TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners will wrap up the regular season with a 3-day, 4-game road trip at Oakland beginning today...recently concluded a four-team, 10-game, 10-day homestand/road trip vs. Oakland (1-1), at San Francisco (0-2) at San Diego (1-2) and vs. Houston (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised by **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast on **710 ESPN** and the **Mariners Radio Network**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won on Wednesday and have won 3 of their last 5 games...they are 6-6 in their last 12 games, 12-9 since Aug. 30 and 17-12 since Aug. 21.

- **Taxi Squad** - LHP **Aaron Fletcher**, RHP **Seth Frankoff**, C **Joe Hudson**, INF **Donovan Walton** and RHP **Art Warren** are on the Mariners taxi squad on the final road trip.
- **Ribeyes** - **Kyle Seager** ranks 10th in the American League with 37 RBI this season.
- **France Stays Hot** - since joining the Mariners, **Ty France** has reached base safely via hit, walk or HBP in 17 of 19 games (9/4-c), batting .296 (21x71) with 8 runs scored, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, 6 walks and 1 HBP.
- **Catch Us If You Can** - the Mariners rank T3rd in the Majors with 47 stolen bases this season (also: Tampa Bay), trailing only San Diego (52) and Miami (50)...**Dylan Moore** leads the Mariners with 12 stolen bases, followed by **J.P. Crawford** (5), **Tim Lopes** (5) and **Kyle Seager** (5)...overall, the Mariners 12 players with at least 1 stolen base this season rank T5th in the Majors (also: Chicago-NL & Tampa Bay), trailing only Cincinnati (15), Texas (15), Miami (13) and San Diego (13).

START ME UP...the Mariners starters have recorded 24 quality starts this season with the starters going 16-2 when allowing 3 runs or less and tossing at least 6.0 innings...the Mariners 24 quality starts this season are T5th-most in the Majors (also: Houston), trailing only Cleveland (36), Chicago-NL (29), Colorado (27) and Cincinnati (26)...**Marco Gonzales** and **Justus Sheffield** are T9th in the American League with 6 quality starts this season...dating back to Aug. 30, the Mariners are 10-0 when their starter recorded a quality start.

NICE STRETCH...the Mariners starters have allowed 1 run or less in 4 of their last 5 starts...during this stretch, the starters have gone 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA (5 ER, 30.0 IP), while limiting opponents to a .206 (22x107) batting average with 10 walks and 22 strikeouts.

GET IN THERE, ROOK...22 different rookies have seen action for the Mariners so far this season, the most in the Majors this season...rank ahead of Miami (21), Houston (19), St. Louis (19), Chicago-AL (18) and Texas (18)...22 rookies are T3rd-most in club history (also: 2017), trailing only 25 rookies used in 2019 and 23 rookies in 2006...the Mariners also lead the Majors with most games played by team's rookies with 339 games, ranking ahead of Texas (284), San Francisco (240), Houston (221) and Chicago-AL (198)...here is a list of rookies to appear in at least 1 game with Seattle this season: **Braden Bishop, Justin Dunn, Aaron Fletcher, Jake Fraley, Seth Frankoff, Joey Gerber, Zac Grotz, Taylor Guilbeau, Sam Haggerty, Joe Hudson, Brady Lail, Kyle Lewis, Walker Lockett, Tim Lopes, José Marmolejos, Anthony Misiewicz, Ljay Newsome, Joseph Odom, Yohan Ramirez, Justus Sheffield, Donovan Walton and Evan White**.

FOR STARTERS...the Mariners used only 10 different starting pitchers this season: **Marco Gonzales** (10 GS), **Justus Sheffield** (9 GS), **Justin Dunn** (9 GS), **Yusei Kikuchi** (8), **Nick Margevicius** (7), **Taijaun Walker** (5), **Ljay Newsome** (4), **Kendall Graveman** (2), **Nestor Cortes** (1 GS) and **Jimmy Yacabonis** (1 GS)...the Mariners 10 starters used this season is T5th-fewest in the American League (also: Houston, Detroit, Baltimore and Los Angeles-AL), trailing only Cleveland (8), New York-AL (8), Oakland (8) and Chicago-AL (9).

GOLD GLOVE CALIBER...**Kyle Seager** has not made an error over his last 27 games (8/23-c), successfully converting each of his 60 total chances (14 PO, 46 A)...**J.P. Crawford** has not made an error over his last 29 games (8/15-c), successfully converting each of his 121 total chances (42 PO, 79 A)...**Evan White** has not made an error over his last 45 games (7/29-c), successfully converting each of his 330 total chances (303 PO, 27 A)...overall this season, Crawford ranks 2nd among American League shortstops with 4 Defensive Runs Saved, trailing only Carlos Correa-HOU (8)...White has tallied 5 Defensive Runs Saved this season, tied with José Abreu-CWS and Carlos Santana for tops among AL first basemen...Seager has made 20 out of zone plays this season, the most among AL third basemen.

