**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers suffered their third straight loss yesterday, falling to the Twins 3-2. Derek Hill had a pair of hits, including a solo home run, while Zack Short went 1x3 with a RBI. Harold Castro also contributed two hits, including a double. Casey Mize started for Detroit and took the loss, allowing three runs on five hits with a walk and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Alex Lange, Miguel Del Pozo and Joe Jiménez combined to work 3.0 shutout innings in relief.

**ON THE MOUND:** The Tigers pitching staff combined to allow three runs yesterday vs. Minnesota, Detroit's ninth straight game with three-or-fewer runs allowed, which is the team's longest streak since an 11-game stretch from July 13-26, 1986. Over the nine-game span, Tigers pitchers have posted a Major League leading 1.91 ERA (84.2IP/18ER), while they are third in the American League with a .218 opponent batting average and fourth with a 1.16 WHIP.

**ANOTHER ONE-RUN GAME:** Detroit played its sixth consecutive one-run game yesterday against the Twins. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, six straight one-run contests is the longest stretch for the Tigers since another six-game streak from July 27-August 1, 1976. For the season, the Tigers are 19-18 in one-run affairs.

**MOVIN' ON UP:** Miguel Cabrera will look to continue his climb up the MLB all-time hits list tonight. Cabrera enters tonight's game with 2,961 knocks in his career, and is two shy of tying Sam Crawford for 34th place on the all-time hits list.

**TIGERS AND ATHLETICS:** The Tigers and Athletics continue their seven-game season series tonight. Oakland swept a four-game series from Detroit earlier this season in the Bay Area. The Athletics have already clinched this year's season set, marking their fourth consecutive season series victory.

**HOW THE WEST WAS WON:** The Tigers have performed well against teams from the American League West this season, entering tonight's game with a 17-14 record. With three games remaining this season against AL West foes, Detroit has already clinched a .500 record against the division for the first time since 2016 (16-16). With one more victory, the Tigers will have a winning record against AL West clubs for the first time since 2014 (18-16).

**AT COMERICA PARK:** The Tigers are 1-3 on their current seven-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Toronto (1-2), one game vs. Minnesota (0-1) and three games vs. Oakland (August 31-September 2). Detroit has a 34-33 record at home this season. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .239/.307/.391, while the pitching staff has compiled a 3.71 ERA (600.0IP/247ER), which is the fifth-lowest home ERA in the American League.

**NOTES ON A.J. HINCH:** A.J. Hinch was named the 39th manager in Detroit Tigers history on October 30, 2020. \*Enters tonight's game with a 62-70 (.470) record as the Tigers manager and 632-522 (.548) career record... he leads active Major League managers (min. eight seasons) in career win percentage. \*Managed the Houston Astros from 2015-19, leading the club to the playoffs four times in five seasons, including in his first year as manager in 2015, snapping a nine-year drought for Houston and posting a 16-win improvement from the previous year.

### Tonight's start vs. Oakland

- Skubal will make his 26th appearance and 24th start of the season tonight in the series opener vs. Oakland...faced the Athletics for the first time in his career earlier this season on April 15 and took the loss, giving up two runs, one earned, on two hits with four walks and five strikeouts in 4.0 innings.
- Has pitched in 17 games, including 15 starts, in his career at home, compiling a 5-7 record with a 3.40 ERA (90.0IP/34ER) and 93 strikeouts...in 15 outings, including 13 starts, at Comerica Park this season, he is 4-6 with a 3.42 ERA (79.0IP/30ER) and 83 strikeouts.
- Has started five games in his career against American League West opponents, posting a 2-2 record with a 2.20 ERA (28.2IP/7ER) and 34 strikeouts.
- Enters tonight's start with 144 strikeouts on the season, which ranks second among Major League rookies and are the second most by a rookie in franchise history...is two punchouts shy of tying Spencer Turnbull (146) for first on the Tigers single-season rookie strikeout list...has at least four strikeouts in 19 consecutive games...only one other Major League rookie has a longer active streak (Tampa Bay's Shane Bieber, 20), and Skubal is the fourth Tigers pitcher since the start of 2012 to have a streak of 19-or-more games with at least four strikeouts.

### 2021 Regular Season

- Did not factor into the decision in his last start on Wednesday at St. Louis, allowing two runs on three hits with a walk and 10 strikeouts in 5.0 innings...recorded his second double-digit strikeout game of the season (other, June 5 at CWS)
- Finished with 105 strikeouts before the All-Star break, the most by a Tigers rookie since 1947.
- Allowed three runs-or-less in eight consecutive starts from May 19-June 27, during which he had a 4-1 record with a 2.82 ERA (44.2IP/15ER) and 63 strikeouts.
- Established a career high with 11 strikeouts in 5.0 innings on June 5 at Chicago (AL)...his 11 punchouts were tied for the most in a game by a Tigers rookie since 1974 (now accomplished four times, most recently by Michael Fulmer in 2016)...struck out eight-or-more batters in four consecutive starts from May 19-June 5, the first Tigers rookie to do so and the fifth Major League rookie since 2010 to accomplish the feat (last, Noah Syndergaard in 2015).
- Recorded his second win of the season on May 30 vs. New York (AL), throwing 6.0 scoreless innings with three hits allowed, three walks and eight strikeouts.
- After finishing the month of April with a 0-4 record and a 6.14 ERA (22.0IP/15ER), had an impressive turnaround in May, posting a 2-3 record with a 3.33 ERA (27.0IP/10ER) in five starts.
- Earned his first win of the season on May 19 at Seattle, striking out nine and allowing two runs on four hits in 5.0 innings.

