HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs are 7-2 in their last 9 home games dating back to 2020.

- ♦ Arizona is 8-2 in its last 10 games vs. A's @ Chase Field.
- The D-backs won both games @ home in 2020, winning 4-3 and 10-1.
- ♦ Madison Bumgarner is 4-0 with a 3.06 ERA (12 ER in 35.1 IP) in his last 6 starts vs. A's.

ESCOBAR DOING GOOD OFF THE FIELD...: On Saturday and Sunday, Eduardo Escobar, the D-backs' Roberto Clemente Award nominee in 2019-20, gave 30 frontline workers (doctors, nurses and their families) an autographed baseball and a gift card to his favorite restaurant, Fogo de Chao, as part of our salute to frontline workers.

AND ON THE FIELD: Eduardo Escobar has homered in 4 consecutive games, tying a club record (sixth time; last Mark Trumbo from April 3-6, 2014).

- ♦ D-backs to have homered in 4 games in a row: Mark Trumbo (April 3-5, 2014), Mark Reynolds (Aug. 6-9, 2009), Troy Glaus (April 6-10, 2005 and Sept. 9-13, 2005) and Reggie Sanders (April 17-21, 2001).
- ♦ The last player to homer in 5 straight games was Bobby Dalbac/BOS (Sept. 5-10, 2020) and the last in the NL was Max Muncy/LAD (Aug. 15-21, 2019).

BEST OF LUCK: The D-backs would like to congratulate longtime A's equipment manager, Steve "Vuc" Vucinich, on his retirement following the season, his 54th with Oakland.

♦ Vucinich, who has a home in Phoenix, is the only remaining team employee from the move to the Bay Area in

LOCASTRO SETS MLB RECORD: On Saturday, Tim Locastro set a Major League record with his 28th consecutive stolen base attempt to start his career (since 1951), breaking a tie with Hall of Famer and Arizona resident Tim Raines (1979-81).

- ♦ Raines was Locastro's first base running coach in the Blue Jays' organization in 2013.
- ♦ Locastro's 28 straight stolen-base streak is tied for the 23rd longest all-time...next up is 30-steal streaks by Alcides Escobar/KC (2012-14), Mike Trout/LAA (2012), Jimmy Rollins/PHI (2009-10) and Eric Byrnes/ARI (2007).
 - · Vince Coleman/STL holds the Major League record with 50 straight steals (1988-89) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

PERALTA CLIMBING THE CHARTS: David Peralta, who hit a 3-run homer vesterday, needs 1 roundtripper to break a tie with Jay Bell (91) and gain sole possession of ninth place in franchise history

Peralta is 4 hits shy of tying Stephen Drew (776) for fifth place on the club's all-time list.

NEXT STARTER: RHP ZAC GALLEN (FIRST START)

- ♦ Is expected to be reinstated from the 10-day injured list (right forearm hairline stress fracture of radial head) prior to tomorrow's game.
- ♦ Named the 2020 D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona Chapter of the BBWAA after going 3-2 with a 2.75 ERA (22 ER in 72.0 IP), 82 strikeouts, .210 opponent average and 1.11 WHIP in 12 starts.
- Tied for ninth in NL Cy Young voting (2 5th place votes).
- Set the Major League record with 23 games allowing 3 or fewer earned runs to begin a career (all starts), surpassing the 21-game stretch by Aaron Sele/BOS, June 23, 1993-April 19, 1994.
- ♦ Did not factor in the decision in his only career start vs. A's on Aug. 17, 2020 @ Chase Field (1 ER in 7.0 IP).
