**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers snapped a four-game losing streak with an 8-6 win over the Athletics last night. Harold Castro finished last night's game 3x4 with a double, a home run and two RBI, while Miguel Cabrera went 2x4 with a homer and drove in three. Akil Baddoo also went deep in the victory and had a pair of RBI. Joe Jiménez picked up his fifth win of the season, working a perfect seventh inning. Gregory Soto worked a scoreless ninth with two strikeouts for his 17th save.

**GROSSMAN, SKUBAL NAMED TIGERS PLAYER AND PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR AUGUST:** Robbie Grossman and Tarik Skubal have been named the Tigers Player and Pitcher of the Month, respectively, for August. Grossman appeared in 26 games, hitting .281/.363/.494 with five doubles, a triple, four home runs and nine RBI. Skubal started five games in the month, compiling a 2-2 record with a 3.25 ERA (27.2IP/10ER) and 33 strikeouts. He finished the month with a 1.16 WHIP and .243 (26x107) opponent batting average. Skubal's 33 strikeouts ranked tied for 10th in the American League.

**MIGGY MASH:** Miguel Cabrera belted the 502nd home run of his career last night, a two-run shot in the fourth inning. Cabrera is now two homers shy of tying Eddie Murray for 27th in MLB history. With two hits last night, Cabrera has 2,963 in his career, moving into a tie with Sam Crawford for 34th on the all-time hits list. Cabrera is 22 hits away from tying Sam Rice (2,985) for 33rd.

**HOMERIN' HAROLD:** Harold Castro posted his seventh three-hit game of the season last night, finishing the contest 3x4 with a double, a home run and two RBI. Castro's home run went out to left center field, marking his first career homer to the opposite field. Last night's game also marked the second time in his career that he has had multiple extra-base hits in a game (other, August 23, 2019 at Minnesota). Over his last 13 games, Castro is hitting .343/.343/.514 with three doubles, a home run and five RBI.

**TIGERS TIDBITS:** Jeimer Candelario hit his Major League leading 37th double of the season last night. Candelario now has 49 extra-base hits this season and is just one shy of equaling his single-season career high of 50, set in 2018...Akil Baddoo went 2x4 with a homer and two RBI last night. Baddoo saw 30 pitches in last night's game, which is tied for the most by a Tigers rookie in a five plate appearance game since Nick Castellanos saw 35 pitches over five PA's on September 19, 2014 (Travis Demeritte also saw 30 pitches on August 3, 2019).

**SOTO SLAMS THE DOOR:** Gregory Soto pitched a perfect ninth inning with a pair of strikeouts last night to record his 17th save of the season, which ranks eighth in the American League. Soto has converted 10 straight save opportunities and 17-of-18 this season. He has not allowed a run in his last six outings, throwing 8.0 scoreless innings with three hits allowed, four walks and six strikeouts.

**HIP, HIP JOSÉ:** Jose Cisnero picked up his 18th hold of the season last night, working a scoreless eighth inning with a strikeout. Cisnero's 18 holds ranks tied for third in the American League with 18 holds, while he is fourth in the AL and sixth in the Majors with 62 appearances. Cisnero is looking to put the finishing touches on one of the best seasons by a Tigers reliever in recent years. Among Detroit relievers with at least 50.0 innings pitched in a season since 2015, his 2.62 ERA (58.1IP/17ER) and .625 OPS allowed ranks second, while his .211 opponent batting average ranks fourth and his 1.20 WHIP ranks seventh.

**TIGERS AND ATHLETICS:** The Tigers and Athletics conclude their seven-game season series tonight. Detroit picked up its first win of the season over Oakland last night. With a win today, the Tigers can earn their first series win over the Athletics since April 25-28, 2016. Oakland has already clinched this year's season set, marking their fourth consecutive season series victory.

**HOW THE WEST WAS WON:** The Tigers clinched a winning record against the American League West this season with last night's victory, improving to 18-15 on the season. It marks the first time Detroit has had a winning record against AL West clubs since 2014 (18-16).

