- The Blue Jays improved to 4-1 in interleague games this year as they completed their all-NL five-game homestand with a 7-2 win over Atlanta yesterday... Completed their 1st sweep of the season as they took all three games from the Braves...Scored 26 runs and hit nine homers in the series, reaching both marks in a three-game series for the 7th time in team history (courtesy Stats Perform).
- Toronto is now 7-4 after the first 11 games at TD Ballpark...Has now won seven of its last nine games overall and sits two games over .500 for the first time since April 5 (3-1)...Have a chance at its 1st four-game winning streak of the season.

MULTIPLE EXTRAS FROM MARCUS:

- Marcus Semien hit his 6th home run of the season yesterday, a two-run shot off Sean Newcomb in the 8th inning...Also picked up his 1st double of the year, driving in a pair of runs in the 3rd.
- The second baseman finished the game 2-for-4 with a season-high four RBI...Marked his 7th multi-hit game of the season and his 1st with multiple XBH...Had nine multi-hit efforts in 53 games last season.

VLAD GRABS HONDA POTM:

- Vladimir Guerrero Jr. drew a walk yesterday and has reached base in all but one of the Blue Jays' 26 games this season...Has now reached base an MLB-high 54 times, four more than any other player...The 54 times on base are tied for 4th most all-time by a Blue Jay in the first 26 games of a season (last: Jose Bautista – 55 in 2014).
- Among AL hitters, the 22-year-old currently ranks 2nd in OBP (.486, 2nd in MLB), 2nd in walks (22, 3rd in MLB), 4th in OPS (1.146, 5th in MLB), 7th in AVG (.337, 8th in MLB), T-5th in SLG (.628, T-9th in MLB), T-6th in home runs (7, T-12th in MLB) and T-9th in RBI (20, T-15th in MLB).
- Earlier today, Jr. was named Toronto's Honda Player of the Month for April...Hit .350 (28-for-80) over 24 games with four doubles, seven homers, 20 RBI and a 20BB/16K ratio...His .490 OBP for the month of April ranked 6th best by a Blue Jay all-time (last: Jose Bautista - .532 in 2011) while his 20 walks ranked 9th (last: Bautista - 21 in 2016) and his 1.153 OPS also finished 9th (last: Bautista - 1.312 in 2011).

BO'S STATUS QUO:

- Bo Bichette went 2-for-5 with an RBI yesterday on a single and a double...Tied Guerrero Jr. and Grichuk for the team lead in multi-hit games this season (9).
- The 23-year-old now has 57 career extra-base hits, tied with Ted Williams for 6th most all-time by a player in his first 101 career contests...His 230 total bases in that span are 11th most all-time...His 126 hits are the most in Blue Jays history by a player in his first 101 career games (2nd: Alex Rios 113).

LEFT THEFT:

Randal Grichuk singled twice and scored twice as part of a 2-for-4 day, his 9th multi-hit game of the season... Has gone 13-for-41 (.317) with four home runs and nine RBI over his last 10 games (.959 OPS)...Singled off another lefty and is now hitting .462 (12-for-26) vs. LHP, tied with Byron Buxton for the highest in the AL.

- The Blue Jays are kicking off a 10-game, 11-day road trip...Have gone 7-8 on the road so far...The 15 road games trail only DET (16) and LAA (16) for the most among AL clubs...After this four-game series, will travel to Houston (15-13) and Atlanta (12-16) for three games each around an off-day on Monday.
- Toronto batters have hit .213 in road games so far this season (12th in the AL) while scoring 3.27 runs/game (14th)...Conversely, have scored an AL-high 6.45 R/G at home...The pitching staff has posted an MLBbest 3.03 ERA during away affairs to go with a .227 AVG (6th in the AL) and a 1.19 WHIP (4th).

DANNY'S DONUT IS DONE:

Danny Jansen snapped a franchise-tying 0-for-35 hitless streak (also: Ed Sprague in 1994) with an RBI single in the 2nd inning yesterday...Marked his 1st RBI of the season...Also had his 1st multi-hit game of the year, finishing the day 2-for-3 with a walk.

