THE LATEST:

- The Blue Jays used a five-run 8th inning to win the third game of four in Oakland by a score of 9-4 last night...Marked their 6th comeback win of the season... Scored 9+ runs without a homer for the 2nd time, also doing so during on April 10 vs. LAA (15R)...Won a game when trailing after seven innings for the 1st time this year (now 1-11)...Have a chance today to earn a split of this series with the Athletics.
- ◆Toronto has now won eight of its last 12 games...Is back to a game above .500, looking to go two wins over the even mark for the 3rd time...Have been within a game or two of .500 for all but one day this year (7-10 on April 20).

VLAD HABITS:

- ◆Vladimir Guerrero Jr. singled and doubled last night while scoring twice and driving in two runs to finish 2-for-4...Was his 11th multi-hit effort this season, trailing only Jed Lowrie (12) and J.D. Martinez (12) for the MLB lead...His 9th-inning double left the bat at 114.0 MPH...Now has 17 batted balls of 110+ MPH this season, 2nd most in MLB (Giancarlo Stanton 22).
- *Jr. was also intentionally walked and has now reached base safely an MLB-high 60 times (2nd: Mike Trout 56)...The 60 times on base are 4th most all-time by a Blue Jay in the first 29 games of a season (last: Jose Bautista 61 in 2014).
- Among AL hitters, the 22-year-old now ranks 2nd in OBP (.484, 2nd in MLB), T-2nd in walks (23, T-3rd in MLB), 4th in OPS (1.106, 5th in MLB), 5th in SLG (.622, 9th in MLB), T-5th in RBI (22, T-7th in MLB), 6th in AVG (.347, 7th in MLB), T-6th in hits (34, T-9th in MLB), T-9th in home runs (7) and 10th in total bases (61).

RANDAL KEEPS ROLLING:

Randal Grichuk used a trio of singles to drive in two runs last night...Marked his 1st three-hit game of the campaign...Has gone 17-for-53 (.321) with four home runs and 11 RBI over his last 13 contests (.893 OPS) and now has his batting average for the season up to .302 (17th in the AL).

DIALED IN:

Robbie Ray pitched his 3rd straight quality start last night, going 6.0 innings while allowing three runs... Fanned nine batters without issuing a walk...Has now gone a career-best 20.2 innings and faced a career-high 81 batters without a free pass...Joins Roy Halladay (2x: 4G in 2005 and 3G in 2003) as the only pitchers in team history with three consecutive starts of 6+ innings, 5+ strikeouts and no walks.

TE-OSCAR SEASON:

*Teoscar Hernández went 2-for-5 last night while also picking up two RBI...Returned to the lineup on April 30 after missing 16 games while on the COVID-19 related IL...Has reached base in all six games since then, going 7-for-24 (.292) with a homer and seven RBI.

LEFT WANTING MORE:

With Hyun Jin Ryu on the hill today, the Blue Jays will start a lefty in each game of a four-game series for the 2nd time in team history, having also done so earlier this year (April 15-18 at KC).

WORKING WEST:

- ◆The Blue Jays are on day four of this 10-game, 11-day road trip...Have gone 8-10 on the road so far...The 18 road games are tied with Detroit for the most among AL clubs...After wrapping up this four-game series today, will travel to Houston (15-15) and Atlanta (14-16) for three games each around an off-day on Monday.
- ◆Toronto batters have hit .214 in road games so far this season (12th in the AL) while scoring 3.50 runs/game (14th)...Conversely, have scored an AL-high 6.45 R/G at home...The pitching staff has posted a 3.31 ERA during away affairs (4th in the AL) to go with a .228 AVG (6th) and a 1.20 WHIP (4th).

Marcus Semien singled and walked last night and now has hits in 11 of his last 12 games, batting .326 (14-for-43) with two doubles, two home runs and eight RBI for a .920 OPS...Had gone 12-for-69 (.174) over his first 17 games (.595 OPS).

TRENDY STUFF:

- Toronto has now gone three straight games without a homer, tying its longest such stretch of the year (April 9-12)...Last had a longer drought from Aug. 29-Sept. 1 last season (4G).
- The Jays have also not made an error in three straight games after a four-game E-free streak to end April... Their two total errors since April 25 are tied with New York and Tampa Bay for the fewest in the AL.

