**LEADING OFF:** Today, the Angels play the seventh (3-3) and final game (2-3) of homestand against the Colorado Rockies (2-1) and Oakland Athletics (1-2; July 29-Aug. 1)...Angels went 3-3 on last road trip to Oakland (0-2) and Minnesota (3-1)...Halos were 1-2 on last homestand vs. Seattle to begin the second half of the regular season.

**STARTING STRONG:** Since the All-Star Break, Angels starting pitchers lead the Majors with a .193 (64/332) combined batting average against...They also have a combined 3.10 ERA (90 IP - 31 ER), which is fourth best in the Major Leagues.

**DETMERS DEBUTS:** Today, LHP Reid Detmers is scheduled to make his Major League debut with a start on the mound... Detmers is ranked by *Baseball America* in its Midseason Rankings as the top prospect in the Angels organization...In 13 minor league starts this season, he went 3-4 with a 3.15 ERA (60 IP - 21 ER) and 106 strikeouts between Double-A Rocket City and Triple-A Salt Lake.

**FIRST STARTS:** Reid Detmers becomes the first Angels pitcher to make his Major League debut as a starter since José Suarez on June 2, 2019 at Seattle and first to debut in a home game since Griffin Canning on April 30, 2019 vs. Toronto...Angels have won each of the last five games where the Halos starting pitcher made his MLB debut (Suarez, Canning, Barria, Ohtani and Shoemaker).

**DEADLINE DEALS:** Friday the Angels made two trades prior to the trade deadline...The Club acquired LHP Sam Selman, RHP Ivan Armstrong and RHP Jose Marte from San Francisco in exchange for LHP Tony Watson...Angels also acquired RHP Janson Junk and RHP Elvis Peguero from the New York Yankees in exchange for LHP Andrew Heaney and cash considerations.

**ROSTER MOVES:** Today the Angels selected the contract of LHP Reid Detmers and recalled INF Kean Wong from Triple-A Salt Lake...Following yesterday's game, RHP James Hoyt and INF Luis Rengifo were optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake...Yesterday, LHP Sam Selman was added to the active Major League roster after being acquired from San Francisco on Friday afternoon.

**SHO OFF:** Thursday night, Shohei Ohtani stole his 15th base of the season and became the first player in MLB history to have 37+ home runs and 15+ steals before the end of July (ESPN Stats & Info).

**.500 AGAIN:** The Angels are back at the .500 mark (52-52) for the 19th time this season (also; 1-1, 9-9, 10-10, 11-11, 12-12, 13-13, 32-32, 33-33, 35-35, 36-36, 41-41, 42-42, 44-44, 45-45, 46-46, 49-49, 50-50 and 51-51).

**WELCOME AUSTIN:** Wednesday the Angels selected the contract of RHP Austin Warren from Triple-A Salt Lake... He made his Major League debut Thursday night, working 1.1 perfect innings and stranded all three of his inherited runners...Became 49th different player to appear for LAA this season.

**FLETCH HITS:** David Fletcher ranks tied for second in the American League with 121 hits this season and ranks sixth with a .304 batting average...He has multiple hits in 10 of his last 21 games...Fletcher compiled the second longest hit streak in Angels history (26 games) from June 13 - July 17.

**VS. OAKLAND:** A's lead the 2021 season series 11-4... Yesterday the Angels snapped a seven game losing streak vs. Oakland, which was longest streak since A's won nine straight vs. Angels from Sept. 25, 2001 - April 13, 2002...Angels have dropped the season series vs. Athletics for a third consecutive season.

**FOUR SCORE:** Angels are 47-17 when scoring 4+ runs this season and are 5-35 when scoring three-or-fewer...Angels have now earned three of their last six victories with three-or-fewer runs scored.

**RAISEL-MANIA:** Angels closer Raisel Iglesias has compiled 22 saves this season, which ranks third in the American League... He is also tied for the A.L. lead with seven winning decisions as a reliever this season and leads the Majors with seven saves of 4+ outs this season...Also leads MLB with 36 saves of 4+ outs since 2017.

**LEAGUE LEADER:** Shohei Ohtani leads the Majors in home runs (37), extra-base hits (64) and slugging (.682), is tied for the MLB lead in total bases (240), ranks second in OPS (1.051), is tied for second in RBI (82), is tied for seventh in triples (4) and is tied for eighth in runs scored (72)...He also has 15 stolen bases (T-6th in A.L.) and has made 15 pitching starts (5-1, 3.04 ERA, 100 SO, .191 BAA).

**THIS IS PATRICK:** Last Saturday at Minnesota, Patrick Sandoval came within two outs of tossing the 12th no-hitter (10th individual no-hitter) in Angels history...The bid was broken up on a double by Brent Rooker with one out in the bottom of the 9th inning...Sandoval finished the game allowing one run on one hit with one walk and a career-high 13 strikeouts...Marked the first time an Angels no-hit bid was broken up in the 9th inning since John Lackey (8.1 innings) on July 29, 2008 at Boston.

