TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 29, 1972: In the first game of a doubleheader vs. Texas, Bobby Murcer goes 4-for-5 and hits for the cycle during the Yankees' 7-6, 11-inning victory. With a ninth-inning solo home run that ties the game at 6-6, Murcer becomes the ninth Yankee to hit for the cycle.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 30, 1950: The Yankees move into sole possession of first place in the AL standings for the first time in more than two and a half months by sweeping a home doubleheader vs. Cleveland, 4-3 and 3-0, as Johnny Mize homers in each game.

Aug. 30, 1945: Bill Bevens throws a complete-game one-hitter and Frankie Crosetti drives in four runs during the Yankees' 7-1 win over the Red Sox at Yankee Stadium. Bevens loses his no-hit bid on a Bob Johnson double with two out in the seventh inning.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their nine-game, 10-day road trip with the final game of a four-game set at Oakland (2-1 thus far)...swept a two-game set at Atlanta and will also play three games at Los Angeles-AL (8/30-9/1).

▶ **At 76-53 (.589), own the third-best record in the AL and the sixth-best record in the Majors.**

▶ Had their season-high 13-game winning streak snapped on Saturday...**have still won 13 of their last 14 games, 14 of their last 16, 20 of their last 24, 23 of their last 28 and 25 of their last 31.**

▶ Are 30-9 (.769) in their last 39 games (since 7/17).

▶ Have not lost back-to-back games since 7/22-23 and have lost consecutive games just twice since 7/6 (also two games from 7/11-16).

▶ Have clinched at least a series split vs. the A's...are undefeated in each of their last 11 series and 15 of their last 16.

▶ Are 23G over .500, one game shy of their season-high watermark (24G over .500 at the end of play on 8/27).

▶ Are in second place in the AL East...hold a 2.0-game lead over Boston for the first Wild Card spot.

▶ Have recorded 35 come-from-behind wins this season, the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Tampa Bay (40) and Boston (38).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees had their season-high 13-game winning streak snapped on Saturday, falling to Oakland, 3-2...**LHP Nestor Cortes** (5.1IP, 4H, 3ER, 3BB, 4K, 1HR, 1BK) started and took the loss despite allowing just 3ER...**CF Aaron Judge** (3-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI) recorded 3H for his second straight game...hit a two-run HR in the ninth inning, accounting for the Yankees' only runs...**1B Anthony Rizzo** (1-for-4, 1R) and **DH Luke Voit** (1-for-3) were the only other Yankees to collect a hit...**RHP Albert Abreu** (1.2IP, 1H, 1BB) and **LHP Lucas Luetge** (1.0IP, 1K) combined to toss 2.2 scoreless innings.

MILESTONE MAN: Manager **Aaron Boone** has 312 managerial wins and **needs one win to tie Buck Showalter (313) for ninth place on the Yankees' all-time managerial wins list.**

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Yankees own a 10-series winning streak, their longest since a 10-series winning streak from 6/22-7/22-G2/54...**with a win today, would be their longest such streak since 1943 when they won a franchise-record 13 straight series** (credit: *Elias*)...have won 14 of their last 15 completed series.

STANTON ISLAND: **DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** had season-high 23-game on-base streak snapped on Saturday (8/2-27)...was the second-longest on-base streak of his career, trailing only a 27-game streak from 7/24-8/22/17...batted .329/.421/.671 (27-for-82) with 16R, 4 doubles, 8HR, 21RBI, 11BB and 2HP in that span.

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees have played 72 games this season determined by 2R-or-fewer, the second-most such games in the Majors, trailing only the Mets (73)...their 72 games decided by 2R-or-fewer are their most in a single season since 2015 (76)...their 48-24 (.667) record in those games is the best in the Majors...is tied for their third-highest winning percentage in games decided by 2R-or-fewer in a single season in franchise history, trailing only their .688 (44-20) mark in 1951 and .676 (50-24) mark in 2004 (also had a .667 mark with a 34-17 record in 1903).

LUUUUUUKE: **INF Luke Voit** is hitting .441/.513/.882 (15-for-34) with 8R, 3 doubles, 4HR, 14RBI, 3BB and 2HP in his last 12 games (since 8/15)...has 12RBI in his last seven starts, 14RBI in his last nine starts and 18RBI in his last 14 starts.

