RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers dropped their second consecutive game last night in Oakland, falling by a 3-0 margin. José Ureña started for the Tigers and was generally dominant, tossing 7.0 innings and allowing two earned runs on seven hits and two walks, while striking out a career-high eight batters. The game was Detroit's first time this season being shut out, though four Tigers had hits scattered over the course of the contest: Robbie Grossman, Willi Castro, Wilson Ramos and Victor Reyes.

STARTERS ARE STREAKING: José Ureña's performance last night extended Detroit's streak of starting pitching success. The outing marked the sixth consecutive one in which the Tigers starting pitcher has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs. That streak dates back to the series finale in Cleveland, and has seen the starters post a combined 2.10 ERA (34.1IP/8ER), on 25 hits and 15 walks, while striking out 28 batters. That starter ERA ranks tied for second in the American League and tied for fourth in the Majors over that span. The last time Detroit starting pitching has posted a streak longer than this current one was seven-straight games, from March 31-April 7, 2019. The current streak is comprised of the below performances:

WHEN THE STUFF AND RESULTS LINE UP...: Posting one of the best outings of his career, José Ureña was on point last night, tossing 7.0 innings and allowing just two earned runs on seven hits and two walks, while striking out a career high eight batters. It marked the first time in 2021, and seventh time since the start of 2018, that a Tigers pitcher has tossed at least 7.0 innings, allowed no more than two earned runs and struck out at least eight in an outing (last, Matthew Boyd on August 18, 2019 at Tampa Bay). Ureña's "stuff" has been electric all season, and the results are starting to come into form. Among American League pitchers with at least three starts coming into action today, he ranks second in average horizontal break (10.6 inches), tied for fifth in average pitch velocity (91.7 MPH) and eighth in average vertical break (-24.1 inches).

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS: Coming into today's game on a two-game skid, the Tigers are looking to turn their fortunes against scheduled Athletics starter Cole Irvin. Dating back to the start of 2010, Detroit has mashed against lefthanded starting pitchers, leading all Major League teams in the three slashline categories (.271/.335/.433). In games where the opposing team starts a lefthanded pitcher over that span, the Tigers have gone 245-226 (.520 win percentage) overall, but just 46-67 (.407 win percentage) against teams from the American League West.

NOTES ON A.J. HINCH: A.J. Hinch was named the 39th manager in Detroit Tigers history on October 30, 2020. *Enters today's game with a 6-8 (.429) record as the Tigers manager and 576-460 (.556) career record... he leads active Major League managers (min. seven seasons) in career win percentage.

*Has a history with Detroit's opponent this series, as he was drafted out of Stanford University by Oakland in the third round of the 1996 MLB Draft. Hinch went on to play 202 games for the Athletics in three seasons, posting a combined .225/.284/.342 slashline, with 16 home runs and 59 RBI.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Drove in a run with a RBI double in the second inning of Wednesday's game at Houston...with the RBI, drove in at least one RBI in seven of the first nine games of his career, the second player in franchise history to do so, joining Dale Alexander (1929)...was also the ninth Major League player to begin their career with RBI in seven of their first nine games and the first to do so since Jorge Soler, who had at least one RBI in seven of his first nine games in 2014.• Belted his fourth home run of the season in Tuesday's game at Houston...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first player in Tigers history to have four home runs in his first eight Major League games and the first big leaguer to have four-or-more homers and 10-or more RBI in his first eight games since Kyle Lewis in 2019.• Enters today's game leading all Major League rookies (min. 30 plate appearances) with four home runs, while he is second with a .765 slugging percentage, tied for second with 11 RBI, tied for fifth with a .294 batting average and tied for ninth with a .306 on-base percentage.• Continued his storybook start to Major League life on April 6, entering the game as a pinch runner in the eighth inning and later coming through with a clutch walk-off single in the 10th...his heroics made him the first Tiger rookie to have a walk-off hit since Dixon Machado on September 18, 2015 vs. Kansas City...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the effort also made him the first player in the Modern Era (since 1900) to have multiple HRs, including a grand slam, and also record a walk-off hit within the first three games of his career.• Made his second straight start on April 5 vs. Minnesota, going 2x4 with a grand slam in the ninth inning...also hit a homer on April 4 in his Major League debut, becoming the first Tiger in franchise history to hit a home run in each of his first two career games, and fifth to drive in four-or-more runs in either of his first two career games (last, Alex Avila on August 7, 2009).• Got the start in left field on April 4 against Cleveland, and made his Major League debut with a bang, launching a homer on the first pitch of his first career at-bat...became the ninth Tigers player in franchise history to hit a homer in his first plate appearance, joining Sergio Alcántara (2020) and Daniel Norris (2015) as recent occurrences...prior to Daniel Norris in 2015, the last Tiger to do so was Reggie Sanders in 1974...the last Major Leaguer to hit a homer on the first pitch he's seen was Willson Contreras, who did so with the Cubs in 2016.