LEADING THE WAY...**Kyle Lewis** leads the club in hits (54), walks (33), runs scored (37) and home runs (11)...he is currently one of four Major League players that currently lead his team in hits, walks, runs scored and home runs, joining Nelson Cruz-MIN (55 H, 22 BB, 33 R, 16 HR), Brandon Lowe-TB (51 H, 23 BB, 35 R, 14 HR) and Trevor Story-COL (65 H, 24 BB, 40 R, 11 HR).

LEADER AMONG US...**Kyle Lewis** leads the club in batting (.277), home runs (11), walks (33) and runs scored (37)...he is on pace to become only the 2nd Major League rookie (dating back to 1969) to lead his team in all four categories, joining Mark McGwire-OAK in 1987.

STOP IT!...since Aug. 15, the Mariners lead the Major Leagues in fielding percentage with a mark of .993 over that span...in their last 35 games, the Mariners have successfully converted 1,193 (903 PO, 290 A) of 1,202 total chances, committing only 9 errors...during this stretch, the Mariners rank ahead of Houston (.991), Kansas City (.990) and Tampa Bay (.989)...overall this season the Mariners have committed just 21 errors total, the 3rd-fewest in the Majors (Houston, 18; Minnesota, 19)...the Mariners .989 fielding percentage (21 E, 1,933 TC) is 3rd-best in the Majors this season, trailing only Houston (.991) and Minnesota (.990).

ROY...**Kyle Lewis** ranks among American League rookie leaders in nearly every offensive category: runs scored (1st, 37), hits (1st, 54), walks (1st, 33), batting (1st, .277), on-base percentage (1st, .378), slugging percentage (1st, .462), OPS (1st, .842), multi-hit games (1st, 15), times on base (1st, 87), total bases (1st, 90), *FanGraphs* WAR (1st, 1.9), home runs (T1st, 11), RBI (2nd, 28) and extra-base hits (T2nd, 14).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...dating back to 2015, the Mariners are 27-19 (.587) in this last 46 games vs. the Athletics at the Oakland Coliseum...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...during this stretch, the Mariners .587 winning percentage at the Oakland Coliseum is the highest among any Major League team (min. 10 games played)...the Mariners are 1 of 5 teams with a winning percentage of at least .500 at the Oakland Coliseum since 2015, ranking ahead of Tampa Bay (.556/10-8), San Francisco (.533/8-7), Houston (.527/29-26) and Kansas City (.500/8-8).

ABOUT KIKUCHI...

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his 9th start of the season, his 41st Major League start and his 6th career start (2nd in 2020) vs. the A's.
- Signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025.
- Native of Morioka, Japan...pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School.
- Was the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft by the Saitama Seibu Lions of Japan's Pacific League.
- In 7 seasons with Seibu, was 69-45 with a 2.69 ERA (286 ER, 956.1 IP) with 879 strikeouts and 363 walks in 148 games (144 starts)...had 13 complete games, including 7 shutouts.
- Resides in Tokyo, Japan with wife, Rumi (married in 2016), and son, Leo...Rumi previously worked as a broadcaster for NHK TV.

LAST START...took his 4th loss (2nd consecutive) of the year Sept. 18 at San Diego in 6-1 setback...allowed 5 runs in 4.0 IP; big blow was a 2-out, 3-run HR (Machado) on 1-2 pitch in 4th to take game from 0-2 to 0-5...walked career-high 6 and threw 3 wild pitches among 89 total pitches in 4.0 innings.

A±...had best start of year in ND vs. the A's Aug. 1 in Seattle...tossed 6.0 ShO IP allowing just 3 hits (1 BB) and striking out 9...left with 2-0 lead in game Oakland eventually won 3-2 in 10-innings...lowered his career ERA to 3.33 in 5 career starts vs. A's.

WINNING WAYS...win #2 Sept. 4, 6-3 vs. TEX, allowing 1 ER on 2 H in 6.0 IP...did not walk a batter and struck out 7...win #1, an 8-3 triumph over the San Diego Padres, Aug. 27 in Game #2 of a doubleheader...tossed 5.0 IP, allowing 3 runs on 7 hits (1 HR), with 6 strikeouts and did not walk a batter.

GOING NATIONAL...made 5 of his 8 starts this season vs. the National League: SD-2, COL, LAD & AZ...is 1-4, 7.46 (21 ER, 25.1 IP) in 5 interleague starts in 2020 and is 1-4, 6.82 (26 ER, 34.1 IP) in 7 interleague starts in his career.

SLUG BAIT...of his 37 hits allowed this season, only 12 have been for extra bases (8 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR)...his .368 slugging percentage allowed is 17th-best in the American League among starting pitchers (min. 150 BF)...**Justus Sheffield** has the 4th-best mark among AL starters (.298), **Marco Gonzales** is 12th (.359) and **Justin Dunn** is 20th (.375).

