LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the sixth (3-2) and final game on road trip against the Arizona Diamondbacks (3-0) and Oakland Athletics (0-2; June 14-16)...Angels went 5-2 on last homestand against the Seattle Mariners (2-2) and Kansas City Royals (3-0)...Angels went 3-3 on last road trip to the Bay Area against Oakland (2-2) and San Francisco (1-1).

BACK ON TRACK: Angels have won 11 of last 16 games and 14 of last 21...Had season-high six game win streak snapped Monday night...Angels look to return to .500 for a ninth time this season (1-1, 9-9, 10-10, 11-11, 12-12, 13-13, 32-32, 33-33).

AGAINST SOUTHPAW STARTERS: Angels have won nine of last 12 games vs. left-handed starters after losing seven of first nine games against lefty starters.

YOUTUBE TOMORROW: Tomorrow's Angels game vs. Detroit, will air exclusively on YouTube...**Matt Vasgersian, Rajai Davis, Mark Gubicza** and **Alex Curry** will call the game, which will feature in-game interviews and a trophy presentation for the Player of the Game.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday, the Angels recalled RHP **Aaron Slegers** from Triple-A Salt Lake...Following Monday night's game, RHP **James Hoyt** was optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: **Max Stassi** was named the American League Player of the Week for June 7-13...For the week, he batted .455 (10/22) with nine runs scored, three doubles, three home runs, eight RBI and a 1.478 OPS and led the Majors with 22 total bases...Stassi's streak of six consecutive starts with an extra-base hit was snapped Monday night, but it established a franchise record for catchers.

ALL-STAR BALLOT UPDATE: Major League Baseball released the first balloting update for the 2021 All-Star Game...**Mike Trout** led all A.L. outfielders and ranked second overall in the A.L. with 706,503 votes...**Shohei Ohtani** currently leads the designated hitter vote with 526,608 votes...**Jared Walsh** currently ranks fourth among A.L. first basemen and is 15,284 votes behind third place (Yuli Gurriel) for a spot in Round 2 of voting...**Kurt Suzuki** and **Anthony Rendon** rank fifth at catcher and third base respectively, while **David Fletcher** is sixth among second basemen.

VS. OAKLAND: A's lead season series 6-3...Angels lost two of three meetings at Angel Stadium May 21-23 and split a four game series at the Coliseum May 27-30...Following today's game, the teams will next meet for a two-game series July 19-20 at the Coliseum.

AGAINST THE A's: In 42 career games against the A's, **David Fletcher** is batting .347 (51/147) with 10 doubles, one home run and 15 RBI...**Shohei Ohtani** has hit nine career home runs against the A's, which is his tied for his most against any opponent (also has 9 HR vs. Texas).

FOUR SCORE: Angels are 31-11 when scoring 4+ runs this season and are 2-23 when scoring three-or-fewer.

TROUT TO THE IL: On May 18, the Angels placed OF **Mike Trout** on the injured list with a right calf strain...An estimated return to play is 6-8 weeks from the time of the injury...At the time of his IL placement, he led the Majors in OBP (.466) and OPS (1.090) and ranked fourth (led A.L.) in slugging percentage (.624).

PARTY STARTER: On May 23, **Justin Upton** made his first career start from the leadoff spot in his 1,778th career Major League game...In his 19 starts from the leadoff position, he is batting .310 (22/71) with five doubles, five home runs and 13 RBI.

LEAGUE LEADERS:

Shohei Ohtani ranks third in the Majors in extra-base hits (36), is tied for third in home runs (18), fifth in slugging (.606), seventh with a .954 OPS, is tied for seventh in triples (3) and total bases (130) & is tied for ninth with 46 RBI.

Jared Walsh ranks fifth in the American League in slugging percentage (.560), sixth in OPS (.918), tied for sixth with 32 extra-base hits, and is tied for eighth with 46 RBI and 131 total bases.

GLOVE HURTS: Angels have committed 48 errors this season, which is tied for the most in the Majors...Halos are 10-20 when committing an error in 2021...LAA has had five games this season with 3+ errors (most in Majors).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - RHP GRIFFIN CANNING

5-4, 5.22 ERA

Is 3.1 innings shy of reaching 200 for his career

- TODAY'S GAME:** Making 12th appearance (11th start) of season...Sixth road start of the year...Second start of 2021 vs. Seattle...Is in third Major League season.
- SUPPORTED:** Angels have averaged 8.10 runs of support per nine innings while Canning is on the mound this season, which leads the American League and is third-highest in Majors (min. 50 IP).
- SWING AND MISS:** Opponents have missed on 32.9% of swings, which is seventh-best rate in A.L. (min. 50 IP).
- LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Wednesday vs. Kansas City after tossing 6.2 innings and allowing one earned run on five hits with two walks and six strikeouts.
- 200 K:** Recorded 200th career strikeout on June 3 vs. Seattle with 2nd inning strikeout of Jarred Kelenic.
- GOLDEN GRIFFIN:** Earned the 2020 American League Rawlings Gold Glove Award at pitcher...He was the second Angels pitcher to win the award, joining **Mark Langston**, who won five straight from 1991-95...Tied for the A.L. lead among pitchers with three Defensive Runs Saved during the 2020 regular season and also posted a .938 fielding percentage, committing just one error in 16 total chances.
- STRIKEOUT SURGE:** Has tallied 208 career strikeouts, which is the most in Angels history after 40 career games...His total is already enough for Club record through 41 career games (previous- **Matt Shoemaker** (195)).
- UNFAMILIAR FOES:** In his career as a starter, has held opponents to a .201 average (59/293) in opposing batter's first plate appearances of a game.
- OFF THE BOARDS:** Dating back to 2019, has allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in 17 of last 24 starts...Has yielded two-or-fewer runs in five of last nine starts.
- FROM THE PEN:** Relief appearance on April 20 was the second of his career (Earned win after entering game in relief of Shohei Ohtani in 5th inning)...Only other relief outing came on July 25, 2019 vs. Baltimore when he entered game in 15th inning...Had not previously pitched in relief in Majors, minors or in college.
- VS. OAKLAND:** In six career starts vs. Oakland, is 1-3 with a 4.88 ERA (31.1 IP - 17 ER) and 31 strikeouts (most starts, innings pitched and strikeouts against any opponent)...In three starts vs. A's last year, was 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (13.1 IP - 10 ER).
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** In three career starts at the Coliseum, is 0-1 with a 4.11 ERA (15.1 IP - 7 ER)...Last season, was 0-1 with a 5.79 ERA (9.1 IP - 6 ER) in two starts at the ballpark.
- IN THE COMMUNITY:** Has made visits to patients and their families at CHOC Children's in Orange alongside several teammates...Also participated in a hospital visit to Gillette Children's Hospital in St. Paul, MN in May 2019 with Angels teammates as well as several members of the Minnesota Twins.
- TRIBUTE:** Since his days in youth travel ball, Canning has written the initials "JRH" (Jeffrey Robert Hayek) on the back of the mound before each of his starts...Jeffrey was the grandson of Canning's godmother (Diana) who suddenly passed away at age 10 from a blood clot in his brain in 2007... Although Griffin and Jeffrey never met, they both loved baseball and shared a connection through Diana.
- CAREER NOTES:** Native of Mission Viejo, CA...Previously drafted by Colorado in 38th round of 2014 Draft out of Santa Margarita Catholic HS (Rancho Santa Margarita, CA) but elected to attend UCLA...Selected by Angels in 2nd round of 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of UCLA...With his Major League debut on April 30, 2019, became first player drafted by Billy Eppler as Angels General Manager to reach the Majors.