BACK TO BUFFALO:

- Yesterday Toronto announced that as of June 1, its home location will move to Sahlen Field, home of the organization's Triple-A affiliate Buffalo Bisons.
- The Blue Jays went 17-9 over 26 games in Buffalo last season...Scored 6.12 runs/game at home, the 2nd highest in the AL, 3rd highest in MLB.

- ◆The Blue Jays had last met the A's in 2019, sweeping the season series, 6-0, while outscoring them, 36-13... Marked the 3rd season series sweep of 6+ games in team history (6-0 vs. DET in 2002; 6-0 vs. MIN in 2008)...Conversely, Toronto lost all seven meetings with Oakland in 2018 while outscored, 51-18, marking the only time in MLB history teams swept consecutive seasons from each other (min. 5 GP).
- Marcus Semien is facing his former teammates for the first time since signing with the Jays on Jan. 30...Now ranks top-20 all-time at the Coliseum in runs (214, 16th), hits (369, 18th), doubles (73, 16th), triples (12, T-6th) and walks (159, 19th)...Since he joined the A's in 2015, is the Coliseum leader in hits, doubles, triples and walks while 4th in home runs (43) and 2nd in RBI (150)...Ended his time in Oakland with multiple hits in each of the last five playoff games, setting the club record for the longest postseason multi-hit streak... Was 11-for-27 over their seven playoff games.
- Vladimir Guerrero Jr. made his MLB debut vs. Oakland on April 26, 2019 and doubled in his final atbat...Now in six career games vs. the A's, is 8-for-24 (.333) with three doubles and two RBI.

- ♣ His 2.33 ERA since the start of 2018 (min. 300 IP) is the 2nd lowest in the Majors (Jacob deGrom - 1.99)...Among active pitchers with 700+ IP, his career 2.94 ERA is 3rd best, behind Clayton Kershaw (2.44) and Jacob deGrom (2.55).

2021 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Threw 5.0 innings on 4/20 at BOS where he allowed 4 runs on 8 hits...Were his most runs allowed since 9/7/20 vs. NYY (5).
- Earned his 1st win at TD Ballpark as he threw 6.2 innings on 4/13 vs. NYY, allowing 1 unearned run on 4 hits (1BB, 7K)...Faced the minimum through 5.2 IP.
- Took a tough-luck loss on 4/7 at TEX, as he allowed 2 runs over 7.0 innings, striking out 7 hitters without issuing a walk in a 2-1 defeat... Matched his longest outing as a Blue Jay (9/24/20 vs. NYY).
- Made his 3rd career Opening Day start, on 4/1 at NYY, in which he took a no-decision with 2 runs allowed in 5.1 innings of work (4H, 1HR, 1BB, 5K) in an eventual 3-2 Blue Jays victory.

- Finished 3rd in AL Cy Young voting and was named to the All-MLB Second Team.
- Ranked 4th in the AL with a 2.69 ERA...Also ranked T-9th in the AL in strikeouts (72), 9th in SO/9 (9.67), 7th in BB/9 (2.28), T-8th in SO/BB (4.24), T-10th in IP (67.0) and 11th in WHIP (1.15)...His 50.5 ground ball percentage was 5th highest in the AL (9th in MLB).
- Led the team with 12 starts...The Jays went 9-3 in those outings... The 9 wins in games he started were tied for 4th most in MLB, 1 back of the leaders (Shane Bieber, Max Fried, Dinelson Lamet).
- Made his 9th career postseason start in Game 2 of the ALWC on 9/30 at TB...Took the loss as he allowed 7R/3ER over 1.2 innings, his shortest career playoff start.
- Made his final regular-season start on 9/24 vs. NYY...Helped the Jays clinch a playoff spot as he threw 7.0 scoreless innings, his longest scoreless start since his last game with the Dodgers (9/28/19 at SF)...Became the first Toronto starter to pitch into the Thinning since 8/22/19 at LAD (Jacob Waguespack)...The 88 consecutive games without a starter going beyond the 6th inning was the longest streak in MLB history (2nd: LAA – 48G in 2019).
