**RECENT RESULTS:** Falling via shutout for the second consecutive contest, the Tigers dropped game three of the series in Oakland yesterday, 7-0. Robbie Grossman posted a pair of hits, and finished 2x4, while Jeimer Candelario, Victor Reyes and JaCoby Jones also added knocks throughout the game. On the mound, Casey Mize got the start but took the loss, allowing five earned runs on seven hits and no walks, while striking out four over 5.0 innings pitched. Daniel Norris and Alex Lange both bounced back from outings in which they allowed an earned run, tossing 1.0 and 1.1 scoreless innings of relief, respectively.

**FAMILIAR FACES & PLACES:** Playing back-to-back series against clubs he formerly played for, Robbie Grossman has been seeing the ball well over his last handful of games. Dating back to the series finale in Houston, where he played for the first three seasons of his career (2013-15), Grossman has gone 6x18, including hits in four straight. The later three games in that stretch have come in Oakland, where he played the 2019-20 seasons before signing with the Tigers. Yesterday he posted the second multi-hit game of that span, going 2x4.

**BOYD OH BOYD HE'S LOOKING GOOD:** After earning his second consecutive Opening Day start to begin this season, Matthew Boyd has proven to be one of Detroit's most reliable pitchers. Over three starts in 2021, he's posted a combined 2-1 record and 1.86 ERA (19.1IP/4ER), on 16 hits and five walks, while striking out 14 batters. Perhaps most notably, he's yet to surrender a home run this year, after leading the American League with 15 during the pandemic-shortened 2020 campaign. Among qualified AL pitchers this season, he ranks eighth in ERA and 10th in slugging percent allowed (.268).

**HOMEWARD BOUND:** Following today's series and road trip finale in Oakland, the Tigers will head home for a seven-game stretch at Comerica Park. So far on this road trip, Detroit has posted a 3-6 record, including three losses in Cleveland, three wins in Houston and three losses so far against the Athletics. In those three wins, the Tigers plated 20 total runs and allowed just eight, while they've been outscored by a 38-10 margin in the losses. On the upcoming homestand, Detroit will face Pittsburgh from April 20-22 for the club's first interleague action of the season, and Kansas City from April 23-26 for a four-game weekend wrap-around series.

**NOTES ON A.J. HINCH:** A.J. Hinch was named the 39th manager in Detroit Tigers history on October 30, 2020. \*Enters today's game with a 6-9 (.400) record as the Tigers manager and 576-461 (.555) career record... he leads active Major League managers (min. seven seasons) in career win percentage. \*Has a history with Detroit's opponent this series, as he was drafted out of Stanford University by Oakland in the third round of the 1996 MLB Draft. Hinch went on to play 202 games for the Athletics in three seasons, posting a combined .225/.284/.342 slashline, with 16 home runs and 59 RBI.

\*Managed the Houston Astros from 2015-19, leading the club to the playoffs four times in five seasons, including in his first year as manager in 2015, snapping a nine-year drought for Houston and posting a 16-win improvement from the previous year.

Today's start at Oakland

- Boyd will make his fourth start of the season this afternoon at Oakland...picked up his second win of the season on Tuesday at Houston, allowing one run on six hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 6.2 innings...has thrown at least 6.2 innings and allowed three runs-or-less in back-to-back starts for the fourth time in his career (last, April 16-23, 2019).
- Today will mark Boyd's third career start against the Athletics...has posted a 0-1 record with a 5.56 ERA (11.1IP/7ER) and 15 strikeouts in his previous two starts...last faced Oakland on May 18, 2019 and took the loss, giving up four runs on seven hits with eight strikeouts in 6.1 innings...has pitched at the Oakland Coliseum just once in his career on May 28, 2016, when he received a no decision after allowing three runs on six hits with seven strikeouts over 5.0 innings.
- Boyd has struggled in his career against teams from the American League West, posting a 7-10 record with a 4.91 ERA (124.2IP/68ER) and 121 strikeouts.
- Entering today's game, Boyd ranks sixth in the American League with 19.1 innings pitched and eighth with a 1.86 ERA (19.1IP/4ER).

2021 Regular Season

- Has had a strong start to the season, posting a 1.86 ERA (19.1IP/4ER) through his first three starts...marks his best start to a season since 2018, when he had a 1.40 ERA (19.1IP/3ER)...is yet to surrender a homer this season, a positive sign after leading the American League with 15 allowed in 2020.
- Made his second consecutive Opening Day start on April 1 vs. Cleveland, and earned the win after throwing 5.2 scoreless innings with three hits allowed, four walks and two strikeouts...marked the 13th time in franchise history that a Tigers Opening Day starter has thrown at least 5.0 shutout innings (last, Jordan Zimmermann on March 28, 2019 at Toronto)...Boyd became the first Tigers lefthanded since Mickey Lolich (1970-74) to make consecutive Opening Day starts.