**MILB PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Tri-City LHP Hector Yan was named the High-A West Pitcher of the Week for July 19-25...On July 22 vs. Spokane, he earned a complete game victory (W; 9 IP, 3 H, 1 ER, 2 BB, 7 SO).

**ROCKY HITTER/PITCHER SHO:** During All-Star festivities this month in Denver, Shohei Ohtani became the first Japanese-born player to participate in the Home Run Derby...He totaled 28 homers on Monday before falling in a double tiebreaker to Washington's Juan Soto in the first round...On Tuesday, Ohtani became the first player ever to start at pitcher, start in the leadoff spot and earn the win all in the same game (regular season, All-Star or postseason) (STATS)...He worked a perfect 1st inning on the mound and went 0-for-2 at the plate...He was the first player ever selected to an All-Star team as both a pitcher and a position player.

**RANGERS ON DECK:** Following the current series against the A's, the Angels will travel to Texas for a four game series with the Rangers to begin the next road trip (Aug. 2-5)...Angels lead season series vs. Texas 5-3 and are 2-1 in Arlington this year.

**TROUT ON THE IL:** On May 18, the Angels placed OF Mike Trout on the injured list with a right calf strain...At the time of his IL placement, he led the Majors in OBP (.466) and OPS (1.090) and ranked fourth in the Majors (led A.L.) in slugging percentage (.624)...He was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 28.

### THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

Aug. 1

(1982) Doug DeCinces began a week (Aug. 1-8) for which he was awarded A.L. Player of the Week honors. In that span, DeCinces hit .500 (12/24) with eight home runs (including three in one game twice), 10 runs scored and 12 RBI...No other player in AL history has connected for three HR in a game twice in the same week.

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - LHP REID DETMERS**

**0-0, --- ERA**  
*Making Major League debut*

- TODAY'S GAME:** Had contract selected prior to today's game and is scheduled to make Major League debut.
- TOP PROSPECT:** Is currently rated by *Baseball America* (Midseason rankings) as the top prospect in the Angels organization, the #7 pitching prospect in all of baseball and the #24 overall prospect in the game.
- CLASS OF 2020:** Was Angels first round selection (#10 overall) in the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Louisville...Will become the second player from the 2020 Draft to reach the Major Leagues, following White Sox first rounder LHP Garrett Crochet (11th overall pick).
- HALOS DEBUTS:** Becomes the first Angels pitcher to make his Major League debut as a starter since José Suarez on June 2, 2019 at Seattle and first to debut in a home game since Griffin Canning on April 30, 2019 vs. Toronto .
- MINOR LEAGUE K's:** At the time of his Major League promotion, ranks seventh among all minor league pitchers with 106 strikeouts this season between Rocket City and Salt Lake.
- FUTURES GAME:** Participated in the 2021 MLB Futures Game during the All-Star Break at Coors Field and struck out both of his two batters faced.
- LAST TIME OUT:** In only appearance with Triple-A Salt Lake, earned the win on July 24 vs. Las Vegas after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings and allowing three hits and no walks with nine strikeouts.
- PANDA-MONIUM:** Began the season with Double-A Rocket City, where he was the Opening Day starter in the Trash Pandas inaugural game...In 12 games for Rocket City, was 2-4 with a 3.50 ERA (54 IP - 21 ER) and 97 strikeouts...At the time of his promotion to Salt Lake on July 22, his 97 strikeouts led Double-A South and were the most among all Angels farmhands.
- IMMACULATE:** On June 20, in Game 1 of doubleheader vs. Biloxi, opened the game by striking out the side on nine pitches in the 1st inning...Finished the game with 14 strikeouts in 6.0 innings pitched.
- 16K:** Set minor league career high with 16 strikeouts on June 26 at Chattanooga across 6.0 innings pitched...The 16 strikeouts are the highest single game total for any Angels minor leaguer since at least 2006 and were the most for any Double-A pitcher since Jesse Biddle had 16 SO on April 22, 2013 for Reading (PHI).
- VS. OAKLAND:** Today marks first career appearance vs. Athletics.
- AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Today marks first career appearance at Angel Stadium.
- 2020 IN REVIEW:** Began 2020 at the University of Louisville, where he made four starts before the season was shut down due to the COVID-19 pandemic...He went 3-0 with a 1.23 ERA (22 IP - 3 ER), while leading the ACC with 48 strikeouts...Struck out 10+ batters in three of four starts for the Cardinals...After being selected by the Angels in the First-Year Player Draft, spent the remainder of the season at the Angels Alternate Training Site in Long Beach.
- RUNS IN THE FAMILY:** Reid's father, Kris Detmers, played six seasons in the minors...Also a left-handed pitcher, Kris, was drafted in the 22nd round of the 1993 Draft by St. Louis. He played seven professional seasons, reaching Triple-A Memphis in 1999.
- CAREER NOTES:** Native of Nokomis, IL...Was Angels first round selection (10th overall) in the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of the University Of Louisville.