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** have homered in a season-high eight straight games, their longest stretch since a 10-game span from 8/11-26-G1/20...have hit 18HR in that span.

▶ Are hitting .354/.439/.622 (29-for-82) with 7 doubles, 5HR, 44RBI, 12BB and 2HP with RISP over their last 11 games (since 8/17-G1).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge owns a season-high 20-game on-base streak (since 8/7)...is his longest on-base streak since a 21-game streak from 4/1-26/18...is the fourth-longest on-base streak of his career, trailing a 32-game streak (5/28-6/30/17), 26-game streak (9/3/17-3/29/18) and a 21-game streak (4/1-26/18)...is hitting .384/.477/.753 (28-for-73) with 15R, 6 doubles, 7HR, 21RBI, 14BB/11BB, 4SB and 15F in that span.

▶ **Has multiple hits in a career-high five straight games** (since 8/23), batting .571/.591/1.000 (12-for-21) with 5R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 7RBI, 1BB and 1SB in that span...is just the second Yankee in the last two seasons (since 2020) to record multiple hits in at least five straight games (also Giancarlo Stanton's five-game streak from 8/3-7/21).

▶ Has reached base multiple times in 66-of-115 games this season, tied with Toronto's Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (also 66G) for the fourth-most such games in the Majors, trailing only Washington's Juan Soto (69G), Baltimore's Cedric Mullins (67G) and Atlanta's Freddie Freeman (67G).

▶ Has homered in each of his last two games, marking the fifth time this season he has homered in back-to-back games (first since 2G from 8/12-14)...has homered in three straight games six times in his career (last: 3G from 5/14-16/21).

▶ Has hit 29HR this year, the second-highest HR total in a single season in his career (52HR in 2017).

▶ **Has driven in six of the Yankees' 10R over their last two games.**

▶ Has reached base multiple times in 12 of his last 16 games, 13 of his last 18 games and 14 of his last 20.

▶ Has recorded at least 3H in back-to-back games for the third time in his career (also 2G from 7/20-21/18 and 6/10-11/17).

▶ Has reached base at least three times in each of his last three games, reaching base in 9-of-14 plate appearances in that span (8H, 1BB).

▶ In 10 career games at Oakland Coliseum, is hitting .385/.478/.821 (15-for-39) with 6R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 4HR, 12RBI, 6BB and 1HP.

▶ Is hitting .330/.434/.538 (30-for-91) with 4 doubles, 5HR, 40RBI, 18BB/21BB, 1HP and 3SF with RISP this season.

WINNING WAYS: The Yankees had their season-high 13 game-winning streak snapped on Saturday at Oakland...was their longest winning streak since a 13-game winning streak from 9/1-12/61...was just the ninth time in franchise history the Yankees have won 13 consecutive games (see chart on right)...their 13-game winning streak matched the longest by any Major League team over the last four seasons (also Oakland's 13-game streak from 4/9-24/21).

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starters** own a 2.97 ERA (245.1IP, 81ER) and 263K in their last 47 starts (since 7/4-Game 2)...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 41 of their last 47 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 34 of those starts.

SUMMER HEAT: **The Yankees have posted a 34-12 (.739) record since 7/6, the best record in the Majors in that span.**

MIGHTY MONTY: **LHP Jordan Montgomery** will make his 24th start of the season...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his last 10 starts since 6/20, posting a 3.02 ERA (53.2IP, 18ER) and 54K in that span.

ROLL CALL: The Yankees have used 57 players this season (P: 28, C: 3, INF: 13, OF: 13), their second-highest total in franchise history (58 players in 2014).

PITCH PERFECT: **Yankees pitchers** own a 3.60 ERA (1141.0IP, 457ER) this season, the second-lowest ERA in the AL and fifth-lowest in the Majors this season...**the Yankees have not finished a season with as low of an ERA since 1981** (2.90).

