LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the third game (0-2) on a nine game road trip to San Francisco (0-2), Oakland (Aug. 21-23) and Houston (Aug. 24-27)...Angels went 3-5 on last homestand against the Athletics (2-1), Dodgers (0-3) and Giants (1-1)...Angels won back-to-back games for the first time this season during first two games of last homestand... LAA went 2-4 on last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Texas (0-3); the Seattle series marked first series win of the year.

SO FLETCH: **David Fletcher** has hit safely in 23 of 26 games this season...Had his career-best hit streak snapped at 16 games Tuesday afternoon at Angel Stadium...It stands as the longest streak in the American League this season.

RENDON RAKING: **Anthony Rendon** is batting .486 (18/37) across his last 10 games...Homered in five of the eight games on last homestand, including a career-best streak of four straight from Aug. 10-14...Recorded an extra-base hit in seven straight games during last homestand, which tied for the third longest streak in Angels history.

LEAGUE LEADERS: **Mike Trout** is tied with **Luke Voit** (NYY) for the American League lead with 10 home runs (**Fernando Tatis Jr.** leads MLB with 12 HR)...**Anthony Rendon** ranks second in the American League with 20 walks this season and ranks third in on-base percentage (.449).

CATCHING A-ROD: With his RBI single in the 6th inning Wednesday night at San Francisco, **Albert Pujols** recorded his 2,086th career RBI, which tied **Alex Rodriguez** for second place on the ELIAS all-time RBI list (since the RBI became an official stat in 1920)...**Hank Aaron** is atop the leaderboard with 2,297 career RBI.

RELYING ON THE LONG BALL: Angels rank third in the American League and fifth in the Majors with 42 home runs... Angels have scored 70 of 120 runs this season on home runs (58.3%).

VS. ATHLETICS: Oakland leads season series 4-3...A's won three of four in the opening series of the year at the Oakland Coliseum and Angels won two of three at The Big A last week...Halos went 6-13 vs. A's in 2019, dropping the season series for the first time since 2013...Since 2014, Angels hold a 64-57 advantage in the head-to-head series.

STRAIGHT A'S: **Mike Trout** owns a career .303 (166/547) average against Oakland with 38 home runs and 92 RBI (147 G)...**His 38 HR vs. A's lead all active players**...Since 2000, only **Adrian Beltre** (41) has more homers vs. Oakland than Trout... **David Fletcher** is a lifetime .317 (33/104) hitter against the A's...In his 27 career games vs. Oakland as a hitter, **Shohei Ohtani** owns a .298 average (31/104) with seven home runs and 21 RBI.

ZOOMIN' WITH THE SCHOLARS: Yesterday morning, Angels manager **Joe Maddon** met with college students from the Angels Scholars program via Zoom...The group consisted of juniors and seniors at various universities and Joe took questions and offered advice to the students.

IN THE COMMUNITY: Tomorrow, the Angels Baseball Foundation will be volunteering with Project HERO at a clothing drive at Salk Elementary School in Anaheim; Angels have also donated 300 Junior Angels Kids Club backpacks, 300 tote bags and 600 masks (kids & adults)

SLOW START: The Angels are just 8-18 after their first 26 games of the season, which is the fewest victories through 26 games in franchise history...The fewest victories the Angels have had through 27 games is nine (twice; started 9-18 in 1961 and 1994).

THEY'RE ON FIERS: Several Angels have had career success against tonight's A's starter **Mike Fiers**: **Mike Trout** is hitting .364 (12/33) with five HR and 13 RBI; the 5 homers are the most Fiers has allowed to any opposing hitter...**Shohei Ohtani** has a .583 (7/12) average with two doubles...**David Fletcher** owns a .500 (7/14) average and **Albert Pujols** is hitting .273 (9/33) with three home runs and eight RBI.

PLAY OF THE WEEK: Monday, **David Fletcher** was recognized by Major League Baseball for making the "Play of the Week" for making a backhanded stop before delivering an off-balance throw across the diamond to retire **Mookie Betts**.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Today, the Angels reinstated INF **Andrelton Simmons** from injured list and placed C **Max Stassi** on injured list...Yesterday, the Angels recalled LHP **José Suarez** from the Alternate Training Site and optioned RHP **Jaime Barria** to the Alternate Training Site...Tuesday, the Angels recalled RHP **Jaime Barria** from the Alternate Training Site and optioned OF **Taylor Ward** to the Alternate Training Site... Saturday, the Angels recalled C **Anthony Bemboom** from the Alternate Training Site and optioned LHP **Ryan Buchter** to the Alternate Training Site.

TAXI SQUAD: The Angels taxi squad for the current road trip includes: RHP **Jaime Barria**, RHP **Luke Bard**, C **José Briceño**, RHP **Kyle Keller**, and INF **Elliot Soto**.

