LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the third (0-2) of 10 games on a homestand against the Oakland Athletics (0-2; Sept. 17-19), Houston Astros (Sept. 20-23) and Seattle Mariners (Sept. 24-26)...Angels went 4-4 on last road trip against the San Diego Padres (1-1), Houston Astros (1-2) and Chicago White Sox (2-1)...Halos were 5-4 on last homestand against the San Diego Padres (1-1) New York Yankees (2-1) and Texas Rangers (2-2).

THE MAN ON THE MOUND: Shohei Ohtani has batted for himself in 18 of his 21 pitching starts this season...He has made 14 pitching starts with at least a share of the Major League home run lead this year...Ohtani is the first pitcher to make multiple pitching starts in a season while also leading MLB in home runs since Boston's Babe Ruth in 1919 (ELIAS)...He is also the first pitcher ever to hit for himself 3+ times in games where a DH is available.

HOME SWEET HOME: In his 11 home pitching starts this season, Shohei Ohtani is 6-0 with a 1.99 ERA (63.1 IP - 14 ER) and 73 strikeouts...He is the first pitcher in Angels history to go unbeaten with an ERA under 2.00 through his first 11 home starts of a season.

HELLO, MY NAME IS...: The Angels have used a franchise record 63 different players this season (previous record was 60 players used by the 2018 team)...Additionally, the Angels have used 39 different pitchers this year, which is also a club record (previous was 35 pitchers in 2018).

VS. ATHLETICS: A's lead the 2021 season series 14-4...Angels have dropped the season series vs. Oakland for a third consecutive season and have lost 10 of last 11 meetings with the Athletics...The 14 losses vs. A's this year match the most in Angels history in a single season (2001 Angels were 6-14 vs. A's)...If Angels do not win today, it will match franchise record for losses in a season vs. any opponent (4-15 vs. Seattle in 2001 and 4-15 vs. Texas in 2013)...Last time A's swept three-game series at Angel Stadium was April 9-11, 2013.

EIGHT IS ENOUGH: The Angels are 62-0 this season when leading after eight innings...The franchise single season best record when leading after eight frames is 86-0 by the 2007 team; only other Halos team to go unbeaten after eight with 60+ wins was the 2001 team (65-0)...Among all teams to go unbeaten when leading after eight innings, the 1954 Indians (97-0) accumulated the most victories (ELIAS).

TIME 100: Shohei Ohtani has been named to TIME's 2021 list of the 100 Most Influential People in the world...The list, now in its 18th year, recognizes the impact, innovation and achievement of the world's most influential individuals.

SHO OFF: Shohei Ohtani is one of four players in American League history with 44+ HR and 23+ SB in a season, joining Jose Canseco (1991, 1998), Ken Griffey Jr. (1999) and Alex Rodriguez (2007).

1-RUN WINS: Angels are 23-11 (.676) in 1-run games this season; the .676 winning percentage leads the Majors... Angels best record in 1-run games came in 1985, when the team went 30-13 (.698) in 1-run contests.

CHASING .500 AGAIN: The Angels are currently four games under the .500 mark (72-76)...Halos have matched the club record (from 2017) having been exactly .500 on 26 occasions this season (1-1, 9-9, 10-10, 11-11, 12-12, 13-13, 32-32, 33-33, 35-35, 36-36, 41-41, 42-42, 44-44, 45-45, 46-46, 49-49, 50-50, 51-51, 52-52, 54-54, 56-56, 57-57, 58-58, 61-61, 62-62 and 68-68).

RAISEL-MANIA: This season, Raisel Iglesias has compiled 32 saves, which ranks second in the American League...He also has seven winning decisions this season, which is tied for seventh among A.L. relievers...Ranks second in the Majors with eight saves of 4+ outs this season...He was named the A.L. Reliever of the Month for July after going 3-1 with seven saves and a 1.93 ERA (14 IP - 3 ER) and 19 strikeouts.

FLETCH HITS: David Fletcher ranks tied for fifth in the American League with 159 hits this season...Fletcher compiled the second longest hit streak in Angels history (26 games) from June 13 - July 17.

IN THE RANKINGS: Shohei Ohtani ranks second in the Majors in extra-base hits (74), is third in home runs (44), fourth in slugging (.595), fifth in total bases (295) and OPS (.954), tied for seventh in triples (5), and is ninth in stolen bases (23)... He has also made 21 pitching starts (9-2, 3.36 ERA, 136 SO, .211 BAA).

MILB PITCHERS OF THE WEEK: For the week of Sept. 6-12, Salt Lake RHP Tyler Danish was named the Triple-A West Pitcher of the Week and DSL Angels RHP Fernando Guanare earned Dominican Summer League Pitcher of the Week honors...Danish pitched to a 1.17 ERA (7.2 IP - 1 ER) in two appearances with nine strikeouts and no walks...Guanare pitched 7.0 scoreless innings with no walks and 11 strikeouts in his start on Sept. 6 at DSL Twins.