**AT COMERICA PARK:** The Tigers are 2-4 on their current seven-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Toronto (1-2), one game vs. Minnesota (0-1) and three games vs. Oakland (1-1). Detroit has a 35-34 record at home this season. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .241/.308/.397, while the pitching staff has compiled a 3.80 ERA (618.0IP/261ER), which is the sixth-lowest home ERA in the American League.

**ON DECK:** The Tigers begin a six-game road trip tomorrow as they open a three-game series against the Reds. Detroit and Cincinnati split six games last season, but the Tigers took two-of-three games at Great American Ball Park. The all-time series between the two teams is tied 16-16, including an 8-8 record in games played in Cincinnati. Detroit is 6-6 against National League teams this season and has a 163-133 (.551) record since 2006, which is the fifth-best interleague record among all Major League clubs.

**NOTES ON A.J. HINCH:** A.J. Hinch was named the 39th manager in Detroit Tigers history on October 30, 2020. \*Enters today's game with a 63-71 (.470) record as the Tigers manager and 633-523 (.548) career record... he leads active Major League managers (min. eight seasons) in career win percentage.

\*Managed the Houston Astros from 2015-19, leading the club to the playoffs four times in five seasons, including in his first year as manager in 2015, snapping a nine-year drought for Houston and posting a 16-win improvement from the previous year.

### Today's start vs. Oakland

- Manning will make the 13th start of his Major League career today in the series finale vs. Oakland...marks his first career appearance against the Athletics.
- Has made six starts at Comerica Park this season, and has a 2-1 record with a 2.93 ERA (30.2IP/10ER) and 17 strikeouts.
- Through the first 12 starts of his Major League career, has an average velocity of 89.7 MPH...has thrown 40.4 percent four-seam fastballs, 18.5 percent sinker/two-seam fastballs, 15.9 percent sliders, 14.1 percent changeups and 11.1 percent curve balls.

### 2021 Season

- Recorded his third quality start of the season on Friday vs. Toronto, but did not receive a decision after allowing a run on six hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings...averaged 90.9 MPH during the outing, his highest average velocity in a start this season, while he topped out at 97.8 MPH, his fastest pitch of the season.
- Picked up his second win of the season in his start on July 21 vs. Texas, recording his first career quality start after throwing a season-high 6.0 innings and allowing two runs, one earned, on four hits with two walks and a season-best four strikeouts...became the first Tigers rookie to allow no more than two earned runs in five of his first six starts in a rookie season since Drew Smyly held opponents to two-or-fewer earned runs in each of his first six starts in 2012...since at least 1947, Manning was the fourth Tigers rookie to have five-or-more such starts in their first six games of a season, joining Smyly (6, 2012), Bill Slayback (6, 1972) and Armando Galarraga (5, 2008).
- Earned the first win of his big league career on June 23 vs. St. Louis, allowing two runs on five hits with two walks and a strikeout in 5.2 innings...became the first Tigers starter to earn a win in one of his first two games since Michael Fulmer won his debut on April 29, 2016.
- Made his Major League debut on June 17 at Los Angeles (AL), and took the loss after giving up two runs on four hits with two walks and three strikeouts...struck out Justin Upton looking to end the second inning for his first Major League strikeout.
- Spent the first part of the 2021 campaign at Triple A Toledo...put together his best start of the season on June 9 vs. Louisville, earning the win after allowing two runs on four hits with two walks and eight strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

### Career Notes

- Graduated from prospect status earlier this season...prior to his graduation, he ranked as the club's No. 3 prospect and the 18th-best in all of baseball, per MLB Pipeline.
- Selected to participate in the MLB Futures Game in 2018 at Nationals Park in Washington, DC and in 2019 at Progressive Field in Cleveland.
- Named the Tigers Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2019 after making 24 starts and posting an 11-5 record with a 2.56 ERA (133.2IP/38ER) and 148 strikeouts...ranked second in the Eastern League in strikeouts and WHIP (0.98), while he was tied for second in opponents batting average (.192, 93x484), third in ERA, tied for third in wins, eighth in innings pitched and tied for eighth in games started.
- Attended Sheldon (CA) High School, where he was named a Rawlings-Perfect Game first team All-American as a senior in 2016...was also selected a Perfect Game underclass high honorable mention All-American as a junior in 2015.
- Is the son of Rich Manning, who played two seasons in the NBA with the Vancouver Grizzlies and Los Angeles Clippers...was a second round pick of the Atlanta Hawks in the 1993 NBA Draft.