### Career Notes

- Graduated from prospect status earlier this season...prior to his graduation, he ranked as the club's No. 4 prospect and the 24th-best in all of baseball, per MLB Pipeline...the service also ranks Detroit's farm system as a whole as the second-strongest in baseball.
- Made the first eight appearances, including seven starts of his career in 2020...posted a 1-4 record and 5.63 ERA (32.0IP/20ER), allowing 28 hits and 11 walks, while striking out 37...allowed more than two earned runs in just two of his appearances this season, and struck out six-or-more batters in four of his last five outings to close out his rookie campaign.
- Turned in one of his best starts of the season on September 5, 2020 at Minnesota, throwing a career-best 6.0 innings and allowing one run on two hits with two walks and six strikeouts...became the ninth starting pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0-or-more innings while allowing one run-or-fewer on two-or-fewer hits in one of his first four career starts, and the first to do so since Drew Smyly on April 28, 2012 at New York (AL).
- Posted his second quality start of the season on September 16, 2020 vs. Kansas City, allowing three runs, two earned, on four hits with eight strikeouts in 6.0 innings, while taking the loss...became the second pitcher in Tigers history to strike out eight-or-more batters while not issuing a walk in one of his first six career appearances, joining Schoolboy Rowe, who had nine strikeouts without giving up a walk on April 21, 1933 at Cleveland.
- Combined to make 24 starts between Single A Lakeland and Double A Erie in 2019...was named to the Florida State League midseason All-Star Team and was selected an organization All-Star by MiLB.com...ranked third among all full-season Minor League pitchers with 179 strikeouts...had nine double-digit strikeout games during the season.

- Was reinstated from the 10-day injured list prior to last Tuesday's series opener at St. Louis...had been sidelined since August 11 with a concussion...played in four injury rehab games with Triple A Toledo, going 2x14 with a double and two RBI.
- Is one of 15 Major League rookies with at least 250 at-bats this season, ranking second in stolen bases (14), seventh in batting average (.258), eighth in on-base percentage (.322), slugging percentage (.450), OPS (.772) and walk rate (8.8%).
- Hit his sixth triple of the season on August 10 at Baltimore, which is tied for the American League lead and ranks tied for second in the Majors.
- Batted .322/.415/.473 with nine doubles, two triples, three home runs and 21 RBI over a 48-game stretch from May 11-July 19.
- Was just the third Tigers rookie since 1933 to have 20-or-more extra-base hits and 10-or-more stolen bases prior to the All-Star break, joining Austin Jackson (2010) and Jake Wood (1961)...had a .813 OPS at the All-Star break, the fifth-best by a Tigers rookie since 1947, trailing only Brennan Boesch (.990 in 2010), Matt Nokes (.973 in 1987), Bobby Higginson (.824 in 1995) and Steve Kemp (.814 in 1977).
- His storybook start to big league life continued on April 6, entering the game as a pinch runner in the eighth inning and later coming through with a clutch walk-off single in the 10th...his heroics made him the first Tiger rookie to have a walk-off hit since Dixon Machado on September 18, 2015 vs. Kansas City...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the effort also made him the first player in the Modern Era (since 1900) to have multiple HRs, including a grand slam, and also record a walk-off hit within the first three games of his career.
- Made his second straight start on April 5 vs. Minnesota, going 2x4 with a grand slam in the ninth inning...also hit a homer on April 4 in his Major League debut, becoming the first Tiger in franchise history to hit a home run in each of his first two career games, and fifth to drive in four-or-more runs in either of his first two career games (last, Alex Avila on August 7, 2009).

- Went 1x4 on Sunday vs. Toronto and now has 2,961 hits in his career, two shy of tying Sam Crawford (2,963) for 34th on the all-time hits list...since July 26, Cabrera is hitting .289/.368/.546 with four doubles, seven home runs and 17 RBI.
- Had a pinch-hit double in the ninth inning of Wednesday's game at St. Louis...the double was the 592nd of his career, tying him with Todd Helton for 19th in MLB history...scored a run in the inning, which was the 1,500th run scored of his career, becoming the 73rd player in MLB history to score 1,500-or-more runs and the second active player (other, Albert Pujols).
- Belted his 14th home run of the season last Tuesday at St. Louis, and now has 501 in his career, which is three shy of tying Eddie Murray for 27th in MLB history...with two hits last Tuesday, he passed Willie Keeler (2,956) for 35th place on the all-time hits list.
- Hit the 500th home run of his career on August 22 at Toronto, becoming the 28th player in Major League history to reach that milestone and the first to do so in a Tigers uniform...also became the sixth player born outside the United States and the first Venezuelan-born player to hit 500 homers.
- Finished the game on August 11 at Baltimore with three hits and a home run, marking his 118th career game with three-or-more hits and at least one homer, the sixth-most in MLB history, according to the Elias Sports Bureau (Alex Rodriguez - 140, Hank Aaron - 130, Babe Ruth - 130, Lou Gehrig - 128, Willie Mays - 124).