ASTROS ON DECK: Following the current series against Oakland, the Angels will host the Houston Astros in a four game series... Angels are 5-10 against Houston this year...Last season, the Angels went 6-4 vs. Houston to win the season series for first time since 2014.

ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD: Mike Trout has been named as the Angels nominee for the 2021 Roberto Clemente Award, which is the annual recognition of a Major League player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field...More information is available at mlb.com/clemente21.

PERFECT GAME HOF: Angels outfielders Mike Trout and Justin Upton are among the 10-member inaugural class of the newly-created Perfect Game Hall of Fame... Perfect Game is the world's largest youth baseball and softball platform and scouting service...To be eligible for election into the Perfect Game HOF, players had to have been on a MLB team's active roster on or before July 15, 2013, and they must have attended multiple Perfect Game events as an amateur.

TROUT ON THE IL: On May 18, the Angels placed OF Mike Trout on the injured list with a right calf strain...At the time of his IL placement, he led the Majors in OBP (.466) and OPS (1.090) and ranked fourth in the Majors (led A.L.) in slugging percentage (.624)...He was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 28.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - RHP SHOHEI OHTANI

9-2, 3.36 ERA

Is 6-0 with a 1.99 ERA (63.1 IP - 14 ER) at Angel Stadium this season

- SHO TIME:** Making MLB career high 22nd start of the season as a pitcher and 12th at home...Most pitching starts in a season since making 22 starts for Nippon-Ham Fighters in 2015...Third pitching start of year vs. Athletics...Limited to two starts as a pitcher in 2020...Did not pitch during 2019 season, while recovering from Tommy John surgery.
- SEEKING DOUBLE DIGIT VICTORIES:** Is looking to become the first Angels pitcher record at least 10 winning decisions in a season since Jaime Barria (10) in 2018.
- ALL-STAR WIN:** Earned winning decision in the All-Star Game after working a perfect 1st inning (retired Fernando Tatis Jr., Max Muncy and Nolan Arenado)...Was the first player ever selected to the MLB All-Star Game as both a pitcher and position player...Voted by fans as starting designated hitter and was also selected as a pitcher on the Player Ballot.
- STREAK SNAPPED:** Losing decision in last start snapped streak of eight consecutive winning decisions...The eight straight wins marked the longest streak for an Angels pitcher since Matt Shoemaker won nine straight decisions from Aug. 9, 2014 - Apr. 13, 2015 and the longest single-season streak since C.J. Wilson won nine consecutive decisions from July 10 - Sept. 16, 2013.
- DON'T NEED A DH:** Has batted for himself in 18 of 21 pitching starts this season...Became first Angels starting pitcher to bat for himself in an A.L. game since the designated hitter rule was implemented in 1973...Is the first player in Angels history with three home runs as a pitcher in a season and the first A.L. player with at least three HR in a season since Cleveland's Steve Dunning (3) in 1972.
- PLAYER OF THE MONTH x2:** Named American League Player of the Month for June and July, becoming the first Angels player ever to receive the honors in consecutive months...Was also named A.L. Player of the Week for June 14-20 and for June 28 - July 4.
- ANGELS STRIKEOUT RECORDS:** Has recorded 202 career strikeouts, which is a Club record through 33 career games as a pitcher...His total is already a record through 34 games as well (previous: Griffin Canning - 178).
- LAST TIME ON THE MOUND:** Charged with loss in last start on Sept. 10 at Houston after tossing 3.1 innings and allowing six earned runs on a career high nine hits with no walks and one strikeout...Exited game with score tied at four in the 4th inning, but two bequeathed runners would later score.
- OFF THE BOARD:** Prior to yielding seven runs on June 30 at NYY, had allowed a total of 12 earned runs in his previous 49.2 innings pitched (2.17 ERA)...In his next eight starts, allowed 13 earned runs in 52.0 innings (2.25 ERA) before yielding six runs in last start at Houston.
- PLAYING THE FIELD:** Has moved to the outfield four times following pitching starts this season...On May 11 at Houston, finished the game in right field after tossing season-high 7.0 innings and allowing one earned run with a season-high 10 strikeouts...Became third player since 1900 to strike out 10+ batters and play another position in the same game. (ELIAS).
- GETTING SETTLED:** Has a 6.97 ERA (20.2 IP - 16 ER) in the first inning this year, compared with a 2.57 ERA (94.2 IP - 27 ER) after the first frame.
- SWING AND A MISS:** Has recorded 114 of 136 strikeouts (84%) on swinging strike 3's this season.
- LESS PATIENT:** At the end of June, opponents swung at 44% of pitches, which was fourth lowest rate in American League (min. 60 IP)...Since start of July, opponents now swing at 51.6% of pitches.
- THE SPLITTER:** This season, batters are 8-for-100 (.080) against his splitter with 65 SO...Has held opponents to an .069 (11/159) batting average against the splitter since 2018...Recorded 103 of 201 career strikeouts with the pitch.
- BRINGING THE HEAT:** Has reached 100.0 MPH with 11 pitches this year...Fastest pitch was clocked at 101.1 MPH.
- VS. OAKLAND:** In five career games vs. A's, is 2-2 with a 3.96 ERA (25 IP - 11 ER)...In two starts this year, is 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA (12 IP - 3 ER) and 13 strikeouts...Went 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA (13 IP - 3 ER) with 18 strikeouts against the A's in his two starts in 2018, but allowed five runs without recording an out in Oakland on July 26, 2020...Finest pitching performance of big league career came vs. Oakland on Apr. 8, 2018 at Angel Stadium (W; 7 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 12 SO) and carried a perfect game into the 7th inning.
- AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In 17 career starts at The Big A, is 8-1 with a 2.25 ERA (92 IP - 23 ER) and 113 strikeouts...This season, is 6-0 with a 1.99 ERA (63.1 IP - 14 ER) and 73 strikeouts after 11 home starts...Is the first pitcher in Angels history to go unbeaten with an ERA under 2.00 in his first 11 home games of a season.
- 100K:** Reached 100 strikeouts on the season on July 26 vs. Colorado...Became fourth Angels right-hander to reach 100+ strikeouts through 15 starts in a season, joining Bill Singer (1973), Nolan Ryan (1973-79) and Jered Weaver (2010).
- TWO-WAY YEAR 3:** Is the first player to make multiple starts as a pitcher and non-pitcher in three MLB seasons since Johnny Cooney did so in six seasons for the Boston Braves (1923-26, '28-29). (ELIAS).
- JAPANESE HALOS:** Is one of five Japanese-born players to play for Angels, along with Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi and Junichi Tazawa.
- PITCHING CAREER IN JAPAN:** In 85 career games (82 starts) as a pitcher for Nippon-Ham Fighters in Japanese Pacific League, went 42-15 with a 2.52 ERA (543 IP - 152 ER) and 624 strikeouts.
- MLB CAREER NOTES:** Signed with Angels as international free agent, Dec. 10, 2017...Made Major League debut as a DH on March 29, 2018 at Oakland and had first start as a pitcher on April 1, 2018 at Oakland...Named the 2018 American League Rookie of the Year...Named A.L. Player of the Month for June 2021 and has won A.L. Player of the Week four times.