2020 Regular Season

- Posted a 3-7 record and 6.71 ERA (60.1IP/45ER) on 67 hits, 22 walks and 60 strikeouts during the club's 58-game sprint season...started his year 0-4, but won three of his final six outings.
- On the season there was a significant difference between his expected stats and the results that bore out on the field...among qualified starting pitchers last season, he had the highest difference between actual and expected rates in the following categories: batting average (.278 actual vs. .234 expected), slugging percentage (.552 vs. .456), ISO (.274 vs. .221) and wOBA (.378 vs. .329).
- Tossed the second complete game of his career in the first game of the doubleheader on September 4 at Minnesota...punched out eight hitters over 6.0 innings pitched, but took the loss after allowing two solo home runs...became the first Tigers pitcher to throw a complete game and take the loss since Michael Fulmer on May 27, 2017 at Chicago (AL).
- Posted a season high in strikeouts on August 17 at Chicago (AL), punching out nine over just 4.0 innings pitched. Lefthanded batters hit just .135 (5x37) off him this season, while righties batted .304 (62x204).
- Threw 1,086 total pitches, which was the 10th highest total for any American League pitcher in 2020...also led Tigers pitchers in starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.

Work in the Community

- In September of 2018, Matthew and his wife, Ashley, launched Kingdom Home, a nonprofit organization that exists to end child sex slavery through prevention, with a donation of \$100,000. Located in Uganda, Kingdom Home provides a place of refuge, restoration and hope for children at risk. Nearly 200 children, both girls and boys, have been rescued from sex trafficking, gender-based violence, forced child marriages and abandonment. The home not only helps to restore children, but also protects them, and reduces the likelihood that they would re-enter the sex trade or exploitative labor.
- In addition to Kingdom Home, Boyd is a very active member in the Detroit and Lakeland communities. During the 2020 season he played a significant role in the club's efforts in the area of COVID-19 prevention and relief, while continuing to help in other important spaces such as honoring veterans, first responders and those in need.
- For the second consecutive year, Boyd contributed and served as a spokesman for the Detroit Tigers participation in MLB's league wide Home Plate Project which, in 2020, resulted in a gift of \$30,000 to Detroit Public Schools Community District to help feed students as a result of the unanticipated school closures due to COVID-19.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Drove in a run with a RBI double in the second inning of Wednesday's game at Houston...with the RBI, drove in at least one RBI in seven of the first nine games of his career, the second player in franchise history to do so, joining Dale Alexander (1929)...was also the ninth Major League player to begin their career with RBI in seven of their first nine games and the first to do so since Jorge Soler, who had at least one RBI in seven of his first nine games in 2014.</li><li>• Belted his fourth home run of the season in Tuesday's game at Houston...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first player in Tigers history to have four home runs in his first eight Major League games and the first big leaguer to have four-or-more homers and 10-or more RBI in his first eight games since Kyle Lewis in 2019.</li><li>• Enters today's game leading all Major League rookies (min. 30 plate appearances) with four home runs and a .765 slugging percentage, while he is tied for second with 11 RBI and sixth with a .294 batting average.</li><li>• Continued his storybook start to Major League life on April 6, entering the game as a pinch runner in the eighth inning and later coming through with a clutch walk-off single in the 10th...his heroics made him the first Tiger rookie to have a walk-off hit since Dixon Machado on September 18, 2015 vs. Kansas City...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the effort also made him the first player in the Modern Era (since 1900) to have multiple HRs, including a grand slam, and also record a walk-off hit within the first three games of his career.</li><li>• Made his second straight start on April 5 vs. Minnesota, going 2x4 with a grand slam in the ninth inning...also hit a homer on April 4 in his Major League debut, becoming the first Tiger in franchise history to hit a home run in each of his first two career games, and fifth to drive in four-or-more runs in either of his first two career games (last, Alex Avila on August 7, 2009).</li><li>• Got the start in left field on April 4 against Cleveland, and made his Major League debut with a bang, launching a homer on the first pitch of his first career at-bat...became the ninth Tigers player in franchise history to hit a homer in his first plate appearance, joining Sergio Alcántara (2020) and Daniel Norris (2015) as recent occurrences...prior to Daniel Norris in 2015, the last Tiger to do so was Reggie Sanders in 1974...the last Major Leaguer to hit a homer on the first pitch he's seen was Willson Contreras, who did so with the Cubs in 2016.</li></ul>
