THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY APRIL 1

1997 - Larry Dierker, who served as an Astros broadcaster from 1979-96, wins his debut as Astros manager, 2-1, over the Braves in the Astrodome...Dierker would manage the Astros for five seasons (1997-2001), winning 435 games, which ranks third in Astros managerial history.

OPENING DAY: The Houston Astros franchise, which has made four straight trips to the American League Championship Series, will open their 60th season of baseball tonight with an Opening Day matchup against the A's in Oakland...this marks Houston's first Opening Day game vs. Oakland in franchise history.

ROAD STARTS: Tonight marks the 18th time in franchise history for the Astros to open the season on the road...they are 8-9 thus far when they open on the road and 31-28 all-time in season openers.

EIGHT STRAIGHT: The Astros have won a club record eight straight games on Opening Day (2013-20), which is the longest Opening Day streak in the Majors since the Orioles also had an eight-game streak from 2011-18...per Elias, since 1900, only four clubs have won nine straight season openers, the Mariners (2007-15), Reds (1983-91), Mets (1975-83) and St. Louis Browns (1937-45).

OPENING DAY VETERAN: RHP Zack Greinke is making his fifth career Opening Day start, also doing so for the Royals (2010) and D-backs (2016-17, 2019)... tonight, the 17-year Major League veteran can do something he's never done before, win on Opening Day, as he checks in with a lifetime 0-1 record and an 8.20 ERA (17ER/18.2IP) in his Opening Day starts.

THE OPENING DAY ROSTER: The Astros have set their Opening Day roster, which includes 13 pitchers and 13 position players...four players on the club are making their first appearance on an Opening Day roster: DH Yordan Alvarez, RHP Brandon Bielak, RHP Luis Garcia, IF Robel García, OF Chas Mc-Cormick and RHP José Urquidy.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: The Astros finalized their roster by optioning LHP Kent Emanuel, RHP Jake Odorizzi, C Garret Stubbs and IF Abraham Toro...Stubbs and Toro remain with the club as part of the Taxi Squad.

THE TAXI SQUAD: The Astros five-man Taxi Squad for this road trip consists of RHP Ralph Garza Jr., RHP Nivaldo Rodriguez, RHP Peter Solomon, C Garrett Stubbs and IF Abraham Toro.

AT THE HELM: Tonight marks the 24th Opening Day as a manager for Astros skipper Dusty Baker and his second at the helm in Houston...Baker, now the only manager in MLB history to take five different teams to the Postseason, enters the season ranking 15th all time in managerial wins (1,892), immediately trailing HOFer Bill McKechnie (1,896) on that all-time list.

IN THE BOX: Tonight is also the second Opening Day for the Astros under General Manager James Click, who was named the 13th GM in club history in February of 2020...Click and his staff had an eventful 2020 campaign, as the crew built an ALCS roster, which sustained 20 different players spending time on the IL, including season ending injuries from RHP Justin Verlander and DH Yordan Alvarez.

GO ASTROS DAY: The Astros are celebrating Go Astros Day back in Houston today with various promotions throughout the city, including retail opportunities, surprise visits by Orbit and the Shooting Stars and a Happy Hour at Karbach Brewing Company. additionally, the City of Houston will light up City Hall and the city's airports and bridges in Astros colors.

V'S THE A'S: The Astros and A's will renew their rivalry tonight in the first of a scheduled 19 matchups between the two club's this season...the A's got the best of the Astros in the 2020 regular season, taking eight of the 10 matchups, but Houston answered the bell in the Postseason, dispatching the A's in four games in the ALDS, played in Dodger Stadium...if there was an MVP awarded for the series, it would have gone to SS Carlos Correa, who hit .500 (7x14) with three homers and 11 RBI in the four contests.

YES WAY JOSE!: 2B Jose Altuve is making his 10th career Opening Day start (2012-21), making him just the fourth player in franchise history to start double-digit Opening Day games, joining 1B Jeff Bagwell (15 starts), 2B Craig Biggio (14 starts) and OF Jose Cruz (11 starts)...Altuve is a career .294 (10x34) hitter on Opening Day.