DEALIN' BUNDY: Through five starts this season, **Dylan Bundy** ranks third in the American League with a 0.80 WHIP and a .164 opponent batting average (19/116)...Ranks fifth with 38 strikeouts, sixth with a 2.48 ERA (32.2 IP - 9 ER) and seventh with 32.2 innings pitched.

MACHINE PRODUCTION: **Albert Pujols** ranks in the Top 10 all-time in several offensive categories, including: doubles (7th; 663), home runs (6th; 659), RBI (T2nd (ELIAS); 2086), extra-base hits (5th; 1338) and total bases (5th; 5888).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

August 21

(1992) Tim Salmon makes his ML debut at Yankee Stadium (0/4) in Angels' 9-5 win; (2007) Garret Anderson sets a club record with 10 RBI vs. Yankees at Angel Stadium (18-9 Angels win)...The feat passes the previous mark of 9 RBI by Vladimir Guerrero on June 2, 2004 and falls one RBI shy of matching the AL record...Anderson's grand slam in the game marks the 8th of his career, passing Joe Rudi (7) for the most slams in club history...The 18 runs scored marked the most by the club vs. NYY...For Anderson, marked his 4th career game with at least 7 RBI – one of just 10 players in MLB history with at least four such games

In three career starts at the Coliseum, is 1-0 with a 3.20 ERA (19.2 IP - 7 ER)

- TODAY'S GAME:** Making sixth start of the year and fourth on the road...Second start of 2020 vs. Athletics...Entered season as a member of Angels opening rotation for second time in career (started Angels second game of 2016 season; had been on injured list to begin each of last three campaigns).
- LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start on Saturday vs. Dodgers after tossing 5.2 innings and allowing four earned runs on five hits with four walks and six strikeouts.
- VS. OAKLAND:** In seven career starts against the Athletics, is 2-2 with a 3.77 ERA (43 IP – 18 ER) and 49 strikeouts...Is seeking first victory vs. Oakland since Aug. 28, 2017...Did not factor in decision in first start of year against A's on Opening Day at the Coliseum (4.2 IP, 2 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 6 SO)...In six starts vs. Oakland since joining Angels, is 2-1 with a 3.41 ERA (37 IP – 14 ER).
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Tonight marks fourth career start at the Coliseum and second this season...In his three previous starts at the ballpark, is 1-0 with a 3.20 ERA (19.2 IP - 7 ER) and 20 strikeouts...His victory at the ballpark came on Sept. 2, 2015 (W; 7 IP, 7 H, 3 ER, 0 BB, 6 SO).
- TROUBLE WITH THE CURVE:** Since 2017, opponents are batting .202 (66/326) against his curveball with 141 SO.
- REPAVING THE ROAD:** Has earned wins in three of his last six road starts, after having two total wins across his previous 26 road starts...Went an Angels record 17 straight road starts without a winning decision from Sept. 19, 2015 – Aug. 18, 2018.
- OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made first career Opening Day start for Angels on July 24 at Oakland...Became the Angels fifth different Opening Day starter in the last six years.
- FIRST PITCH SWINGING:** Opponents have swung at the first pitch 31.4% of the time this year, which ranks 11th in the A.L. (min. 20 IP)...In 2019, his 34.2% first pitch swing rate ranked third in the A.L. (min. 1500 pitches thrown).
- SWING AND A MISS:** Owned a 31.2% swing and miss rate in 2019, which ranked eighth in the A.L. (min. 1500 pitches)
- 2019 RECAP:** Made 18 starts for the Angels, going 4-6 with a 4.91 ERA (95.1 IP – 52 ER) and 118 strikeouts...Missed 72 games across two injured list stints, with left elbow inflammation (start of season – May -26) and left shoulder inflammation (July 17-Aug. 10)...Pitched to a 1.82 ERA (24.2 IP – 5 ER) in first four starts following return from second IL trip...Set career high with 14 strikeouts on Aug. 20, 2019 (Game 1) at Texas.
- IN THE COMMUNITY:** Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacks and shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball...Is Angels ambassador for the “Home Plate Project,” a league-wide initiative by all 30 MLB Clubs and more than four dozen Major League players to support childhood hunger prevention and battle food insecurity...Hosts an annual ‘Pup Cup Orange County 5K-9’ which raises funds to help provide full-time therapy dogs for the Children’s Hospital at Orange County Resident Dog Therapy Program and OC Animal Care.
- CAREER NOTES:** Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF Austin Barnes, RHP Chris Hatcher and OF Enrique Hernandez in exchange for INF Dee Gordon, RHP Dan Haren, INF Miguel Rojas and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF Howie Kendrick.