STOPPING FOR GAS...among all ML left-handed pitchers, Yusei's average 4-seam velocity (95.1 MPH) ranks 3rd-best, trailing only Caleb Ferguson-LAD (95.5 MPH) and Jesús Luzardo-OAK (95.4 MPH) (min. 200 4-seamers thrown)...in 2019, Kikuchi averaged 92.5 MPH on his 4-seam fastball, 54th among MLB left-handers with the same qualifier.

MISSING BARRELS...Yusei Kikuchi has experienced 112 "Batted Ball Events" according to Statcast...among pitchers with at least 100 BBE, Kikuchi ranks T2nd with **Justus Sheffield**-SEA. Zack Wheeler-PHI and Sonny Gray-CIN with a 2.3 Barrels-Per-Plate-Appearance percentage, trailing only Max Fried-ATL (2.2%)...this means that 2.3% of opposing batters are "barreling" Kikuchi's pitches when they make contact.

- Statcast defines "Barrel" as: batted-ball events whose comparable hit types (in terms of exit velocity and launch angle) have led to a minimum .500 batting average and 1.500 slugging percentage.

2020 DEBUT...made debut July 26 at HOU lasting just 3.2 IP and allowing 5 runs on 5 hits with 4 walks and 4 strikeouts in a 7-6 Mariners win.

SUMMER CAMP RECAP...went 0-2 with a 7.11 ERA (5 ER, 6.1 IP) over 2 games in Summer Camp in Seattle...struck out 4 batters while walking 6.

SPRING RECAP...made 3 starts in Spring Training in Arizona, going 1-1 with a 4.05 ERA (3 ER, 6.2 IP) with 5 walks and 10 strikeouts, in what was his second career Spring Training with Seattle.

2019 RECAP...went 6-11 with a 5.46 ERA (98 ER, 161.2 IP) with 50 walks and 116 strikeouts in first Major League season...led American rookies with 161.2 innings pitched, ranking 4th in strikeouts (116).

HISTORIC DEBUT...with his start March 21, 2019 at Oakland in the Tokyo Dome, became the first Japanese-born player to make his Major League debut in Japan...was just his second career start (3rd appearance) as a professional in the Tokyo Dome.

ROOKKKKKIE LEADER...finished his rookie campaign ranked 6th in single-season club history among Mariners rookies with 116 strikeouts (most: Mark Langston, 1984, 204)...his 116 strikeouts also ranked 4th among American League rookies in 2019 (most: Trent Thornton-TOR, 149).

COMPLETELY KIKUCHI...recorded his first career complete game shutout on August 18 at Toronto, pitching 9.0 scoreless innings and allowing only 2 hits and 1 walk with 8 strikeouts...he became just the 14th pitcher (done 17x) in club history to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (last: Mike Montgomery, 6/30/15 at SD)...was the 4th Mariners pitcher since 2000 to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (also: Mike Montgomery, Roenis Elias, and Gil Meche).

WELCOME TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025...is the 10th Japanese-born player to appear with the Mariners, including the 6th pitcher...is the 3rd Japanese-born pitcher to start a game for the Mariners (also: Hisashi Iwakuma, 136 GS; and Mac Suzuki, 9 GS).

EARLY YEARS...the native of Morioka, Japan, pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School...helped lead his high school to a runner-up finish at the national high school invitational in April and to the semifinals in the national championship in August before being the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft...made his professional debut for Seibu's minor league team in 2011 and also pitched with Melbourne in the Australian Winter League that year.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP JUSTUS SHEFFIELD (4-3, 3.75 ERA)

24-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season tomorrow in game #1 at the A's...is 4-1, 2.74 (13 ER, 42.2 IP) in last 7 GS since Aug. 9 with 6 quality starts...W #4, his 3rd straight, in last start 9/19 at SD, allowing 1 ER in 6.0 IP (6.0,6.1,1,2,5)...W#3 9/12 at AZ; was 2nd consecutive start w/7.0 IP (career-high / 7.0,5,2,2,3,7)...ND on 9/5 vs. TEX, despite allowing just 2 ER in 7.0 IP (8 H, 1 BB, 6 SO)...W#2 on 8/22 vs. TEX (6.0,6.1,1,1,1,5)...picked up 1st career win 8/9 vs. COL, tossing 6.0 ShO IP and striking out 7...**2019:** Pitched in 8 Major League games with the Mariners in 2019 (7 starts), posting a 5.50 ERA (22 ER, 36.0 IP) with 37 strikeouts to 18 walks...**CAREER:** Was originally selected by the Cleveland Indians in the 1st round (31st overall) out of Tullahoma High School (TN)...has appeared in parts of 3 Major League seasons with the New York Yankees (2018) and Mariners (2019-c), going 4-4 with a 4.65 ERA (46 ER, 89.0 IP) with 84 strikeouts and 39 walks in 20 career games (16 starts)...**vs. OAK:** Is scheduled to make his 3rd career start against the A's...is 0-1, 4.66 (5 ER, 9.2 IP) in 2 career games (2 GS) against the Oaklanders.