▶ Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 10 of their last 13 games, posting a 2.57 ERA (112.0IP, 32ER) in that span.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP JORDAN MONTGOMERY (5-5, 3.69 ERA)

LHP Jordan Montgomery will make his 24th start of the season in tonight's series finale at Oakland...the 28-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Wednesday's off-day...last started on 8/23 at Atlanta and earned his fifth win of the season in the Yankees' 5-1 victory, allowing 1ER in 5.0IP (2H, 4BB, 2K, 1HR)...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in four of his last five starts (since 7/22), going 2-0 with a 1.78 ERA (25.1IP, 5ER) in that span...missed 13 team games on the COVID-19 injured list from 8/3-16...in 2020, went 2-3 with a 5.11 ERA (44.0IP, 25ER) and 47K in 10 starts for the Yankees...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on 6/7/18 and returned to make two appearances (one start) in September 2019...finished sixth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting in 2017, going 9-7 with a 3.88 ERA (155.1IP, 67ER) in 29 starts...led AL rookies in starts, strikeouts and innings pitched...was selected by the Yankees in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina.

LAST START: Earned his fifth win of the season in the Yankees' 5-1 victory on 8/23 at Atlanta, allowing 1ER in 5.0IP (2H, 4BB, 2K, 1HR)...allowed a solo HR to Dansby Swanson in the second, accounting for his only run allowed...marked his eighth start of 1R-or-fewer allowed this season, his most such starts in a single season since he recorded a career-high nine starts of 1R-or-fewer allowed in 2017...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in four of his last five starts (since 7/22), going 2-0 with a 1.78 ERA (25.1IP, 5ER) in that span.

- ✦ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his last 10 starts since 6/20, posting a 3.02 ERA (53.2IP, 18ER) with 54K in that span...his 10 straight starts of 3R-or-fewer allowed is the longest of his career (previous: six straight starts, two times).

VS. OAKLAND: Will make his third career start against the Athletics...last faced the Athletics on 6/20 at Yankee Stadium and did not factor in the decision after allowing just 1ER in 5.1IP (3H, 2BB, 6K)...allowed his only run on a solo HR to Matt Olson in the first inning, his first HR surrendered to a left-handed batter since 9/4/17 at Baltimore (Chris Davis).

- ✦ Is 0-1 with a 3.50 ERA (18.0IP, 7ER) in three starts against AL West clubs this season...is 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA (45.0IP, 23ER) in nine career starts vs. the AL West.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Is 7-8 with a 4.54 ERA (170.1IP, 86ER) and 154K in 35 career appearances (34 starts) on the road...has made 13 road starts in 2021, going 3-2 with a 3.97 ERA (68.0IP, 30ER)...is 2-0 with a 0.87 ERA (20.2IP, 2ER) in his last four road starts since 7/22.

VS. LEFTIES: Since making his debut in 2017, has limited left-handed hitters to a .194/.254/.300 (51-for-263) slash line with 16BB, 61K and 7HR...allowed a HR to Matt Olson on 6/20 vs. Oakland, his first HR surrendered to a left-handed hitter since 9/4/17 at Baltimore (Chris Davis).

- ✦ As a starter, has held left-handed hitters to a .193/.254/.301 slash line since 2017.
- ✦ **Has held lefties to a .193/.241/.257 (21-for-109) slash line with 2HR, 5BB, 29K and 2HP in 2021.**

2021: In 23 starts this season, is 5-5 with a 3.69 ERA (124.1IP, 51ER) and a 8.90 K/9.0IP ratio (124.1 IP, 123K)...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 19 of his 23 starts this season, including 18 of his last 20...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his last 10 starts since 6/20, posting a 3.02 ERA (53.2IP, 18ER) with 54K in that span...his 10 straight starts of 3R-or-fewer allowed is the longest of his career (previous: six straight starts, two times).

