LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the first of six games on a Bay Area road trip to Oakland (May 27-30) and San Francisco (May 31-June 1)...Angels went 5-5 on last homestand against the Cleveland Indians (1-3), Minnesota Twins (1-1 doubleheader split), Oakland Athletics (1-2) and Texas Rangers (2-0)...Angels went 2-4 on last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Boston (1-2), earning their victories in the first and last games of the trip.

WELCOME BACK FANS!: Friday, the Angels announced Angel Stadium will return to full capacity beginning June 17 vs. Detroit...Single game tickets for all remaining regular season home games will go on sale to the general public on tomorrow, May 28th at 9:00 a.m. PT...Registered users on Angels.com have access to a special presale which began this morning at 9:00 a.m...Beginning on June 17th, in accordance with the updated California and MLB health guidelines, guests will be required to wear a mask unless they are prepared to provide proof of full vaccination or a recent negative Covid test...A complete listing of protocols and stadium policy information is available at angels.com/protocols.

TITLE CHANGES: Matt Wise and Dom Chiti are now officially the Angels Pitching Coach and Bullpen Coach respectively, after previously serving in those roles on an interim basis since the start of Spring Training.

CONGRATS JOE: Yesterday, Joe Maddon earned his 1300th career victory as a manager...He is the 34th manager all-time to reach the mark and the fourth active skipper to do so, joining Tony La Russa (2756), Dusty Baker (1919) and Terry Francona (1728).

RO SHOW: Jose Rojas has hit 12 doubles this season, which is second most in Angels history after 36 career games; only Howie Kendrick (13) had more...Friday night vs. Oakland, Rojas registered his first two career outfield assists...He was the first Angels outfielder with multiple assists in a game since Justin Upton on April 18, 2018 vs. Boston.

WINS AND LOSSES: Angels have won three straight games (matches longest streak of season - also won three in a row April 3-5), since falling to season-low mark of eight games under .500 (19-27) on May 22...LAA stayed at or above .500 through their first 18 games of a season for the first time since 2005, but have been under .500 since May 3.

FOUR SCORE: Angels are 21-8 when scoring 4+ runs this season and are 1-19 when scoring three-or-fewer.

LEAGUE LEADERS:

Shohei Ohtani is tied for the Major League lead in extra-base hits (29), is third in total bases (109), tied for third with 15 home runs, fourth with a .626 slugging percentage, tied for fourth with three triples and is tied for sixth with 38 RBI.

Jared Walsh ranks fourth in the American League in batting average (.321) and OPS (.968), sixth in slugging (.583), tied for seventh in hits (54), is eighth in OBP (.385), tied for eighth in RBI (37) and is tied for ninth in total bases (98).

THAT'S RIGHT: Angels have recorded 16 of their 22 wins this season in games against a right-handed starting pitcher... Angels have won each of last four games vs. a left-handed starter after starting 2-7 against them...Halos are 6-10 this season when the opposing primary pitcher is left-handed (6-7 vs. left-handed starters; plus three games where left-handed primary pitcher followed a right-handed starter).

LINEUP SHUFFLE: Angels have used six different players as the leadoff hitter across the last 14 games after David Fletcher served as leadoff man in each of first 35 games this season.

PARTY STARTER: Sunday, Justin Upton made his first career start from the leadoff spot in his 1,778th career Major League game...Upton has hit leadoff home runs each of the last two days for the Angels, becoming the first LAA player to accomplish the feat since rookie Mike Trout on Sept. 8-9, 2012.

GLOVE HURTS: Angels have made a Major League leading 40 errors this season, but have gone errorless in 10 of last 16 games...Halos are 6-16 when committing an error in 2021...LAA has had five games this season with 3+ errors (most in Majors)...Halos committed 36 errors during 60-game 2020 season.

VS. OAKLAND: Today's game marks the fourth (1-2) of 19 meetings this season between the Angels and A's (10 at Angel Stadium & nine at the Coliseum)...Angels lost two of three meetings at Angel Stadium this past weekend.

AGAINST THE A's: In 36 career games against the A's, David Fletcher is batting .323 (41/127) with seven doubles, one home run and 10 RBI...Shohei Ohtani has hit eight career home runs against the A's, which is his second most against any opponent (has 9 HR vs. Texas).

HOO-RAY GOOSE: Last week, Phil Gosselin earned his Bachelor's Degree in Economics from the University of Virginia.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Inland Empire's Ryan Smith was named the Low-A West Pitcher of the Week for May 17-23 after tossing six scoreless innings with 13 strikeouts in his May 21 start vs. Modesto...Salt Lake's Packy Naughton carried a no-hitter through 7.2 innings on Sunday at Las Vegas...Jo Adell leads all of Minor League Baseball with 10 home runs this season for Salt Lake.

TROUT TO THE IL: Last Tuesday, the Angels placed OF Mike Trout on the injured list with a right calf strain...An estimated return to play is 6-8 weeks...At the time of his IL placement, he led the Majors in OBP (.466) and OPS (1.090) and ranked fourth (led A.L.) in slugging percentage (.624).