RHP JAIME BARRIA (2-3, 4.93 ERA)

Making 12th appearance (10th start) of the season and sixth home appearance (fifth start) of the year...Second start of 2021 vs. Athletics...Did not factor in decision in last start on Sunday at Houston after tossing 4.0 innings and allowing one earned run on four hits with four walks and six strikeouts...
In four career games (three starts) against Oakland, is 1-0 with a 2.21 ERA (20.1 IP - 5 ER) and 18 strikeouts; this season is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (6.2 IP - 0 ER) and three strikeouts against the A's following only previous start on July 31 at Angel Stadium...Is seeking first winning decision since the start against the A's on July 31...Pitching to a 4.15 ERA (43.1 IP - 20 ER) as a starter this year... Owns a 2.88 ERA (25 IP - 8 ER) at Angel Stadium this year, compared with a 7.03 ERA (24.1 IP - 19 ER) on the road.

- Since May 10, has a 2.24 ERA (52.1 IP - 13 ER).

- Appeared in 22 games for White Sox in 2020 & recorded 21 strikeouts in 20 IP.
- Drafted by Marlins in 5th round of 2007 Draft from Carson-Newman University (TN)...Former Angels pitcher Clyde Wright also attended Carson-Newman.

#56 COOPER CRISWELL (RHP) AGE:25

- Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake yesterday for second Major League stint with Angels...Pitched in one game during first big league stint.
- Made Major League debut with a start on Aug. 27 vs. San Diego (L; 1.1 IP, 6 H, 3 ER, 0 BB, 0 SO).
- Ranked by *MLB Pipeline* as Angels #28 prospect and #15 pitcher.
- In seven games (all starts) with Salt Lake, is 2-4 with a 6.75 ERA (36 IP - 27 ER).
- Began the season with Double-A Rocket City, where he made 12 starts, going 6-4 with a 3.71 ERA (70.1 IP - 39 ER) with 85 strikeouts and just eight walks.
- Recorded 14 strikeouts in start vs. Biloxi on June 16.