MAKING MORE HOME HISTORY:

- After calling Exhibition Stadium (1977-1989) and Rogers Centre (1989-2019) home for 43 seasons, the Blue Jays have started a season south of the border for a second consecutive year, having played their 2020 campaign based out of Sahlen Field in Buffalo, NY.
- Toronto became 2nd team in Major League history to begin three consecutive seasons in three different home ballparks, joining the Boston Braves who did so from 1914-1916 (South End Grounds, Fenway Park, Braves Field)...Toronto is the 1st team ever to hold a home opener in three different cities in three consecutive seasons (courtesy Stats Perform).
- The Jays are in Dunedin for at least the first three homestands of the year...The club has a 45-year history of baseball in the city, having held Spring Training in Dunedin since their inaugural 1977 season.

- The Blue Jays last played the As in 2019, sweeping the season series, 6-0, while outscoring them, 36-13... Marked the 3rd season series sweep of 6+ games in team history (6-0 vs. DET in 2002; 6-0 vs. MIN in 2008)...Conversely, Toronto lost all seven meetings with Oakland in 2018 while outscored, 51-18, marking the only time in MLB history teams swept consecutive seasons from each other (min. 5 GP).
- Marcus Semien is facing his former teammates for the first time since signing with the Jays on Jan. 30... Ranks top-20 all-time at the Coliseum in runs (214, 16th), hits (366, T-17th), doubles (72, 16th), triples (12, T-6th) and walks (157, 19th)...Since he joined the A's in 2015, is the Coliseum leader in hits, doubles, triples and walks while 4th in home runs (43) and 2nd in RBI (203)...Ended his time in Oakland with multiple hits in each of the last five playoff games, setting the club record for the longest postseason multi-hit streak...Was 11-for-27 over their seven playoff games.
- George Springer leads all current Blue Jays with 101 career games vs. his former division rival...Has hit .262 (103-for-193) with 72 runs, 18 doubles, two triples, 19 homers and 53 RBI (.808 OPS).

TODAY'S GAME:

- Making his 6th start as a Blue Jay and going for his 5th win...Coming off his only loss of the season, on 4/28 vs. WAS, as he allowed season-highs in hits (8) and runs (6) over 3.2 innings.
- His 4 wins are tied for the AL lead, 1 back of Jack Flaherty for the most in MLB...His 4.00 ERA ranks T-19th in the AL while his .216 AVG is 11th best.
- Aquired from New York in exchange for RHP Yennsy Diaz, RHP Sean Reid-Foley and RHP Josh Winckowski on 1/27/20.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Became the 1st pitcher in Blue Jays history to win his first 4 starts with the team with a 5.0-inning outing on 4/23 at TB in which he allowed 3 runs...Had allowed 3 total in his first 3 games...Also became the 4th lefty in the modern era (1901) to win his first 4 starts of a season while allowing fewer than 15 hits over that span, joining Rube Wddell (1905), Cliff Lee (2008), and Matt Moore (2013)...courtesy Stats Perform.
- Pitched his 3rd quality start in his on 4/17 at KC as he threw 6.0 frames and allowed 1 run for the 3rd straight game (2H, 2BB, 5K)... Is the 4th pitcher in team history to go 3-0 with a sub-1.50 ERA in his first 3 starts as a Blue Jay, joining Mauro Gozzo (1.35 in 1989), Roger Clemens (0.42 in 1997) and Matt Shoemaker (0.92 in 2019).
- Picked up his 2nd win on 4/10 vs. LAA as he pitched 6.0 innings of one-run ball (5H, 1HR, 3BB, 4K)... Became the 7th pitcher all-time to go 2-0 with a sub-1.50 ERA in his first 2 starts as a Blue Jay.
- Made his Toronto debut on 4/5 at TEX in which he threw 6.1 innings of one-run ball to earn the win, his first W since 9/28/19 vs. ATL... Struck out 9 batters, the most punchouts by a Toronto pitcher since Thomas Pannone fanned 9 on 8/3/19 at BAL...The 9 K's were his most in a game since 6/8/19 vs. COL (10), and tied Roger Clemens (4/2/97 vs. CWS) for 2nd most all-time by a pitcher in his 1st game as a Blue Jay, tráiling only David Price's 11 on 8/3/15 vs. MIN