ACROSS THE BAY: Following the current series in Oakland, the Angels will continue the road trip with a pair of games against the San Francisco Giants (May 31-June 1)...The Angels and Giants will meet a total of four times this season (teams will meet again June 22-23 at Angel Stadium following the upcoming weekend series in San Francisco)...Last season, the Giants won the season series 3-1; teams split a pair of games at Angel Stadium (Aug. 17-18, 2020) and Giants swept two game set at Oracle Park (Aug. 19-20, 2020).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - RHP SHOHEI OHTANI

1-0, 2.37 ERA

Has struck out 34.9% of batters faced, which is sixth best rate in A.L. (min. 30 IP)

- SHO TIME:** Making seventh start of the season as a pitcher and third on the road...Limited to two starts as a pitcher in 2020...Did not pitch during 2019 season, while recovering from Tommy John surgery.
- OFF THE BOARD:** Enters tonight's game having allowed three earned runs in his last 20.2 innings pitched (1.31 ERA)...Has not been charged with a run in 27 of the 32 innings he has thrown a pitch in this season.
- DON'T NEED A DH:** Has batted for himself in four of six pitching starts this season; is batting .364 (4/11) with one double, one HR and 3 RBI as a pitcher...Became first Angels starting pitcher to bat for himself in an A.L. game since the designated hitter rule was implemented in 1973...Was first Angels starting pitcher to hit a home run since **Clyde Wright** (Sept. 8, 1972 - Game 2 @ CWS).
- ANGELS STRIKEOUT RECORDS:** Has recorded 111 career strikeouts, which is a Club record through 18 career games as a pitcher...His total is already a record through 19 games as well (previous: **Jered Weaver** - 105).
- LAST TIME ON THE MOUND:** Did not factor in decision in last start on May 19 vs. Cleveland after tossing 4.2 innings and allowing two earned runs on five hits with two walks and five strikeouts...Moved to RF after pitching.
- PLAYING THE FIELD:** Has moved to the outfield twice after pitching starts this season...On May 11 at Houston, finished in right field after tossing season-high 7.0 innings and allowing one earned run with a season-high 10 SO...Became third player since 1900 to strike out 10+ batters and play another position in the same game. (ELIAS).
- SWING AND A MISS:** Has a 37.4% swing and miss rate this season, which ranks second in A.L. (min. 30 IP), behind **Shane Bieber** (38.3%)...Led Major League starters (min. 10 GS) with a 35.1% swing and miss rate in 2018...Recorded 57 of 63 (90.5%) SO in 2018 on a swinging strike three.
- THE SPLITTER:** This season, batters are 2-for-42 (.049) against his splitter with 30 SO...Has held opponents to an .050 (5/100) batting average against the splitter since 2018...Recorded 67 of 111 strikeouts with the pitch
- BRINGING THE HEAT:** Has reached 100 MPH with nine pitches this year...Fastest pitch was clocked at 101.1 MPH...Has tossed two of the six fastest pitches by a starter this season...Among starting pitchers, only **Jacob deGrom** (61) and **Shane Bieber** (10) have thrown more pitches at 100+ MPH this year.
- VS. OAKLAND:** In three career games vs. A's, is 2-1 with a 5.54 ERA (13 IP - 8 ER)...Went 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA (13 IP - 3 ER) with 18 strikeouts against the A's in his two starts in 2018, but allowed five runs without recording an out in last start vs. Oakland on July 26, 2020...Finest pitching performance of big league career came vs. Oakland on Apr. 8, 2018 at Angel Stadium (W; 7 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 12 SO) and carried a perfect game into the 7th inning.
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** In two games at the Coliseum, is 1-1 with a 12.00 ERA (6 IP - 8 ER)...Made first big league start on April 1, 2018 (W; 6 IP, 3 H, 3 ER, 1 BB, 6 SO) in Oakland...All three runs allowed in that contest came on three-run HR by **Matt Chapman** in second inning...Did not record an out (6 BF) in last start on July 26, 2020.
- DAY & NIGHT:** In seven career starts in day games, is 4-1 with a 3.89 ERA (34.2 IP - 15 ER) and 47 strikeouts, compared with a 1-2 record and a 3.49 ERA (49 IP - 19 ER) and 64 strikeouts in night games (11 GS).
- TWO-WAY, YEAR 3:** Is the first player to make multiple starts as a pitcher and non-pitcher in three MLB seasons since **Johnny Cooney** did so in six seasons for the Boston Braves (1923-26, '28-29). (ELIAS).
- JAPANESE HALOS:** Is one of five Japanese-born players to play for Angels, along with **Shigetoshi Hasegawa**, **Hideki Matsui**, **Hisanori Takahashi** and **Junichi Tazawa**.
- PITCHING CAREER IN JAPAN:** In 85 career games (82 starts) as a pitcher for Nippon-Ham Fighters in Japanese Pacific League, went 42-15 with a 2.52 ERA (543 IP - 152 ER) and 624 strikeouts.
- MLB CAREER NOTES:** Signed with Angels as international free agent, Dec. 10, 2017...Made Major League debut as a DH on March 29, 2018 at Oakland and had first start as a pitcher on April 1, 2018 at Oakland...Named the 2018 American League Rookie of the Year...In 2018, joined **Babe Ruth** (1918 & 1919) as the only players since 1900 with 10+ HR and 4+ wins as a pitcher in a single campaign.