- Had a pair of hits, including a solo home run, his 11th of the season, last night vs. Oakland...was his first homer since July 27 at Minnesota.
- Is one of 15 Major League rookies with at least 250 at-bats this season, ranking second in stolen bases (14), fifth in on-base percentage (.326), sixth in batting average (.261), slugging percentage (.460), OPS (.785) and walk rate (9.0%).
- Hit his sixth triple of the season on August 10 at Baltimore, which is tied for the American League lead and ranks tied for second in the Majors.
- Batted .322/.415/.473 with nine doubles, two triples, three home runs and 21 RBI over a 48-game stretch from May 11-July 19.
- Was just the third Tigers rookie since 1933 to have 20-or-more extra-base hits and 10-or-more stolen bases prior to the All-Star break, joining Austin Jackson (2010) and Jake Wood (1961)...had a .813 OPS at the All-Star break, the fifth-best by a Tigers rookie since 1947, trailing only Brennan Boesch (.990 in 2010), Matt Nokes (.973 in 1987), Bobby Higginson (.824 in 1995) and Steve Kemp (.814 in 1977).
- His storybook start to big league life continued on April 6, entering the game as a pinch runner in the eighth inning and later coming through with a clutch walk-off single in the 10th...his heroics made him the first Tiger rookie to have a walk-off hit since Dixon Machado on September 18, 2015 vs. Kansas City...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the effort also made him the first player in the Modern Era (since 1900) to have multiple HRs, including a grand slam, and also record a walk-off hit within the first three games of his career.
- Made his second straight start on April 5 vs. Minnesota, going 2x4 with a grand slam in the ninth inning...also hit a homer on April 4 in his Major League debut, becoming the first Tiger in franchise history to hit a home run in each of his first two career games, and fifth to drive in four-or-more runs in either of his first two career games (last, Alex Avila on August 7, 2009).

- Belted his 15th home run of the season last night vs. Oakland, and now has 502 in his career, which is two shy of tying Eddie Murray for 27th in MLB history...had two hits last night and now has 2,963 in his career, tying Sam Crawford for 34th on the all-time hits list...since July 26, Cabrera is hitting .291/.377/.563 with four doubles, eight home runs and 20 RBI.
- Had a pinch-hit double in the ninth inning on August 25 at St. Louis...the double was the 592nd of his career, tying him with Todd Helton for 19th in MLB history...scored a run in the inning, which was the 1,500th run scored of his career, becoming the 73rd player in MLB history to score 1,500-or-more runs and the second active player (other, Albert Pujols).
- Hit the 500th home run of his career on August 22 at Toronto, becoming the 28th player in Major League history to reach that milestone and the first to do so in a Tigers uniform...also became the sixth player born outside the United States and the first Venezuelan-born player to hit 500 homers.
- Finished the game on August 11 at Baltimore with three hits and a home run, marking his 118th career game with three-or-more hits and at least one homer, the sixth-most in MLB history, according to the Elias Sports Bureau (Alex Rodriguez - 140, Hank Aaron - 130, Babe Ruth - 130, Lou Gehrig - 128, Willie Mays - 124).
- Belted a pair of solo home runs as part of a 3x3 game on July 29 vs. Baltimore...marked his 43rd career multi-homer game and his 34th as a Tiger, extending his franchise record.
- The 2021 season marks the 19th of his decorated Major League career...one of the best hitters of his generation, Cabrera is among the leaders of active players (min. 800 games played) in many offensive categories, including first in batting average (.311); second in hits (2,963), doubles (592), home runs (502), RBI (1,790) and runs scored (1,501); third in walks (1,195) and OPS (.922); and fifth in on-base percentage (.388) and slugging percentage (.534).