- ✦ Has allowed 1R-or-fewer in four of his last five starts (since 7/22), going 2-0 with a 1.78 ERA (25.1IP, 5ER) in that span...his eight starts of 1R-or-fewer allowed this season are his most such starts in a single season since he recorded a career-high nine starts of 1R-or-fewer allowed in 2017.
- ✦ Has nine starts of at least 5.0IP and 1ER-or-fewer allowed this season, tied with Jameson Taillon for the most such starts on the team, trailing only Gerrit Cole (12 starts).
- ✦ Took the loss in four straight starts from 6/26-7/16, the first time in his career he lost three-or-more consecutive starts...was undefeated in his previous 11 starts (4/23-6/20).
- ✦ The Yankees are 15-8 in his 23 starts...have won each of his last four starts after losing in his previous five starts from 6/26-7/22.
- ✦ Left the game with the Yankees trailing in six straight starts from 6/15-7/16 after doing so only twice in his first 12 starts.
- ✦ Notched his first career double-digit strikeout game on 5/21 vs. Chicago-AL (11K)...also tied his career high with 7.0IP in that start (also 6/9/17 vs. Baltimore and 6/26/17 at Chicago-AL)...marked the longest scoreless start of his career (previous: 6.0IP - three times, last: 4/5 vs. Baltimore).
- ✦ Has tossed at least 6.0 innings without issuing a walk three times this season (5/21 vs. Chicago-AL, 5/5 vs. Houston and 4/5 vs. Baltimore) after doing so just twice from 2017-20.
- ✦ Has received 3R-or-fewer of support in 18 of his 23 starts this season...has received a total of 9R of support in his last 10 starts (since 6/20) and 0R of support in six of those starts, including a stretch of five straight starts with 0R of support from 6/20-7/16.
- ✦ Has recorded two of his four career scoreless starts of at least 6.0IP this season: 4/5 vs. Baltimore and 5/21 vs. Chicago-AL (also 6/3/17 at Toronto and 9/16/17 vs. Baltimore).
- ✦ Is undefeated in his last five starts after losing his previous four starts from 6/26-7/16...was undefeated in 11 straight starts from 4/23-6/20, the second longest undefeated streak of his career (13 games started from 9/4/17-7/31/20)...went 2-0 with a 3.97 ERA (59.0IP, 26ER) with 57K in that span.

2020: Went 2-3 with a 5.11 ERA (44.0IP, 48H, 27R/25ER, 9BB, 47K, 7HR) in 10 starts with the Yankees...walked only nine of his 193BF...his 1.84 BB/9.0IP ratio (9BB/44.0IP) ranked ninth in the AL (min. 40.0IP)...began the season on the Yankees' Taxi Squad before being recalled on 7/31.

- ✦ Earned the win in his season debut on 7/31 vs. Boston, his first win since 4/21/18.
- ✦ Made his postseason debut in ALDS Game 4 vs. Tampa Bay at Petco Park, starting and allowing 1ER in 4.0IP in the potential elimination game (3H, 3BB, 4K)...was only the third Yankee since 1982 to allow 1R-or-fewer and toss at least 4.0IP in his postseason debut, joining A.J. Burnett (1R in 6.0IP in 2009 ALDS Game 2 vs. Minnesota) and Orlando Hernández (0R in 7.0IP in 1998 ALCS Game 4 at Cleveland)...was just the fourth Yankee in franchise history to start a potential elimination game in his postseason debut, joining Luis Severino (2017 AL Wild Card Game vs. Minnesota), Masahiro Tanaka (2015 AL Wild Card Game vs. Houston) and Shawn Chacon (2005 ALDS Game 4 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...was the only pitcher in the group to allow just 1R.

GUMBY NATION: Has made 69 career starts, all with the Yankees...among pitchers currently in the organization, has made the second-most starts for the team behind only Luis Severino (88).

- ✦ Underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his left elbow on 6/7/18, missing the remainder of the 2018 season and the first 150 team games of the 2019 season...made two appearances (one start) in 2019 after being reinstated from the injured list on 9/15/19.
- ✦ Made his Major League debut in 2017, going 9-7 with a 3.88 ERA (155.1IP, 140H, 72R/67ER, 51BB, 144K, 21HR) in 29 starts...finished sixth in AL Rookie of the Year voting, receiving one second-place vote and one third-place vote...led AL rookies in starts, strikeouts and innings pitched...tied for second in wins (Los Angeles-AL's Parker Bridwell, 10)...finished second in strikeouts among MLB rookies to Colorado's Germán Márquez (147)...his 144K were the sixth-highest single-season total by a rookie in Yankees history: Russ Ford (209 in 1910), Al Downing (171 in 1963), Stan Bahnsen (162 in 1968), Doc Medich (145 in 1973) and Ray Caldwell (145 in 1911).