2020 HIGHLIGHTS

- Made six starts for the Mets, going 0-5 in those contests...Finished with a 10.17 ERA (29 ER/25.2 IP) with 28 strikeouts as a starter... Allowed at least one home run in each start.
- Made three appearances out of the bullpen, allowing four earned runs over 5.0 innings pitched (7.20 ERA).
- Allowed 14 home runs over 30.2 innings pitched (4.11 HR/9), the highest home run rate in club history and the 2nd highest in Major League history (min. 30 IP), behind Dan Straily (4.15 in 2019).
- ¹ Named New York's 2020 nominee for the Roberto Clemente Award, his 3rd nomination.
- Placed on the injured list from 8/30-9/16 with left shoulder discomfort.
- Made his 1st appearance out of the bullpen August 29 at NYY...Tossed 1.0 perfect inning with two strikeouts before being removed due to injury.

Notched his lone quality start on July 25 vs. ATL, his 1st outing of the year (6.0 IP, 2H, 1ER, 1BB, 7K).

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS:

- Selected by the New York Mets in the 2nd round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft.
- Became the 1st pitcher in Mets history to allow two runs or fewer in each of his first five Maior League starts.
- Tied for sixth in the NL Rookie of the Year voting as he went 9-8 with a 3.40 ERA and a 1.21 WHIP across 22 starts in 2016.
- 🍁 Homered in two straight games in 2018 (9/13 vs. MIA and 9/18 vs. PHI), making him one of three Mets pitchers to go deep in two straight starts (also: Ron Darling - 1989 and Tom Seaver - 1972

Made a career-high 32 appearances (30 starts) in 2019...Also set career marks in wins (11), strikeouts (153) and innings pitched (160.1).

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

Taking on the Athletics for the 2nd time in his career...In his only meeting with the A's, on 7/21/17, threw 5.0 innings while allowing 9 hits and 3 runs (0BB, 5K)...Pitching at the Oakland Coliseum for the 1st time...Won his other two career meetings with AL West teams, both coming this season (4/5 at TEX, 4/10 vs. LAA).

- Has 57 XBH, tied for 6th most in MLB history by a player in his first 101 career contests...His 230 total bases over that span are 11th most.
- Has 15 career multi-XBH games, tied for most in MLB history by a player
- *4/30 vs. ATL, hit his 7th home run, tied for the most by a Blue Jays shortstop in the month of April (also: Alex Gonzalez in 2010)...Homered in consecutive games for the 3rd time in his career (last: 8/9-8/14/20 4G).
- Tied a career-high with an 11-game hitting streak from 4/3-4/14 (also: 7/29-8/9/19)...Went 16-for-45 (.356) with 4-2B, 4 HR, 10 RBI in that stretch (1.099 OPS).
- 4/14 vs. NYY, homered twice including his 2nd career walk-off home run in the bottom of the 9th (also: 9/13/19 vs. NYY)...Was his 2nd multi-home run game of the season and 4th of his career (last: 4/6/21 at TEX).
- ♦4/10 vs. LAA, recorded a career-high 5 RBI, tied for the most in a single game by a Blue Jays shortstop (last: Tulowitzki - 8/10/16 vs. TB). \$4/6 at TEX, hit his first 2 home runs of the season for his 3rd career multi-
- HR game...Gave him a franchise-best 18 HR in his first 80 career games (2nd: Fred McGriff - 16)...His 47 XBH tied for 6th most in MLB history by a player in his first 80 games (9th with 187 total bases). Doubled on 4/4 at NYY for his 100th career hit in what was his 78th game,
- setting the franchise record for fewest games to 100 career hits (2nd: Alex Rios 85G).
- Made his postseason debut in Game 1 of the ALWC on 9/29 at TB... Drove in Toronto's lone run with a sac fly in the 8th inning...Became the 2nd youngest player in frachise history to pick up a playoff RBI (Junior Felix - 22 in Game 3 and Game 4 of the 1989 ALCS vs. OAK).
- On the IL with a right knee sprain from 8/16-9/11...Among AL hitters at the time of his injury, ranked 2nd in AVG (.361), 4th in OPS (1.063) and 5th in SLG (.672).
- His 7 consecutive games with an XBH and an RBI from 8/6-8/15 was the longest streak by a SS since 1920 - when RBI became an official stat.


