 80 IP).
- IN THE COMMUNITY: Last season, visited patients and their families at CHOC Children's in July 2019 alongside several teammates...Also participated in a hospital visit to Gillette Children's Hospital in St. Paul, MN in May 2019 with Angels teammates as well as several members of the Minnesota Twins.
- TRIBUTE: Since his days in youth travel ball, Canning has written the initials "JRH" (Jeffrey Robert Hayek) on the back of the mound before each of his starts...Jeffrey was the grandson of Canning's godmother (Diana) who suddenly passed away at age 10 from a blood clot in his brain in 2007... Although Griffin and Jeffrey never met, they both loved baseball and shared a connection through Diana.
- CAREER NOTES: Native of Mission Viejo, CA...Previously drafted by Colorado in 38th round of 2014 Draft out of Santa Margarita Catholic HS (Rancho Santa Margarita, CA) but elected to attend UCLA...Selected by Angels in 2nd round of 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of UCLA...With his Major League debut on April 30, 2019, became first player drafted by Billy Eppler as Angels General Manager to reach the Majors.