AIR YORDAN: DH Yordan Alvarez, the 2019 Rookie of the Year, returns to the field tonight after a COVID diagnosis and a series of knee injuries limited him to just two games played in 2020...he underwent surgery on both of his knees in August of 2020 and will be back on the field tonight for his first Opening Day start.

EXHIBITION SEASON OVER: The Astros completed their exhibition season with a 6-14-4 record in Grapefruit League play...the Astros got strong Springs from SS Carlos Correa (.308, 12x39), RF Michael Brantley (11 RBI) and CF Myles Straw (.310, 13x42).

CREDENTIAL DEADLINE: The deadline to apply for credentials for the Astros Home Opener on April 8 vs. OAK is Monday at 7 p.m. CT...credentials can be applied for at Credentials.mlb.com...due to spacing limitations, the Astros will be very limited on the number of credentials issued each game.

ASTROS EN ESPAÑOL: Tonight's Astros Spanish radio broadcast, featuring Francisco Romero and Alex Treviño, can be heard exclusively on the MLB App...the Astros will announce their on-air Spanish radio partner in the coming weeks.

LAST START - 2020 ALCS Game 4 vs. TB: pitched Houston to a 4-3 win in Game 4 of the 2020 ALCS...gave up 2 runs on 5 hits over 6.0 innings pitched, striking out 7 with 1 walk...earned his first postseason win since 2015.

LAST REG. SEASON START - 9/23/20 at SEA: ended the 2020 regular season campaign with a 4.2-inning, 3-run outing...walked 1 and struck out 5 in Houston's 3-2 defeat.

LAST SPRING START - FRIDAY vs. MIA: gave up 3 runs in 4.1 innings pitched in his final outing of 2021 Spring Training...struck out 5 with 3 walks allowed

OPENING DAY DAY: the 6-time All-Star is set to make his 5th-career Opening Day start, and his first since 2019 when he was a member of the D-backs (March 28 at LAD, 7ER/3.2IP).

· has gone 0-2 in his 4 career Opening Day starts.

THIS SPRING: went 0-2 with a 3.55 ERA (5ER/12.2IP), 4 walks and 11 strikeouts in 4 starting assignments this Spring.

KEEP CHUGGING: the future Hall of Famer will begin his 18th Major League season today.

- tonight's start will mark the 460th of his Major League career, the most among active Major Leaguers.
- ranks 79th in MLB history in career starts, trailing Curt Simmons and Bob Welch for T-77th all-time (462).

THE 2020 CAMPAIGN: led the Astros with 12 starts, finishing 2nd among AL pitchers in Fangraphs WAR (2.1) behind only **Shane Bieber** (3.2).

- among AL pitchers, ranked 2nd in walks per 9.0 innings (1.21), 3rd in strikeout to walk ratio (7.44), T-4th in HR/9.0 innings (0.81), 10th in WHIP (1.13) and T-10th in innings pitched (67IP).
- posted a career-low 3.3% walk rate, as he walked just 9 batters in 67.0 innings pitched and 273 batters faced...walked 2 batters-or-fewer in all 12 of his starts.

WITH THE 'STROS: was acquired by the Astros from the D-backs along with cash considerations on July 31, minutes before the trade deadline...in exchange for Greinke, the Astros sent 4 prospects to Arizona: IF Seth Beer, RHP J.B. Bukauskas, RHP Corbin Martin and IF Joshua Rojas.

- in 23 regular season starts with the Astros since joining the club last season, has gone 11-4 with a 3.54 (51ER/129.2IP) and 119 strikeouts.
- since making his first start with Houston on Aug. 6, 2019, ranks among the top-10 AL pitchers in wins (T-3rd), strikeouts (8th) and innings pitched (5th).
- per Elias Sports, became the 2nd pitcher in Astros history to win 11 of his first 12 decisions with the club, joining Juan Agosto.

TRUE ATHLETE: went the entire 2020 season without making an error... ranked T-2nd among AL pitchers in total chances (16), 2nd in putouts (9) and T-10th in assists (7).

 last made an error on July 5, 2019 vs. COL...has gone 26 consecutive starts and 153.2 innings without making an error.

HOUSTON STATE OF MIND: has gone undefeated at Minute Maid Park in his Astros career...in 11 games at the venue since joining the Astros, has gone 7-0 with a 3.71 ERA (26ER/63IP).
